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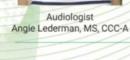
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Supervisor's Message

If you notice our new Township logo, you can see it symbolizes Our plan for how to use the land the three branches of the Clinton River. To us, the river is one of our most treasured assets, and we continue to develop initiatives to make it come alive for all of our residents.

More than just a critical part of our drainage system, these waterways have tremendous recreational potential and are a source of beauty and pride to our community. One of our strategic plan initiatives is to bring out the value in these assets by adding amenities close to the waterfront and, most importantly, ensuring the water remains clean and protected.

Our efforts include a collaborative project to install a universally accessible boat launch at George George Park. A universal design intends for the launch to be accessible for people of all ages and skill levels.



Clinton Township acquired more than 6 acres along the Clinton River Spillway for recreational use.

Groundbreaking is expected this summer.

The project also includes an innovative parking lot design with green infrastructure techniques and pavers to reduce the lot's overall impervious surface. This allows stormwater to be filtered naturally before seeping back into the ground, protecting the watershed. Clinton Township is proud to partner in funding this effort with the Michigan Natural Resources Trust Fund and the Clinton River Watershed

Another boat launch project along the Clinton River centers on Budd Park. We requested earmark money through Congressman Andy Levin's office to fund this project and others like riverbank stabilization and removing log jams. In March, we received notice that he secured \$640,000 for a series of improvements along the Clinton River Water Trail. This includes opening the river from Sterling Heights to Mount Clemens—part of our local and regional Master Plan to further stimulate the "blue economy." Thank you, Congressman Andy

Last year, we acquired 6.3 acres of land along the north side of the Clinton River Spillway. The parcel, located just east of Harper and north of Metro Parkway, was purchased from the Macomb County Drain Commission with a grant through the Michigan Natural Resources Trust Fund.

to benefit residents is currently under development. As part of our strategic vision plan, we have partnered with Macomb County, Mount Clemens, and Harrison Township to obtain a planning grant through SEMCOG. This grant is being used to develop a master recreation plan for the spillway area including our newly acquired parcel. More news will be coming on this in the future.

The plan involves non-motorized transportation options to connect

neighborhoods and communities to the spillway. The County is taking the lead on orchestrating the study with the full cooperation of the benefiting communities.

An essential aspect of developing a river trail system is making

sure the Clinton River remains healthy. Clinton Township has been doing its part to make this happen by investing in our water and sewer infrastructure. In the southern portion of the Township, we are nearing the completion of a 20-year project to improve the sewer system. Overall, south of Metro Parkway, we've invested more than \$35 million over two decades to protect the environment and the precious recreational value of our rivers and lakes. We believe we are nearing the end of this critically important project.



In May, our new splash pad officially opened on the Civic Center campus.

Warm weather is upon us and it's great to be back in the swing of

things with Music and Movies in the Park, our fabulous fireworks display on July 6, and the famous Gratiot Cruise on August 7. If the reaction to our new splash pad is any indication, it's shaping up to be an exciting summer in Clinton Township. Enjoy!

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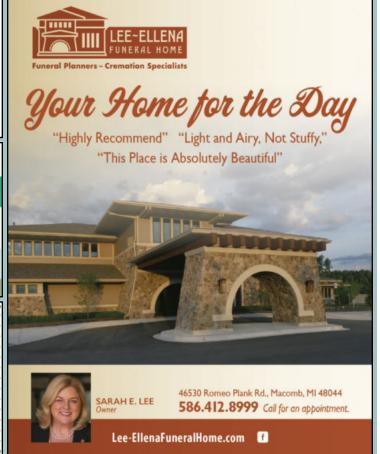
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
