VOLUNTEER SPOTLIGT



If You Knew Susie...

You would know that Susie started volunteering about 11 years ago because "she baked too many Christmas cookies."

When she brought them into the Senior Center, the Director said that we could use some help in the kitchen—and a volunteer was born.

Susie has since served on the WASC Board for six years (President for two years and Secretary for two years) and continues to work one day a week in the kitchen and babysit our plants (even during the pandemic and other times when we have been closed for services). In addition, she was one of the driving forces in getting the millage proposals on the ballots and passed. Susie always helps sewing for our annual Christmas Meals on Wheels placemats. And, if there is ever a call to bake something, she is one of the first to volunteer, and often she just shows up with goodies – unrequested (much to the delight of my mouth and dismay of my waistline!)

Susie was born in Williamston and attended a oneroom school. She graduated from Central Michigan University with a degree in Education. Her first teaching job was in Flint (ironically, one of our members, Bob Bement, was the principal there at the time!) and then moved to Williamston High School to teach home economics and later became a Now you know Susie like I know Susie – she's pretguidance counselor. She spent 34½ years in the field of Education.

Susie's hobbies are vast: knitting, quilting, sewing, gardening, biking, and traveling, to name but a few. She takes these hobbies seriously—to the extreme sometimes. For example, she just made a new memorial quilt for the Senior Center – very nice, very "normal."

But let's talk about this one bike trip of hers... in 1998, she took a self-contained trip from Seattle, Washington, to Stillwater, Minnesota. This crazy woman and a riding partner rode their bicycles 70 -80 miles a day (each pulling a trailer) halfway across the United States! And they loved it! She said they spent one night a week in a motel where they would shower and wash their clothes. Otherwise, they would pitch a tent and camp out. WOW! And I think staying in a hotel without room service is roughing it!

She has since changed her traveling habits, including a 7-day raft trip through the Grand Canyon. She said that was probably her favorite trip. She has also been to Costa Rica, Panama, and taken a 5-day Road Scholar bike trip through Pennsylvania, to mention a few destinations. And in 2019, Susie and her husband Russ went for a long vacation to Hawaii. Yes, that even included indoor accommodations and airline reservations!

Susie and Russ have two sons: Eric and Mark, and four grandchildren: Lia (17), Abby (14), Rory (11), and Harlow (8). Unfortunately, they all live out of state, so Susie does not see them nearly enough. Her goals for the Senior Center include attracting the younger seniors and finding a location that will allow the center to provide additional services. ty amazing! And we are lucky to have her.
