


OUR MISSION STATEMENT

PASTORAL PONDERINGS

Today we celebrate the Third Sunday of Avent. It is also called *Gaudete* Sunday. *Gaudete* is the Latin word for "rejoice." The theme of joy is quite evident in the scripture reading from Zephaniah and the passage from Saint Paul to the Philippians, prescribed for today's Eucharist. It is always on this Sunday of Advent that the pink candle is lit on the Advent wreath because it signifies joy. The Presider has the option of wearing rosecolored vestments. And, on the Third Sunday of Advent, flowers are permitted to be placed in the sanctuary. Today's Gospel passage from Saint Luke highlights John the Baptist and his teachings. We may forget that he had disciples. In last week's Gospel, John was proclaiming a baptism for the repentance of sins as he called upon the people to "prepare the way of the Lord." In today's Gospel passage, we actually learn some of the teachings of John, some of the ways he tells them how they must enter into conversion. He says that whoever has two cloaks or whoever has food should share with those who have none. He tells tax collectors: "Stop collecting more that is prescribed." As for soldiers, they are neither to practice distortion nor falsely accuse anyone, and they are to be satisfied with their wages. Then John tells all of them, who are filled with expectation at the coming of the Messiah, that "One mightier than I is coming," and "He will baptize you with the Holy Spirit and fire." That certainly is a cause for rejoicing. We know that Jesus has come into our world, and it has made a difference in the lives of innumerable people throughout the centuries. As Christians, we have many reasons to rejoice in the Lord. As we rejoice today, let us also consider how we can prepare ourselves spiritually for the celebration of the Nativity of the Lord this Christmas. Let us reflect upon this question: What is Jesus asking of me this Advent Season as the celebration of his nativity draws near?

This Sunday, we are having the Blessing of the Bambinelli, the figure of the baby Jesus placed in our Nativity sets. Each year on the Third Sunday of Advent, the pope celebrates this Italian Custom. The prayer that will be used was written by Pope Benedict XVI.

Last week, the question I posed was: If you had to name a patron saint or saints for Advent, who would they be? Why? Here is my short answer: John the Baptist, Mary, Joseph, and Elizabeth. Next week I will share my reasons for choosing them.
