

PASTORAL PONDERINGS

This has been one full weekend of joyous celebrations! Friday, we celebrated the Vigil of the Nativity of the Lord and the Mass of the Nativity of the Lord During the Night. Saturday, we celebrated the Solemnity of the Nativity of the Lord (Christmas). And Sunday we are celebrating the Feast of the Holy Family. Those of us who have participated in liturgical ministries all three days are exhausted, yet, in some ways, are exhilarated at the same time. Special thanks to Father Jim for making our celebrations so meaningful and **spiritually enriching.** Thanks also for the hard work and dedication of the parish staff on all their preparations "behind the scenes" and "on the scene" leading up to and through Christmas!

The Gospel passage today is the story of the twelve-year-old Jesus going up to the Temple in Jerusalem with his parents for the feast of Passover. When the festival days are over, while journeying home, Mary and Joseph realize that Jesus is not among any of their relatives. They return to Jerusalem and three days later, find him in the temple among the teachers, listening and asking questions. His parents are astonished yet distressed that he has wandered off. Jesus says something they do not understand at the time: "Did you not know that I must be in my Father's house?" The Gospel continues: "He went down with them and came to Nazareth and was obedient to them." Even as a young person, Jesus, the Son of God, was beginning to realize what his Father in heaven expected of him as well as what his family expected of him; he was obedient to both his heavenly Father and his earthly parents. As family members ourselves, we must be loving, kind, respectful, and forgiving as we care for one another. Pope Francis writes in Amoris Laetitia: "The spirituality of family love is made up of thousands of small but real gestures." This week, let us reflect upon the many ways in which we communicate love with family members. If unable to be present with family this weekend, we might consider reaching out to them in some small way via phone call, text, email or Facetime, as well as keeping them in our prayers.

Please note, that the parish office will be closed on Monday and Friday this coming week. A few staff members will be present Tuesday through Thursday to serve you as each of us takes an extra "down time" day. There will be no weekday Masses this week, so if you wish to attend Mass, there is an 8:00 AM Mass at both the Cathedral and at Corpus Christi Parish each day.

In case you are unaware of it, January 1st is not a holy day of obligation this year because it falls on a Saturday. Therefore, there will be no morning Mass on January 1st.

Sunday, December 26, 2021 All Families Are Made Holy

Today's readings: Sirach 3:2–6, 12–14; Psalm 128: 1–2, 3, 4–5; Colossians 3:12–21 or 3:12–17; Luke 2:41–52 or 1 Samuel 1:20–22, 24–28; Psalm 84:2–3, 5–6, 9–10; 1 John 3:1–2, 21–24; Luke 2:41–52. Little is known about the life Jesus, Mary, and Joseph lived in Nazareth. From the time they returned from Egypt until the beginning of Jesus' public ministry, the only story that appears in Scripture about the family is the founding of Jesus in the temple. A close reading of this text shows that they were observant Jews and they went to Jerusalem each year for Passover. It also can be seen that they traveled with their extended family, so they had other significant relationships in their lives. They had regular family struggles. Mary asks, "Why have you done this to us?" She sounds like many mothers who are

raising adolescents. Their family life is a model for ours, but it must have been very ordinary indeed.

Imagine what that can mean for us.

Jesus knows our hearts and our struggles because he lived them too. God entered into a family and set the family apart as a place of sanctification. The holy family makes all families holy. The family is an ordinary place filled with ordinary love, peace, mercy, justice, and forgiveness. It is a place to grow in holiness. This week, as you go about your routine, imagine how you are connected to Jesus, Mary, and Joseph, across time and space, to their home in Nazareth. If you are preparing a meal or folding the laundry, you are doing holy work, just as they did.
