

JANUARY 2, 2022

PASTORAL PONDERINGS

This Sunday we celebrate the Solemnity of the Epiphany of the Lord. Even though, traditionally, in many parts of the world it is called "Little Christmas," it is hardly a small event in our faith. Epiphany means *manifestation*. The solemnity we celebrate today is the apex (or high point) of the Christmas Season. It is the day which commemorates the glorious manifestation of God to all peoples and all nations, represented by the magi in today's Gospel story from Luke: the magi who traveled from the East, bearing precious gifts, following a star which led them to the King of Kings. They embarked upon a long journey to encounter Christ. The magi are a sign to us of those who are attentive to the changes in the universe and the heavens while searching for truth in the wonders of creation. Because the magi searched with eyes of faith, they recognized the Gift of God (Emmanuel) when they found him. Their encounter with the Lord demonstrates that, in Christ, the light of God is given to all people of goodwill.

In our world, torn apart by divisions of all kinds, we Christians need to step back to reflect upon God's presence which sometimes seems to be clouded by darkness. We know that we have received the light of Christ in baptism and that we are responsible for bringing the Light of Christ to our world. We are the Body of Christ, bearing Christ within us to whomever we encounter each day. No matter how unlike us another person may be in race, creed, culture, and expression, we need to know that Christ came for all of them so they might know God's unconditional love. May we see them as Christ sees them, beyond any labels that have been placed upon them: foreigner, refugee, immigrant, migrant, non-believer, counter-cultural, enemy, warrior, peacemaker, tyrant, hero, traitor, saint, sinner, outlaw, in-law, etc. What gift can we bring to them this Epiphany so that they indeed know that Christ has come for all people, continues to manifest God's presence and love for all people (even through us), and gives hope to all world longing for it?
