

PASTORAL PONDERINGS

This weekend we celebrate the Second Sunday of Ordinary Time. You may wonder what happened to the first Sunday; there is none, but there is a First Week in Ordinary Time that began last Monday. The Feast of the Baptism of the Lord (which we celebrated last Sunday) ended the Christmas Season and then launched us into Ordinary Time. Today's Gospel passage (from John) recounts the wedding feast at Cana where Jesus changed water into wine. After his baptism in the Jordan River. Jesus began his public ministry. Until then, all we know about him from the age of twelve on is that he went down to Nazareth with Mary and Joseph "and was obedient to them" and "advanced in wisdom and age and favor before God and man." Then, as a young man around the age of 30 he came to understand what God the Father expected of him, what his mission on this earth was, and how he would go about accomplishing it. He then began his public ministry as an itinerant preacher, proclaiming the reign of God, calling disciples, healing the sick, and performing miracles (which John the Evangelist refers to as signs). In today's Gospel account, when the wine ran short, the mother of Jesus turned to him, and informed him. Mary must have been a bit perplexed by his response: "How does your concern affect me? "My hour has not yet come." However, Mary says, "Do whatever he tells you." In using the words "my hour," Jesus is referring to the time of his glorification, the time when he will be manifested in all his glory, the time only the Father knows. The culmination of this glory will be manifested on the cross. (John refers to the "glory of the cross." His account of the Passion centers around this). John's Gospel is divided into the Book of Signs and the Book of Glory. The signs, especially the miraculous signs, are revelations of the "breaking through" of the reign of God into our world; each sign indicates some aspect of the identity of Jesus. Who Jesus is, as Lord of Glory, is ultimately revealed by his death on the cross, his resurrection, his ascension, and the sending of the Holy Spirit. Jesus knows that all of this is in the hands of the Father who sent the Son into the world. What Jesus does at any point in time is in obedience to the Father (and to no one else). John expresses the deep relationship between the Father and Jesus, his Son, throughout his Gospel. Today's account ends: "Jesus did this as the beginning of his signs at Cana in Galilee and so revealed his glory, and his disciples began to believe in him." As the disciples grew in their faith, we, too, grow in our faith. Just as they received signs, we receive signs. What sign have you experienced recently witnessed or that deepened or strengthened your faith in God? How has it changed you?
