

PASTORAL PONDERINGS

This weekend we celebrate "Sunday of the Word of God." On September 30, 2019, on the memorial of Saint Jerome, in a *motu proprio*, entitled *Aperuit* Illis. Pope Francis announced that the Third Sunday in Ordinary Time would be designated Sunday of the Word of God. At the conclusion of the year of the Extraordinary Jubilee of Mercy (2015-2016) he proposed setting aside "a Sunday given over entirely to the word of God, so as to appreciate the inexhaustible riches contained in that constant dialogue between the Lord and his people." Pope Francis believes that devoting a specific Sunday to the Word of God will "enable the Church to experience anew how the risen Lord opens up for us the treasury of his word and enables us to proclaim its unfathomable riches before the world." This weekend, the gathering space and worship space are enhanced to emphasize the significance of the Word of God, and the prayers and the music highlight the importance of the Word of God in our liturgy and in our lives. This year, there will be a blessing of lectors, those who serve in the special ministry of proclaiming the Word of God at Mass and other liturgies. We recognize the responsibility that both they and all of us have in meditating often on the Scriptures and proclaiming them daily by the way in which we live our lives. The Gospel passage this Sunday is taken from the beginning of the Gospel of Jesus goes to the synagogue on the sabbath, stands to read, and is handed a scroll of the prophet Isaiah. He finds the passage which begins: "The Spirit of the Lord is upon me, because he has anointed me to bring glad tidings to the poor." After he finishes the passage, he rolls up the scroll, and as the eyes of all are looking intently upon him, he says: "Today this Scripture passage is fulfilled in your hearing." When reading or listening to the Gospel account, note that Jesus is attending the synagogue in his hometown of Nazareth. Standing among those who know him well (family, friends, and neighbors), he proclaims that what they have heard is being fulfilled here and now. Luke does not tell us about their reaction, whether it is astonishment, hope, belief, or confusion. We do know that Luke believes what has been handed down to him from eyewitnesses. He shares it with us that we, too, might believe that Jesus, the Word of God is the Word who became flesh and dwelt among us, which we profess each week in the Creed. As followers of Jesus, taking the Scriptures to heart, we are called to imitate him by using our own gifts to bring good news to the poor, proclaim liberty to captives, restore sight to the blind, and set prisoners free, thus making each year one acceptable to the Lord, one in which the words of the prophet, Isaiah, are being fulfilled in our midst.

Prayer for the Synod: Adsumus Sancte Spiritus
