

PASTORAL PONDERINGS

This weekend we celebrate the Fourth Sunday in Ordinary Time. Today's Gospel account from Mark begins with the same verse that concluded last week's Gospel passage. They are the words of Jesus, speaking in the synagogue in his hometown: "Today this Scripture passage is fulfilled in your hearing." Following that, we hear the reactions of those gathered. Some speak highly of Jesus and are amazed at his words, yet they know he is Joseph's son. They are his neighbors, his friends and family members who were part of his life as he grew into adulthood. As amazed as they are at the words of Jesus, they are also skeptical. Would they witness the same kinds of things from him in his hometown as they heard he had done in Capernaum? Just as some are amazed and others have their doubts about Jesus, there are also those who become furious and are ready to drive him out of town because he explains why a prophet is not accepted in his own native place, using Elijah and Elisha as examples. Jesus is then driven to the edge of a hill over which a crowd intends to hurl him, but he passes through their midst and goes away. Today's Gospel account does not tell us where Jesus went, but if we read ahead in our bibles, we know that he goes to Capernaum in Galilee where he casts out demons, heals the sick, and preaches in the synagogues in Galilee. As far as we know from Scripture, he never returns to Nazareth. We. too, are sometimes amazed at what Jesus does for us and for others, and yet, there may be times when we want to "pull back" from him when we feel he is asking or expecting too much Have you ever had that kind of experience? If so, when, why, or how have you felt Jesus was asking too much of you as a disciple?

Please note the six-month parish financial report included in today's bulletin. Also, next to my column are the break-down and compilation of donations received for all the special collections these past six months. Thank you for your generosity. I am deeply grateful for your faithful commitment to stewardship at Saint Catherine of Siena Parish. Because of your intentional "giving back to God for all he has given to us," we are not only able to take care of parish finances, but we are able to tithe as a parish, and reach out and support various needs (and institutions) in our local community. Included at the end of the parish financial report, you will find the accounting of our parish tithing. God has indeed blessed us as a parish and continues to shower his blessings upon us.

Last weekend we introduced the *Adsumus Sancte Spiritus*, a prayer used at council, synods and other Church gatherings for hundreds of years. Over the



next few weeks we will break open the prayer in hopes of a better understanding of what we are praying for.

> We stand before You, Holy spirit, as we gather together in Your name. With You alone to guide us, make Yourself at home in our hearts;

The first stanza of this prayer is straightforward: we are acknowledging that we stand before the Holy Spirit both as individuals and as a community. However, we are not standing here passively waiting for the Holy Spirit to do something. No, we stand here opening our hearts and minds to the action of the Holy Spirit, ready to play a role in dynamic cooperation with one another, the universal Church, and the Holy Spirit. We stand with our walking shoes on, ready to journey together. We may not know where the Synodal Process will lead us, but we have prepared a place for God to guide us as we move forward.
