

### **PASTORAL PONDERINGS**

This weekend we celebrate the Fifth Sunday in Ordinary Time. Today's Gospel account is taken from the beginning of the 5<sup>th</sup> chapter of Luke. Jesus is standing by the Lake of Gennesaret with a crowd pressing around him to hear the word of God. While there, he notices two boats alongside the lake; the fishermen have disembarked and are cleaning their nets. Jesus gets into one of the boats belonging to Simon and asks him to put out a short distance from the shore. While sitting in the boat, Jesus teaches the crowds. finished, he tells Peter: "Put out into deep water and lower your nets for a catch." Simon, the fisherman, being a bit skeptical, replies: "Master, we have worked hard all night and have caught nothing, but at your command I will lower the nets." Once the nets are lowered, they catch a great number of fish, and the nets begin to tear. Signaling for help, they fill both boats with fish. All gathered are astonished. Jesus tells Simon, James, and John not to be afraid: "from now on you will be catching men." When they bring their boats to shore, they leave everything and follow him. As I was reflecting upon today's Gospel account, I remembered three weeks ago that Father Jim talked about the empty jugs, after being filled with water, that Jesus changed into wine. He referred to them as empty vessels being filled by Jesus and asked the following questions: 1) Where has the wine "run out" in our world, our community, our church, our schools, our parish, our own hearts? 2) How can we fill-up our own vessels? In today's Gospel passage, Jesus takes empty nets, and using them as "vessels," fills them with a great number of fish, and demonstrates an abundance to show visually that many are called, and by answering the call, many will be saved through him. The fish that were scattered in the sea while the "future disciples" were fishing, with no success of a catch, are immediately drawn and lured to the nets when Jesus invites the fishermen to trust in him and his words and lower their nets a second time. Then, a transformation takes place as they follow Jesus: he transforms the fishermen into **nets**, that is **vessels**, in which they will be "catching" men" - sharing in the mission of Jesus, drawing others to him. How are we like nets, drawing others to Jesus, in our daily lives through our words and actions? How does Jesus use our gifts and natural abilities to draw others to him and become his followers?

# DIOCESAN NEWS BREAKING OPEN THE SYNOD PRAYER



Teach us the way we must go and how we are to pursue it. We are weak and sinful; do not let us promote disorder.

Do not let ignorance lead us down the wrong path nor partiality influence our actions.

The second stanza might be the hardest one to digest. We don't typically like to call attention to our deficits and sin. But it's true that we are weak and we are sinful. We're acknowledging that we have biases and agendas. We're asking the Holy Spirit to help form our hearts, our minds, and our actions. We're asking the Spirit to help us recognize our biases and agendas and, as we participate in the Synodal Process, to be able to discern between what we want and what the Spirit wants. The original Latin says, "do not let us disturb the order of justice." We must remain focused on what is right and just, and not stand in the way of the Holy Spirit.
