

PASTORAL PONDERINGS

This weekend we celebrate the Sixth Sunday in Ordinary Time. In today's Gospel passage from Luke, we hear his account of the Beatitudes. Most of us are familiar with the traditional eight Beatitudes which appear in Matthew's Gospel. Unlike Matthew's account which takes place on a mountain, in Luke's account Jesus "stands on a level stretch of ground" with a great crowd of disciples, and a large number of people. One is the sermon on the mount and the other is the sermon You may wonder: what is the on the plain. difference if Jesus speaks from a mountain or on **level ground?** The geographic location each evangelist uses represents a difference in theology and the particular emphasis for each community hearing the message. Luke's setting reflects a "down-to-earth" message regarding inclusion in the kingdom of God. As in last week's Gospel, the wide net cast deep into the sea represented God's great love and desire to save all people, in this week's Gospel, Luke reflects the same concept. The poor, the hungry, the sorrowing, and those hated, excluded, and insulted because of their belief in the Son of Man are especially loved by Jesus who knows their plight. He, too, was poor, persecuted, hated, and put to death. Jesus could say with certainty that God is in the midst of all that humanity endures. It is not society that dictates who is favored by God, but God who embraces all with his unconditional love. Whereas the culture in which Jesus lived believed that the poor, the hungry, the suffering etc. had sinned and were being punished because of that sin, Jesus assures those gathered: "Blessed are you who are poor, for the kingdom of God is yours." The hungry will be satisfied, the sorrowing will laugh, and the persecuted will experience a great reward in This is "down-to-earth" theology concerning the kingdom of God. Luke's four Beatitudes are followed by four "woes" reminding all who think they "have it made" that they must reflect upon their attitudes, their complacency, and the judgments they make concerning others less fortunate than themselves. We ourselves know people who seem to have everything and yet are not happy, nor do they realize their blessings; in most cases, it is that relationship with God or the missing, along with the Church that is understanding and deep down feeling that God alone is enough. As we reflect upon today's Gospel, let us take to heart the words of Jesus and reflect upon our priorities as disciples of Jesus who belong to the kingdom of God. How can we encourage others to join us as companions at the Table of the Eucharist? - a foretaste of the heavenly banquet, for rich and poor alike - the feast in which all who hunger will be filled, all who weep will laugh, and all who are persecuted will rejoice.
