

PASTORAL PONDERINGS

This weekend we celebrate the Seventh Sunday in Ordinary Time. The Gospel passage from Luke immediately follows the account of the Beatitudes (and "Woes") we heard last Sunday. Remember, that was a bit of a shock for the disciples, as well as for us, as they, and we realized who has favor in God's sight: the poor, the hungry, the sorrowing, the persecuted - in other words, all have favor, even the marginalized. The "haves" and the "havenots" need to take that message to heart. In this Gospel of reversal, the rich, those who are filled, those who laugh, and those who are persecuted have no assurance that their lives may not be turned upside down. With this background from last week, Jesus continues to challenge the disciples, and the great reversal continues. Jesus says, "To those who hear I say, love your enemies, do good to those who hate you, bless those who curse you, pray for those who mistreat you." That's a hard pill to swallow for a culture that believes in revenge: "an eye for an eye and a tooth for a tooth." Even for those of us who don't believe in taking revenge upon another, it is a difficult hurdle to overcome to love one's enemies. Most of us, if not all of us, have had painful and hurtful moments in our lives, times when other have intentionally or unintentionally inflicted pain upon us, and times when we have been persecuted or bullied. How can we not have ill feelings toward those who have hurt us deeply? First, if we think love is a feeling, we won't ever be able to love our enemies. Secondly, if we believe that it is only through prayer and the grace of God that we come to forgive our enemies, let alone love them, then we may come to understand what loving our enemies means. In his book, The Four Loves, C.S. Lewis (the same author of the Chronicles of Narnia) outlines four kinds of Affection (storge), Friendship (philia), Romantic (eros), and Charity (agape). Jesus does not expect us to have affection for our enemies, nor does he expect us to become friends with our enemies, nor does he expect the kind of passionate love which is part of spousal love. However, Jesus does expect agape love from us. This is the unconditional love given to all by the Father through his Son, Jesus. friendship, and romantic love help lead us toward learning and growing in charity: agape love. It is the love we sing about in our Communion hymn today: Ubi caritas et amor, Deus ibi est - Where Charity and love prevail, there God is (ever found). As disciples of Christ, we are called to the same love Jesus offers us. God withholds love from no one. It may take us a lifetime to learn how to pray for our enemies and "love" those who persecute us. Keep in mind that Jesus summed up the whole law in the following: Love God with your whole heart and your neighbor as yourself.
