

From the School



Greetings from Room 211!

OLQM Middle School students have been busy and engaged in their Social Studies classes! We have had an exciting quarter filled with interesting topics and challenging tasks and our students have risen to the occasion!

Sixth grade World Geography students are finishing a unit on Latin America. They have spent the past several weeks learning about and analyzing various topics, such as earthquakes in the Caribbean, conflicts over land use in the Amazon Rainforest, spatial inequality in Mexico city, and how humans adapt to life in the Central Andes. They have also learned much about the physical and political geography of Latin America. They are currently wrapping up the unit by researching and presenting a slideshow about a Latin American country of their choosing. It sure has been fun! We move on to Europe in our next unit.

Seventh graders in World History classes have spent this quarter learning about ancient India and ancient Greece. Specifically, they have looked at how geography influenced settlement in these areas, and learned about innovations made during the Golden Ages of India and China and how these changed the world permanently. To culminate our unit on India, students made palm leaf books about the achievements of the Gupta Empire, which were colorful and informative! After Christmas break, we will continue with the Silk Road before moving on to Ancient Greece and Rome!

Eighth grade American History students have just completed a unit on the American Revolution. During this unit, students practiced thinking like historians by examining primary sources and analyzing them. They looked at bias in primary sources related to the Boston Massacre, looked for evidence of principles of the Enlightenment in the Declaration of Independence, and made a timeline of events based on primary sources related to the battles at Lexington and Concord. After break, they will be studying the Constitution, which many of our current eighth grade students saw in person during our trip to Washington, DC last spring!

As a bonus activity, many students chose to research a historical figure, write a short report on that person, and create an "Elf on the Shelf" style advertisement. The results were highly entertaining!

GOSPEL MEDITATION

January 1, 2023 Mary, The Holy Mother of God

We hide ourselves and our secrets from God because we are afraid. Even Mary can seem too perfect to approach. The shepherds find the strength to speak to Mary and Joseph *at the moment they see the child in the manger*. They open their hearts and share what they've experienced. Saint Luke writes of the shepherds, "When they saw this, they made known the message that had been told them about this child."

When I was a college student, I visited Rome. Beggars often approached and said, "Mangia? Mangia?" I didn't speak Italian and thought, "Why are they speaking about the Christmas nativity scene?" My friend said, "Mangia means eat. They're hungry." That's when I realized more deeply than ever before that Mary puts her baby in a place designed for hungry animals to eat.

See that baby in the manger in your heart. Imagine Mary kneeling nearby looking at you with love. She doesn't cling to God for herself. In that cave, from the beginning, she quietly offers her son to hungry souls. The manger means vulnerable self-offering love. That's the sign. This week that same manger opens our hearts to tell Mary about our lives, too.

Solemnity of the Blessed Virgin Mary, the Mother of God

Nm 6:22-27 | Gal 4:4-7 | Lk 2:16-21

GROW AS A DISCIPLE | PRAY, STUDY, ENGAGE, SERVE

Today's readings remind us of the central role Mary plays in the story of Jesus and the story of our salvation. We may be tempted to place her on a pedestal – as well we should – she is the Mother of God! At the same time, today's Gospel reminds us she is not divine herself, but human – and she bore the incarnate flesh of the Son of God in his divine and human nature. She went through the sleepless nights and the uncertainties of parenting in all its stages. She learned early on what it takes many of us a lifetime to learn – often in fits and starts – absolute trust in God. As we celebrate this solemnity, we can bring our uncertainties, fears, and struggles to Mary our mother, asking for the grace to follow her faithful example.

GO EVANGELIZE

PRAYER, INVITATION, WITNESS, ACCOMPANIMENT

Of course there's nothing wrong with New Year's resolutions, and I always admire people who have thought about them in advance. Me? I'm often tongue-tied on January 1 when someone asks me what my resolutions are (hmm ... maybe I should think about kicking that procrastination habit in 2023?) This is why Mary's reaction to the visit of the shepherds strikes me so profoundly. The shepherds pay homage to Jesus and spread the word that God's Son has been born. Mary, Luke writes, "kept all these things, reflecting on them in her heart." As we move into a new year, so rich with possibility, we might follow Mary's example and reflect before jumping headlong into this or that goal or New Year's resolution. Instead, perhaps we can take the day - or a week or a month - to prayerfully reflect on how we can best put our faith in Jesus into action. How can we witness to our faith in our daily lives? What changes might help us do that? We can ask God to help us draw up a list of ways that we can be more faithful to him.

PRAY Pray the Hail Mary, reflecting on each line with gratitude. If you have more time, give yourself a "mini-retreat" by reading or reflecting on a book or devotional about Mary.





Saint John Neumann January 5

St. John Neumann is the patron saint of educators, immigrants, and, due to the miracles that secured his canonization, sick children. This is a fitting patronage as he was a lover of education and learning from a very young age. Born in 1811 Bohemia, in what is now the Czech Republic, he attended the university in Prague preparing for ordination. In 1836 at the age of 25, he took a leap of faith and decided to just immigrate to the United States with only \$40 in his pocket. This risk paid off when he was ordained a priest in New York a month later.

Early in his priesthood he worked primarily as a missionary to German immigrants in Buffalo. His missionary work also created an opportunity for him to spend time in Maryland, Virginia, Michigan, and Ohio. When he was 29, he joined the Congregation of the Most Holy Redeemer (Redemptorists), a congregation of priests and brothers dedicated to helping the poor and most abandoned. He was their first member to profess vows in the United States.

In 1852, at the age of 41, Neumann became the fourth Bishop of Philadelphia. During this time, he organized the individual parochial schools in his region into a diocesan system. This change allowed Catholic schools to quickly increase the number of pupils enrolled by almost twentyfold. Over the course of his ministry, St. John expanded the number of Catholic schools in his diocese from 2 to 100! His passion for education extended to immigrants, like himself, and his love for learning languages made it possible for him to hear confessions in English, Spanish, French, Italian, Dutch, and Gaelic!

He was canonized on June 19, 1977, following three miracles, two of which regarded the healing of youth from grave illnesses. St. John Neumann was the first American man to be canonized a saint.


