



Dear friends of our West Maple Family of Parishes,

As Moderator of our family of parishes (Our Lady Queen of Martyrs, St. Owen, St. Regis and Holy Name) I felt it an opportune moment to share with you some good news for our whole family, news I hope you may have already heard last week-end in your respective parish churches.

Fr. David Buersmeyer is retiring June 30, 2023 after 43 years of dedicated ministry to the Archdiocese, most recently at St. Regis Parish in our own West Maple

Family of Parishes (which brings additional responsibilities such as Marian and Brother Rice High Schools).

The Priest Missioning Team has responsibility for recommending to Archbishop Vigneron the best possible allocation of clergy across the Archdiocese. I happen to be a part of that group and it is a challenging but privileged opportunity to pray, discern and discuss best options for the individual priest and the parishes he might feel called to serve.

I am pleased to announce that Fr. John Dudek, ordained in 2021 and currently serving in the family that includes Divine Child Dearborn, is being assigned to our West Maple Family effective July 1, 2023 for a six year term. He will have primary responsibilities for the St. Regis site and its activities under my direction as his mentor. He will also join me and the other priests of our family (Msgr. LeFevre and Fr. Smalarz) in care of the pastoral and liturgical needs of Marian High School and Brother Rice High School.

Fr. Dudek brings to our family a wealth of experience which will be a great complement to the rest of us. He was married approximately 20 years and has two grown daughters, both having graduated from college. He received an annulment from the Detroit Tribunal and spent 4 years of full-time formation for priesthood at St. John XXIII Seminary in Brighton, Massachusetts. He taught at Novi Public High School for 25 years in the area of persons with special needs. Many of you have known him from his long association with Camp Sancta Maria, Gaylord.

In the months ahead you will be hearing from me as we move forward with new ways of serving all of you. For now I trust you will join me in thanking Fr. Buersmeyer for his years of dedicated service and in welcoming Fr. John Dudek.

Frequently Asked Liturgy Questions: Why do we use Latin in the Mass?

As Roman Catholics, Latin is our native language. During Jesus' lifetime and the early days of the Church, the Roman Empire was the world's largest superpower. Though the Romans persecuted Christians for the first 300 years of the Church's history, the conversion of Emperor Constantine allowed Christianity to be legalized and spread throughout the entire empire, throughout almost all Western Europe and beyond. As Latin was the language that united the whole Roman empire, Latin is the language that unites the whole Roman Catholic Church across countries and across centuries.

Participating in our cultural heritage is an important part of being Catholic. Just as the Polish side of my family will sing "Sto Lat" at birthday celebrations, and as all families celebrate their cultural traditions for important occasions and holidays, our global Catholic family remains united in our cultural traditions and in our language of origin. When I attended Papal Masses at St. Peter's in Rome, it was incredible to sing the same Sanctus we sing at Our Lady Queen of Martyrs and to be united in song with thousands of pilgrims from all over the world. While we may not be able to see the global Church as easily as we might at the Vatican, we remain always connected to them in our celebration of the Mass.

Did you know: that even when singing the Latin ordinary (ordinary = the prayers of the Mass whose texts never change), we also sing in Greek and Hebrew? The Roman Church always sang the penitential rite in Greek:

Kyrie eleison, Christe eleison, Kyrie eleison = Lord, have mercy, Christ, have mercy, Lord, have mercy

Additionally, we sing a number of untranslated Hebrew words, such as "Amen" (let it be done), "Alleluia" (praise the Lord), and "Hosanna" (an acclamation of praise and an appeal for salvation).

Reflection on this week's antiphons:

The antiphons and readings this week are about contemplating God's Word, seeking God's face, and finally seeing God's face. Just as Abraham believed God's promises made to him, we understand that believing God's Word is necessary to receive God's promises to us. Our offertory antiphon invites us to meditate on this Word and think on the things that God desires for us. Contemplating the Word of God is seeking the face of God. Then, in the Gospel, Jesus is transfigured before his disciples, giving them a glimpse of his divine glory. They are told to keep this revelation internal until after the resurrection. Like the disciples, we are allowed to glimpse God's glory in the Mass, though the full heavenly reality remains hidden. As we long for God and heaven, we are invited to meditate on the scriptures and contemplate these spiritual realities. The fulfillment of all God's promises is when we get to see God face to face.

Getting ready for Holy Week:

While we learned last week that the Triduum is a three-day liturgical season leading up to Easter Sunday, we look forward to The Evening Mass of the Lord's Supper on Holy Thursday night. This evening Mass recalls Jesus' Last Supper with his disciples and follows the same form of any Mass with three exceptions: 1) We receive fresh holy oils that are blessed at Blessed Sacrament Cathedral on Holy Thursday morning, 2) The priest follows Jesus' example to his disciples and washes the feet of 12 parishioners, and 3) the liturgy does not end in the usual way. Just as Jesus proceeded from the Last Supper to the Garden of Gethsemane, we process with the Blessed Sacrament to the altar of repose, a space set apart like the Garden. There we pray and watch and keep vigil with the Lord as we anticipate the Passion on Good Friday.



Sts. Perpetua and Felicity March 7

"When my father in his affection for me was trying to turn me from my purpose by arguments and thus weaken my faith, I said to him, 'Do you see this vessel—water pot or whatever it may be? Can it be called by any other name than what it is?' 'No,' he replied. 'So also I cannot call myself by any other name than what I am—a Christian.""

So writes Perpetua: young, beautiful, well -educated, a noblewoman of Carthage in North Africa, mother of an infant son and chronicler of the persecution of the Christians by Emperor Septimius Severus.

Perpetua's mother was a Christian and her father a pagan. He continually pleaded with her to deny her faith. She refused and was imprisoned at 22.

In her diary, Perpetua describes her period of captivity: "What a day of horror! Terrible heat, owing to the crowds! Rough treatment by the soldiers! To crown all, I was tormented with anxiety for my baby.... Such anxieties I suffered for many days, but I obtained leave for my baby to remain in the prison with me, and being relieved of my trouble and anxiety for him, I at once recovered my health, and my prison became a palace to me and I would rather have been there than anywhere else."

Despite threats of persecution and death, Perpetua, Felicity—a slavewoman and expectant mother—and three companions, Revocatus, Secundulus and Saturninus, refused to renounce their Christian faith. For their unwillingness, all were sent to the public games in the amphitheater. There Perpetua and Felicity were beheaded, and the others killed by beasts.

Felicity gave birth to a daughter a few days before the games commenced.

Perpetua's written diary of her trial and imprisonment ends the day before the games. "Of what was done in the games themselves, let him write who will." The diary was finished by an eyewitness.







GOSPEL MEDITATION

March 5, 2023
The 2nd Sunday of Lent

As a kid I remember looking at my sister and thinking, "No man is ever going to marry her. She is way too...my sister!" I couldn't see her as anything except my goofy, emotional, cooties-laden sister. Years later, on her wedding day, I remember seeing how her husband looked at her, he was totally in love with her, his watery eyes full of overwhelmed joy, drinking in her beauty and grace. He was the one who actually saw her. Blinded by familiarity, I had not been able to see her until now. She was glorious. I finally saw how beautiful my sister really was.

Jesus is transfigured before Peter, James, and John. His face shone like the sun and his clothes dazzle with heavenly light. If it's a miracle, it is so related to the apostles' perception of the glory of Jesus. The physical spectacle reveals how the Father perceives the Son, so to speak: "This is my beloved Son, with whom I am well-pleased; listen to him." The Son is *always* bathed in the Father's love. It's only just now that they finally perceive it.

Who could possibly give his or her heart totally to Jesus? If we perceive him to be just another teacher, symbol, or moral example, we can't. But if the Holy Spirit gives us eyes to see that he is the Beloved Son of God, who makes our humanity not just pleasing to God but filled with glory ... then who can resist him? Perhaps only the lovers are the ones who properly see.


