





Fifth Sunday of Lent

Ez 37:12-14 | Rom 8:8-11 | Jn 11:1-45

GROW AS A DISCIPLE | PRAY, STUDY, ENGAGE, SERVE

In today's Gospel, we see so clearly the fully human nature of Jesus even in the midst of him revealing his divine nature in raising Lazarus from the dead. On hearing that his friend Lazarus had died, Jesus "wept," and he became "perturbed and deeply troubled." We see his love for Martha and Mary, and the freedom he gives them to love him fully in return, and to expect things of him. Each of them confronts Jesus, exasperated: Had you come earlier, our brother would not have died! Yet in the same breath, they express their faith that Jesus is the resurrection and the life. As we continue our Lenten journey, we can rest assured that Jesus is never far from us and that he understands our human longings, struggles and pain. Like Martha and Mary, we can place our faith in Jesus here, now and for eternity.

GO EVANGELIZE

PRAYER, INVITATION, WITNESS, ACCOMPANIMENT

The raising of Lazarus foreshadows Christ's death and resurrection and reminds us of God's enduring power over death. That can, at times, seem a small comfort as we confront our own mortality or mourn the loss of those dear to us. Yet, just as Jesus showed his love for Lazarus, Martha and Mary, we, too, can extend our love and support for others in their grief. We can show our love through our simple presence, a thoughtful card or an offer to pray for the deceased person and their family. In these ways, we can strengthen our own faith and that of others. As we hear in today's Gospel, "Now many of the Jews who had come to Mary and seen what he had done began to believe in him."

ACTION As we grow closer to Holy Week, now is a good time to participate in the sacrament of reconciliation. Has it been a while? The U.S. Bishops provide a helpful guide on their website: usccb.org.

Deacon Chris's Corner.....



One of my family's favorite animated series, as my children were growing up, was *Veggie Tales*. This show is about different vegetables, as an example, Larry the Cucumber and Bob the Tomato, who star as different biblical characters or different random characters with moral dilemmas. The musical shows and movies they write and produce are wholesome, thought-provoking, certainly spiritual, and very funny.

One of the movies they put together was *Jonah*, from the Book of Jonah in the bible. In this animated musical, there is an epic revival song called *Second Chances*. The song illuminates the truth that we have a God of second

chances, referring to the second chance He gave the Ninevites from sin, as well as Jonah, who did not want to be a prophet for the benefit of the Ninevites.

Today's Gospel about the raising of Lazarus from the dead might appear like a second chance that God has given Lazarus from a physical standpoint. But make no mistake about it: Jesus raises Lazarus from the dead to show us how God gives us second, third, fourth, fifth.........chances as it relates to our spiritual lives and the sin that breaks our relationship with Him.

If we believe that Jesus is the "Resurrection and the Life", He will give us a second chance from the death that sin has caused us, by raising us from sin and death and suffering, and giving us eternal life.

Our God is a god of second chances. He loves us so much that He sent His Son, Jesus Christ, to rescue us from the power of sin and death and suffering, and to raise us to new life in Him.

From the lyrics of Second Chances, in the movie, Jonah: Praise the Lord, He's the God of second chances, you'll be floored how His love your life enhances, you can be restored from your darkest circumstances, our God is a God of second chances!





On March 19, Adele Prando, sixth grader in the OLQM Sunday Faith Formation program, did a remarkable job of leading the community in the recitation of the Rosary. We are so grateful to you Adele and the entire Prando family for supporting this prayer service.

Third Scrutiny for the Elect

This weekend we celebrate the third and final scrutiny. We, as a community of faith, pray that these individuals who will receive the sacraments of initiation at the Easter Vigil will be given a spirit of repentance, a sense of sin, and the true freedom of the Children of God. This is also an opportunity for all of us to search our minds and hearts and pray for forgiveness and healing.

Our Elect and Candidates will for the last time be dismissed to reflect deeply and, in community, on the Word of God. They will contemplate these important insights from the scripture among others:

- We humans are the only creatures that have knowledge of our own death. This knowledge places us in a state of anxiety and insecurity especially as we age.
- Jesus refuses to fear death. He speaks of the 12 hours of sunlight in a day. He points out the pattern in nature. The other 12 hours of darkness will come (a metaphor for death) but they will not last.
- Jesus invites the onlookers to participate in the resurrection of Lazarus. He asks them to roll the stone away, unbind him and let him go free. We too have a part to play in creating a culture of life. Jesus invites us to share in His work.
- The stone is a metaphor for fear of death, the finality of death and blindness that keeps us from seeing that death is merely a part of a larger mystery called life. Death does not have the final word.

As we all journey through Lent as a community of faith let's share what we learn with each other and how we are growing closer to God. What is not communicated is lost. In just two weeks we are excited to welcome these individuals to the Table of the Lord.

Music Notes

Frequently Asked Liturgy Questions: How do I get anything out of the Mass?

The Mass has more graces for us than our minds can conceive. Participating in the holy sacrifice of the Mass is taking part in the most powerful prayer on earth, given to us by God himself. Even on the days when we do not feel emotionally or mentally connected, it is important to

understand that we are still receiving graces, although we may not feel it. While this thought should be a comfort to us on our difficult days, it does not give us license to remain emotionally or mentally disconnected through our lack of effort. The best way to get more out of the Mass is preparation. We are called to set aside time for prayer every day. If we use some of that time to prepare for the Mass, our prayer life will deepen, and our connection with God will only increase. We can prepare by reading the scriptures for the upcoming Sunday. These scriptures can be found through so many resources, be it the United States Conference of Catholic Bishops website (usccb.org), or through apps like iBreviary or Hallow, or through printed resources like the Magnificat or Word Among Us books. Using any of these resources to read and meditate on the scriptures allows us to hear so much more in the remaining texts of the liturgy and have our questions answered, making the Mass all the more enriching to our everyday lives.

Reflection on this week's antiphons:

For the fifth Sunday in Lent, we hear the story of the raising of Lazarus in the Gospel. While it is easy to hear the positive side of this story and the incredible act of God to raise Lazarus from the dead, our antiphons show us a more complete picture. Not everyone was happy to see Lazarus rise from the dead. It was not difficult for Jesus to raise Lazarus, but he could not change the hearts of the Pharisees and other religious leaders without their permission. And while Martha and Mary rejoiced to have their brother restored to them, the Pharisees went from this miraculous scene of resurrection to plotting Jesus' death and Lazarus' as well. They sought immediately to destroy God's good works. It is in this moment that we remember that Jesus is on his way to the Cross and to Calvary. As we prepare for Holy Week, the remaining texts of our antiphons cry out to God for vindication and mercy. Like Jesus on his way to the Cross, we ask God for strength and mercy in our trials. We recount God's amazing acts that bring life to us, and which inspire our trust in God. The raising of Lazarus shows us God's powers of resurrection. We can trust him in our current trials, and that as we embrace our own crosses, God will bring us to new life in him.

Getting ready for Holy Week:

The first day of the Triduum (Latin for "Three Days"), is Holy Thursday, where we celebrate the Evening Mass of the Lord's Supper. There are two main themes associated with this liturgy: the institution of the Eucharist (God's love for us), and a call to fraternal charity (our love for each other). At the Last Supper, Jesus washed the feet of his disciples, giving us an example and a new commandment: that we love one another as Jesus has loved us. This call to fraternal charity is fulfilled in the offertory text, which proclaims: Ubi caritas est vera, Deus ibi est. This means that where charity is true, God is there. We make God present by loving our brothers and sisters in Christ. In the liturgy, while this offertory text is sung, the congregation brings forward gifts for the poor along with the bread and wine to be consecrated. When we celebrate the Eucharist, God's total outpouring of himself for our sake, we remember that we are called to pour out of ourselves, to pour out of our gifts, to pour out of our possessions, for those we love.








Boy Scout Open House Tuesday, April 4, 7pm - 8:30pm



OLQM is invited to participate in the 13th Annual LOC Easer Ham Drive for the Matchan Nutrition Center, a Soup Kitchen in Pontiac, which is sponsored by the Society of St. Vincent de Paul.

If you are willing to donate a ham this year, just bring it to Our Lady Queen of Martyrs' parking lot (behind the church) on Monday April 3rd between 9:00 AM and 11:00 where a van will be ready to take the hams to the Nutrition Center. (Monetary donations can be sent to Mary Ottney at 32355 Arlington, Beverly Hills, 48025.)

Since 1984, Matchan has served hot cooked-from-scratch meals neighbors in need in the Pontiac area. Matchan also provides life changing assistance that leads to self-sufficiency, by providing space for Social Government agencies that service our neighbors thorughout the year. Covid in 2020 changed the way we did things, but we remained open to feed the needy. In 2022, we lost our lease after serving for 38 years at one location. However, we found a new location and are once again serving hot sit-down meals. Our pantry has become a Market Place, giving away four times the pre-covid amount of food, including eggs, milk, produce, bakery products and meat. Through the years, we've continued to meet the challenges to help our neighbors in Pontiac.

GOSPEL MEDITATION

The 5th Sunday of Lent

Of all Jesus' miracles, the most unsettling might be when he made a dead person alive. We know of three times when he did so: a girl, a young man, and Lazarus. The miracle teaches us he has the power of life and death. He anticipates his resurrection. Sin hurts us. Some sin kills us, spiritually. The three miracles reveal to us that no matter our circumstances, Jesus can give life to us.

The three miracles are instructive of the three ways we feel dead. The little dead girl symbolizes sin before it has time to mature. She's in bed and, once alive, gets right back to her life. The young man is lying in his casket in a funeral procession. This is sin allowed to fester, to grow and become somewhat normalized. Once raised, he has a short walk back home. Lazarus, a full-grown dead man, lies wrapped in burial bands in the tomb. Once he is raised, much needs to be done. He'll need to remove those bands, find new clothes, and travel all the way back home. That is sin allowed to go all the way, unchecked for months or years. It's the most spectacular of the three and reveals Jesus' glory more than the others.

What hope that should give us, for us and those whom we love! Jesus knows our sin hurts us and can even kill us spiritually. No matter the extent of the damage, he is always ready for the miracle of making the dead fully alive.


