

### Twelfth Sunday in Ordinary Time

The theme of stormy seas links today's readings from the Book of Job, Psalm 107, and St. Mark's Gospel. God addresses Job through a storm. The psalmist proclaims God's command over the stormy seas. The evangelist, St. Mark, retells the story of Jesus scolding His disciples for their lack of faith after He quiets the sea. In turn, they are in great awe of Jesus' power over the wind and the water. St. Paul, in his Second Letter to the Corinthians, preaches that in Christ, we are a new creation, that the old things have passed away. As Christian stewards, we find comfort in the assurance that the Lord is always there to calm the storm during challenging times and to bring peace to our lives.

The disciples feared for their lives while caught in a violent storm until Jesus calmed the wind and the sea. When has your faith in Jesus helped calm your fears?©LPi







### Examination of Conscience

The daily examination of conscience is an ancient Catholic practice. It's very simple, and it's designed to help us identify our sins and weaknesses so that we can improve and grow stronger in the spiritual life. Basically, it consists in taking a few minutes at the end of the day to prayerfully review our actions in the light of God's commandments. The Act of Contrition is often said afterwards. The daily examination also serves as an excellent ongoing preparation for regular Confession.

## Reflect on the victories and losses

Actively reflecting on the high and low points of the day can help you live more intentionally and bring a renewed sense of resolve into the following day. Review your actions, words, and thoughts today. Did you actively guard yourself against temptation? Where did sin creep in? In what moments did you practice virtue and moral courage? Were you attuned to the Holy Spirit's promptings today? Where did you feel His inspiration? Ask Him for the graces necessary to follow His will more purposefully tomorrow.

# Act of Contrition

O my God, I am heartily sorry for having offended Thee, and I detest all my sins because of Thy just punishments, but most of all because they offend Thee, my God, Who art all good and deserving of all my love. I firmly resolve with the help of Thy grace to sin no more and to avoid the near occasions of sin. Amen.

# Practice gratitude

It is God's love that has brought you into existence and to this exact moment. Practice looking for His hand in your day. Where did you feel His loving gaze upon you today? What people or moments helped you see God in your life? Thank God for all these moments! Ask Him to help you recognize His blessings and providence tomorrow.

# Renew your commitment to Christ

Remember our Faith is founded upon a Person—Christ! Renew your personal love and devotion to Him. Thank God for the gift of His Son Jesus and our call to be His disciples. Tell the Lord of your desire to know Christ more personally.


If possible, set an intention for your day tomorrow. Ask Our Lord to guide you in this act. Pray a Hail Mary, Our Father, or another beloved prayer.



### PTSD AWARENESS MONTH

June is recognized as Post Traumatic Stress Disorder (PTSD) awareness month. According to the U.S. Department of Veterans Affairs, PTSD is a mental health problem that can only develop after you go through or see a life-threatening event. It's normal to have upsetting memories, feel on edge, or have trouble sleeping after a traumatic event. At first, it may be hard to do daily activities you are used to doing. Going to work or school, even spending time with people you care about, can feel difficult right after a



traumatic event. But most people start to feel better after a few weeks. For some people, PTSD symptoms may start later, or they may come and go over time. If it's been longer than a month and thoughts and feelings from a trauma are upsetting you or causing problems in your life, you may have PTSD. Anyone can develop PTSD at any age; it's not a sign of weakness. Symptoms include reliving the event, avoiding things that remind you of the event, having more negative thoughts and feelings than before the event and feeling on edge or keyed up. Treatments are available; if you believe you may have PTSD, please talk to your healthcare provider. If you feel you are in crisis, please call 988.

### ABOUT THE INTERCESSOR



Her work laid the foundation for what is now the parochial school system.

#### Answers to June 16th WHAT'S YOUR CATHOLIC IQ?

1.(b) In Pope Francis' *Patris Corde*, he shares his personal reflections on St. Joseph. Pope Francis declared 2021 the "Year of St. Joseph" - from December 8, 2020, to December 8, 2021 – commemorating the 150<sup>th</sup> anniversary of the declaration of Saint Joseph as Patron of the Universal Church. 2.(a) This Solemnity (March 19<sup>th</sup>) honors Joseph as the foster father of Jesus and protector of the Holy Family. Joseph was a good worker. He used his hands and the tools of his carpentry trade to provide for his family. 3.(c) In Matthew 13:55, when the people of Nazareth call Jesus the carpenter's son, we learn that St. Joseph was a carpenter. He must have taught Jesus the trade because in Mark 6:3, the people of Nazareth call Jesus the

4.(b) An account of the genealogy of Jesus states (Matthew 1:16), "...and Jacob the father of Joseph the husband of Mary, of whom Jesus was born, who is called the Messiah".

5.(b) Through word and example, St. Joseph taught Jesus to respect the ways of his ancestors and to be faithful to God, to family, and to community.

6.(d) One of the greatest prayers you will find is the Litany of St. Joseph. The Litany invokes St. Joseph 26 times under various titles attributed to this great saint. 7.(b) St. Joseph's greatest strength was demonstrated when he was entrusted with the most incredible task of caring for and protecting Mary, after learning that the child she was carrying was not his. He was faithful even before an angel appeared to him in a dream revealing that "what is conceived in her is from the Holy Spirit" (Matthew 1:20).

8.(d) Joseph led his family safely to Egypt, just as the angel of the Lord commanded. Joseph probably didn't know anyone in that foreign land or speak the language. He left behind his job, his home, and his friends. But he brought along his faith in God and his love for Jesus and Mary.

9.(True) As he had done with Mary, God revealed his saving plan to Joseph. He did so by using dreams, which in the Bible and among all ancient peoples, were considered a way for him to make his will known.

10.(False) Each of us can discover in Joseph – the man who goes unnoticed, a daily, discreet and hidden presence – an intercessor, a support and a guide in times of trouble.


