# True Devotion: Look to the Saints

*"Every saint of the Catholic Church has been deeply devoted to the Blessed Sacrament. In fact, there is no sanctity without the Eucharist."* (Fr. John A. Hardon, S.J.)

If we want to become saints, we need to look to the saints, especially their devotion to the Holy Eucharist, Christ's Body, Blood, Soul and Divinity, which was given to us at the Last Supper and again on the Cross, which is offered to us at each and every Mass we attend. Today, we celebrate the Feast of Corpus Christi, the Solemnity of the Most Holy Body and Blood of Christ. *"Whoever eats my flesh and drinks my blood has eternal life, and I will raise him on the last day."* (Jn 6:54)

St. Thérèse of Lisieux and Blessed Carlo Acutis are two, among many, of the saints who stand as testaments to the beauty of true devotion to the Eucharist. At age 11, Blessed Carlo asked his parents to take him to visit all the sites of Eucharistic miracles in southern Europe. St. Thérèse loved to throw roses as she participated in Eucharistic processions and once said, *"I was never so happy as when I saw my roses touch the sacred monstrance."* Do we have that same joy when we are in the presence of and receive the Holy Eucharist?

June is the month of the Sacred Heart of Jesus. St. Margaret Mary, known as the apostle of modern devotion to the Sacred Heart, said, "Today the Lord destines you to honor His glorified life in the Blessed Sacrament. That is why He wishes you to enthrone yourself on the Cross. He wants you to glorify Him by carrying lovingly all those crosses which He presents to you, without ever letting yourself grow weary or complaining of their length or weight." Christ shares with us not only his Body and Blood but his Cross. Regular reception of the Holy Eucharist gives us the strength we need to carry our crosses.

St. Thomas Aquinas once said, "*The Eucharist is not a medicine for mortal sin*—*it is rather food for those in the state of grace.*" Christ asks that we come forward to receive him without stain of sin. When we receive Communion, we become vessels that take Christ out into the world to share him with others. Our bodies become living tabernacles.

At last Friday's 8th grade graduation Mass, the hymn "Draw Near" was beautifully sung by a group of 8th grade choir members. Passing by, and with each step forward as I readied my heart to receive Jesus, those words took on such a beauty for me.

Draw near, draw near! Take the body of your Lord. Drink the blood for you outpoured! Let us approach with faithful hearts sincere and take the pledges of salvation here. Christ, who in this life all the saints defends, gives all believers life that never ends.

Christ is asking us to draw near to him in the Eucharist. Let's take care that our hearts, minds, bodies and souls are in a sufficient state of grace to accept His invitation. Let us take every opportunity to spend time with him.

# YTD Budget Shortfall: \$228,368



June is traditionally dedicated to the Sacred Heart of Jesus, the symbol of Christ's great love and mercy for all of us. The Sacred Heart is usually depicted as a heart aglow with divine light, pierced by the lance and bleeding, often surrounded by a crown of thorns, surmounted by a cross. While the wounds and crown of thorns point to the manner of Christ's death, the fire

represents the transformative power of Christ' love.

The modern form of this beautiful devotion is derived from St. Margaret Mary who in the 17th century received many visions from Christ urging her to encourage devotion to his Sacred Heart and for all believers to perform acts of reparation in its honor. In response to this Jesus promised many blessings and graces to all who venerate and take refuge in his Sacred Heart.



It was from this urging that the tradition of *First Fridays* was first introduced. Pope Pius XI in his encyclical Miserentissimus Redemptor, stated: "the spirit of expiation or reparation has always had the first and foremost place in the worship given to the Most Sacred Heart of Jesus". In 2008, Pope Benedict XVI renewed this call to all Catholics to renew their devotion to the Sacred Heart during the month of June.

### **Praver to the Sacred Heart**

Most holy Heart of Jesus, fountain of every blessing, I love You. With a lively sorrow for my sins I offer You this poor heart of mine. Make me humble, patient, and pure, and perfectly obedient to Your Will. Good Jesus, grant that I may live in You and for You. Protect me in the midst of danger and comfort me in my afflictions. Bestow on me health of body, assistance in temporal needs, Your blessing on all that I do, and the grace of a holy death. Amen

A few weeks ago, a group of St. Francis parishioners participated in a riveting guided tour of the Holocaust Center in Farmington Hills. As we walked through the exhibits,

the docent discussed the causes of the Holocaust. The exhibits and the docent's thoughtful comments allowed us to better understand the horrible tragedies that can result when we begin to demean and to hate those whom we perceive as different. It was a stark reminder that we must be vigilant in supporting efforts to protect all human life in order to prevent future such "killing fields".

At the conclusion of the tour, the son of a Holocaust survivor told us of the experience of his father who escaped from a prison train while enroute to a concentration camp.
