# World Day for Grandparents and the Elderly

Back in 2021 our Holy Father, Pope Francis, established the World Day for Grandparents and the Elderly as a way to honor and celebrate the presence, witness and role of grandparents and other seniors in the life of the Church. He chose the weekend nearest to the feast of Sts. Anne and Joachim (July 26th), parents of the Blessed Mother and grandparents of the Lord, for this celebration.

Scripture is clearly silent on the lives of these saintly grandparents, so we rely on tradition and in a particular way the second century Protoevangelium of St. James to fill in the gaps and to inspire us to reflect on their role in the life of Christ and drama of salvation. But that should not prevent us from acknowledging their role and the power of their witness of faith and prayer. As grandparents we can actually see these venerable saints doing all the things that most grandparents do and maybe you have done or are currently doing- babysitting the newborn, taking them for walks, spoiling them with gifts and telling them stories!

It is good to remember that while faith is ultimately a gift from God and there are always great stories of conversions in the life of the Church the vast majority of us receive that gift through the witness and example of family- parents, and extended family- hence this year's theme "His mercy is from age to age" taken from the Magnificat in Luke's Gospel. (Lk 1:50) That is why being a grandparent is a special role for the Christian believer. Grandparents have a unique relationship with their grandchildren and so through their own commitment to Christ and his Church can have an incredible impact on the faith and the direction of their lives.

We should never doubt the impact a strong committed life of faith can have on another, especially one we greatly love. Accordingly, the Pope wants to highlight this special role and to encourage it and at the same time reassure grandparents that they are loved and needed. One of the great scandals of our world is the growing rift between family generations and the reality that often grandchildren do not know their grandparents in the way that previous generations did.

If you are one of the lucky ones to have a grandparent still living, then today is a great opportunity for you to express your love and gratitude. Call them up and arrange to spend a little time with them and if you have children make sure that they know who their grandparents and indeed their great-grandparents are. Pray for your grandparents, alive or deceased this week.

To underpin this special celebration, the Holy Father has granted a Plenary Indulgence (under the usual conditions (Sacramental Confession, Holy Communion, Prayer for the Holy Father's Intentions) to grandparents, the elderly and all the faithful who, motivated by a true spirit of penance and charity, will participate in the solemn celebration that the Holy Father Francis will preside over at the Vatican, or at the various functions that will be held throughout the world.

Here at St. Francis we will offer a special blessing for all grandparents at all our Masses this weekend and so join our celebrations and prayers to those of the Holy Father and the universal Church.

To all our parish grandparents we offer our thanks for your loving presence among us. May God bless you all today and always!


# The Children's Adventure of the Summer: VACATION BIBLE SCHOOL

# Assisi Center Update

It has been a few weeks since my last construction update. The main reason is that we have been waiting for both information and direction on the outstanding items. First off we are identifying the equipment and furnishing requirements for the Assisi Center. Kitchen equipment and hall furnishings are being evaluated and are slated to be ordered soon. Office furnishings and equipment are being studied and a plan is being developed so any needed items may be identified for purchase. All of these efforts are being considered based on how the building will be used to support parish life now and in the future.

There are still some outstanding items that prevent final inspections and our obtaining a certificate of occupancy. Our general contractor informed us that the movable partition walls are on track for delivery mid August. The manufacturer of the panels has been very consistent with this delivery date, so we are confident this delivery and installation will meet this time frame. The elevator promised for July delivery has been pushed back to August due to supply chain issues on just a couple parts. We have received correspondence indicating the missing components and expected timing of delivery to the factory. We are very hopeful that the elevator will be delivered and installation started in mid August.

The electric vehicle charging stations have been installed and are being registered and set up for use. The registration process consists of establishing hours of operation, the billing and collection accounts, and the reporting processes for tracking actual usage and revenues generated from the EV chargers.

Outside the building there are two outstanding items required for final inspections and occupancy approval. Last year the City of Ann Arbor reviewed the storm water system infrastructure resulting in an ordinance being revised in February of this year. In short the property owners constructing or revising parking areas are required to detain a greater amount of storm water on site, to help control storm surge from overflowing the existing infrastructure. We were not sure if the new requirements were going to be reviewed by the planning commission or if the revised plans would undergo an administrative review. We recently received the good news that the stormwater engineer and city planner were agreeable in concept to the proposed detention pond changes and parking lot renovations.

# Caring for LIFE in the 21<sup>st</sup> Century by Taking Meaningful Steps to Address Gun Violence

"In our public discourse around guns, we talk a great deal about (our) 'rights' and not enough about (our moral) 'duties'". (Saint John XXIII – Pacem in Terris)

Our Parish Bulletin, over the years, has included articles regarding serious threats to LIFE. One such threat is that of Gun Violence. We thought that you may find the joint statement on the topic which was recently signed by the Bishops of the Province of Atlanta to be especially relevant. We have included a couple quotations from the article in order to enable you to get a feel for the statement.

"In line with the measures consistently called for by the United States Conference of Catholic Bishops, public officials must put into place these common sense reforms:



- A total ban on assault weapons.
- Universal background checks for all gun purchases.
- Limitations on civilian access to high-capacity weapons and ammunition magazines.
- Improved access to and increased resources for mental health care and earlier interventions.
- Regulations and limitations on the purchasing of handguns.
- Require gun owners to provide safe storage and report lost or stolen guns."

"We cannot and will not stand by and silently accept that tens of thousands of people dying by gun violence each year is simply part of life in the United States. Nor can we accept excuses from political leaders that there is nothing that can be done. To do nothing is to be complicit in the violence." (Signed by Bishops of the Province of Atlanta which includes dioceses in Georgia, North and South Carolina).
