In an effort to highlight their presence and ministry among us they will, on the last Sunday of every month, carry the cross in and out at our Sunday Masses. It is a simple task, yet one that they hope will be a constant reminder of their presence and an invitation to the men of our parish to consider joining their great organization. Remember membership is open to all men in the parish and offers a wide variety of services, both spiritual and practical, through which they can develop and grow their Catholic faith. If you seek that deeper relationship with Christ, there is no better organization to help you achieve this than the Knights of Columbus.

Founded in Connecticut in 1882 by Blessed Michael McGivney, the Knights have grown to become an integral part of almost every Catholic parish community across the nation and are now present in many other countries, from Poland to the Philippines. Here at St. Francis, they have been present from the very beginning of our parish in the early 1950's.

The Knights of Columbus is a fraternal organization, originally founded at a time of much anti-Catholic prejudice, and rapid social and economic change. Over the past 150 years+ it has grown to become one of



the premiere charitable organizations in the USA. In addition to their support of Catholic education at all levels and in particular their support of seminarians and deacon candidates, the Knights are equally known for their work with foodbanks and kitchens, hostels for the homeless, the protection of the unborn and more recently their aid to assist the victims of hurricanes, earthquakes, and other natural disasters across the globe. Founded originally to counteract anti-Catholic bigotry, the Knights have a proud history of patriotic participation in the life of this nation as well as fighting prejudice in all its many forms, especially racial prejudice – all in the name of the Gospel of Christ.

Here at St. Francis, our local council, named in honor of our third pastor, Fr. Ray Rademacher, is working hard to build up and highlight its presence among us. Again, it is open to men over the age of 18 and is actively involved in many ofour ministries that seek to help all our men to grow in holiness and service. As pastor I am deeply grateful for their presence among us and for their support and prayers for my ministry, as a Knight. I am proud of their work and the difference they make in the lives of so many.

Michigan Legislation & Justice Soon We Will Vote On These Two Bills Named:

"Good Time" "Second Look"

The **Good Time** bill would allow prisoners to earn up to 20% off their minimum sentence through participation in educational, vocational programs and being 'ticket free'. Michigan is one of only 6 states that does not have some form of this allowance. We want to encourage incarcerated individuals to return home rehabilitated, more productive members of society. As a retired Chaplain told me, "What better measure of a person's behavior, than a person's behavior? If an incarcerated person can show responsible behavior over a period of years, that should be a very important factor in considering their release. Let them shoulder some responsibility and then let them be rewarded if it is warranted. The Criminal Justice system almost always takes patterns of criminal/negative behavior as justification for convicting and sentencing a person. So positive/rule following/law abiding behavior ought to be taken into account also."

The **Second Look** bills would allow prisoners in Michigan to petition a judge for a reduction of their sentence after serving at least 10 years in prison. The judge would be able to look at the prisoner's age when he committed the crime and his current age along with his instructional records to determine if behavioral changes have been made to allow a return to society. There are many older prisoners that have changed and pose no threat. They just want to return to their families and have peace. This is especially true if they have Church and family support.



The **Volunteer Respite Caregiver Program** seeks volunteers aged 21+ to provide much-needed breaks for caregivers in Washtenaw County.






