WHO DO YOU SAY THAT I AM?

All of us are called to answer one question. Maybe the most important question posed in history. And we <u>each</u> must answer for ourselves. The question is from Jesus: "Who do <u>you</u> say that <u>I</u> am?"

But no question is ever posed in a vacuum. Now more than ever, we have voices on all sides telling us what we must believe. Asking us all kinds of questions. How can you believe in a God who allows so much suffering? How can you believe that the Church is the body of Christ on earth with so much weakness in the Church? Who do you think you are to claim to have any answers for this world?

The good news is that the Church exists to help us answer this one question of who Jesus is. Because once we know who HE is, then we will know who the Church is, and finally we will know who we are. Jesus Christ, His Church, and our own identity are all tied together.

This month we heard about the disciples in a boat on stormy seas. The Church Fathers always saw this boat as the Church on her journey through this world toward heaven. This boat, despite the storms that it has encountered over the last 2000 years, has never capsized, because Christ is in it and he has kept Peter and his successors in the boat, never allowing them to veer from him in issues of faith and morals.

This is the only boat that we can be sure will reach its eternal port, because Jesus promised he'd guide it there. We see that promise in today's Gospel. Upon the rock of Peter, the first pope, he will build His church and the gates of hell shall not prevail against it.

So who do you say that I am? We say, with the Church, that Jesus Christ is the way, the truth, and the life. Let us stay in the boat with Peter and the apostles. And then, as the Catechism teaches: "Moved by the grace of the Holy Spirit and drawn by the Father, we believe in Jesus and confess: You are the Christ, the Son of the living God."







Returning to the Church

This is the 48th article in a series called, "Why do I pray these prayers at church?" written by Bill Razgunas.

I hear many say, "We have no problem with the man Jesus. Our problem is with the leaders of the Catholic Church." What should be done in order to be a positive influence in the face of these unfortunate thoughts? In order to do this, lets look at how people find themselves in this situation. How come there is such a great chasm between their experience of church and their faith?

Let me share a real story about how this worked itself out in Sue's life. She is a senior who was emotionally injured by her experiences with the church while growing up. Her inner wounds were 40 to 50 years old and her bitterness toward the Catholic Church was deep. At this point I would say that she was a Nature worshiper. One weekend she came to Ann Arbor to visit her friend George. The weather outside was cold and the sidewalks were slippery. Sue fell and injured her leg. Since there was an ugly bruise, George asked me to take Sue to the emergency room. I stayed with her and the time was well spent listening to her life's story. After many hours she was sent home. On the way home, she said that she wanted to express her appreciation. I explained that she could do this by thinking a little better of Jesus and the Catholic Church. She emphatically said "THAT'S NOT GOING TO HAPPEN!" A week later, Sue slipped on the ice again. This time she hit her head quite badly. The bruising on her face rapidly became very pronounced. After I saw it, I said to myself "This woman is going to die tonight." I took Sue to the emergency room. Since she had a very positive experience with our conversation the week before, she wanted to hear about my experience of following Christ. As we talked, I silently prayed for Sue. My sharing about Christ was like a single "barrel" of a shot gun. The other "barrel" of the shotgun was loaded with my prayers. I gave her both "barrels" without reservation that night. Why hold back in the face of her serious injury? Would she die that night? While talking to Sue. I wondered if God would do something if I reached over and touched her shoulder. When I did this Sue started repeatedly saying "You touched me!" Sue never admitted that God touched her that night. However, I saw Sue's injury showed signs of healing rapidly.

Later that night Sue was discharged and went back to stay with George. Sue was back on her feet the next day. Over the next couple of years, Sue embraced a deeper faith in Christ and returned to the Catholic Church.

Look at what happened! Sue had been fully trained as a Catholic. She had left the Catholic Church as a young adult. Subsequently, Sue had no faith in Christ. Her faith in "nature spirits" had been picked up along her life's journey. The first goal was to lead her to a fuller knowledge of Christ. Since this was blocked by SUBSTANTIAL emotional pain surrounding her injured relationship with the Catholic Church, I just listened while quietly praying. I did not try to solve any of her problems. During this time of listening, I asked that God would begin to heal what is going on inside of her. This established some fertile ground in Sue's heart. Christ acted in this situation and subsequently Sue found healing in her relationship with the church. That night, Sue's wasn't able to identify God as her healer. Its not that unusual for someone to experience a life changing event without fully comprehending it. Sometimes it takes many years for someone to admit that God acted.

Caring for Our Common Home Our Earth's Precious Blue Oceans 3rd in a Series by Peace & Justice Committee

"The oceans were given to us as a gift from the Creator and we must work to use them fairly and sustainably in order to pass them onto future generations." (Pope Francis)

Of the four innermost planets of our solar system, only the Earth presently has liquid oceans. Our oceans provide food for three billion humans living on our planet today. Ocean currents (like the Gulf Stream) help to moderate our climate. Oceans serve as "highways" for much of our international commerce. And oceans absorb significant quantities of carbon dioxide resulting from the waste products of the burning of fossil fuels in our atmosphere.

With so many benefits, one might expect that we would readily acknowledge what our planetary oceans provide and work to demonstrate our love and appreciation of them. However, it would appear that, instead of loving our oceans, we view them as just something to be used and abused.

We overfish them; we destroy their habitat (e.g., coral reefs); we facilitate the spread of invasive species; we burn fossil fuels thereby resulting in increased warming and greater acidification; we spill oil; and we are increasing greenhouse gases in the atmosphere which will cause sea levels to increase significantly; etc. Yes, it is a very strange way to demonstrate one's love.

Recently, the scientific community has highlighted two especially troubling concerns resulting from the warming that we have been experiencing:

- The warming water is causing many coral reefs around the world to bleach and die. This can have a catastrophic impact on the fish populations for which the reefs serve as habitat.
- There has been a weakening of the warm Gulf Stream (the strong current that flows up our east coast and then to Europe). This raises serious concerns that it may reach a point where it may fail to function at some time in the not-too-distant future, thereby adversely impacting the climate of both continents.

With the very real potential that our oceans will be drastically affected by a world that is becoming warmer and more contaminated, how might we respond to our grandchildren when they ask: "Grandpa / Grandma, what did you do while there was still time?"

Fortunately, we have many ways by which we can address the causes that contribute to the warming of our oceans. One involves switching from incandescent light bulbs to light-emitting diodes (LED bulbs) which can reduce the energy required for an equivalent amount of light from 100 watts to 17 watts or less. This is especially important when a power plant is sourced with polluting fossil fuels.



Leave Abortion out of the Pregnant Workers Fairness Act Please comment before October 101

Please comment before October 10!

A federal regulation aims to include abortion accommodations within a law intended to support pregnant workers' fair working conditions. The U.S. Conference of Catholic Bishops endorsed the Pregnant Workers Fairness Act, focusing on helping working mothers while safeguarding their health and that of their unborn children. However, the Equal Employment Opportunity Commission introduced proposed rules that encompass "having or choosing not to have an abortion" as a "related medical condition" covered by the law.

This proposed addition distorts the law's purpose. This occurrence echoes previous wrong attempts to equate abortion with childbirth in terms of benefits for pregnant women. The proposed federal regulation will be open for public comments for 60 days, ending October 10, 2023

Action Needed: please comment on the added wording, asking that "having an abortion" not be included in the Fairness Act. Include your reasons, including the inappropriate addition of abortion, the taking the life of the growing baby, the attempt to highjack legislation designed to aid pregnant women to further an agenda of abortion, the lack of protections for religious liberty, essentially forcing employers to provide for abortion which most people find abhorrent, for lack of protections for you to practice freely your Faith (Core Catholic teaching protects Life, including the developing unborn child).

The regulation language is lengthy, and the unfortunate addition is under 1636.3(b) Pregnancy, Childbirth, or Related Medical Conditions: "The list in the proposed regulation for the definition of "pregnancy, childbirth, or related medical conditions" includes current pregnancy, past pregnancy, potential pregnancy, lactation (including breastfeeding and pumping), use of birth control, menstruation, infertility and fertility treatments, endometriosis, miscarriage, stillbirth, or having or choosing not to have an abortion, among other conditions. The Commission emphasizes that the list in the regulation is non-exhaustive, and to receive an accommodation an employee or applicant does not have to specify a condition on this list or use medical terms to describe a condition."
