Lift up your hearts!

At the beginning of the Eucharistic Prayer we are told, "Lift up your hearts," to which we respond, "We lift them up to the Lord." In doing this we become a part of the heavenly choir of angels and saints who never cease praising God.

<u>This is the heart of music ministry</u>: to assist everyone in lifting up their hearts to the Lord. We do this by encouraging everyone to sing, by clothing with music the words of Scripture and the other prayers of the Mass, and by otherwise adding beauty to our celebration of the Liturgy.

As members of the heavenly choir, each one of you is a part of this mission. How? First, by your prayers. Music without prayer is like a body without a soul. Second, by your participation in the different parts of the Mass, whether spoken or sung. Not only will this benefit you individually, you will be encouraging those around you. How much easier it is to sing with confidence when you can hear others singing with you!

Third, by serving in a more formal way by joining one of our choirs or ensembles, or by auditioning to be one of our instrumentalists or cantors. We have opportunities for every sort of commitment level, from drop-in choirs to ensembles that have a separate weekly rehearsal. Don't think of yourself as a singer nor play an instrument? Consider trying out handbells!

One of the easiest ways to get involved is by joining our Resurrection Choir, which sings for parish funerals. Members get notification for upcoming funerals, and come when they are able. Some people come to almost all of them and others only on rare occasions.

Maybe you're interested, but you're not sure who to talk to, or how to get started. Or maybe you're not sure if it's the right thing for you. If that's you—or even if you're just curious about the organ or a hymn that we sang—I invite you to come up after any Mass and introduce yourself to any of the musicians. We'd love to meet you! Or send me a note or give me a call.

Finally, to return to where we began: Lift up your heart to the Lord! As Bishop Boyea wrote in a recent Friday memo, "What is happening is not just that the angels are present with us as we worship, but we are actually lifted to the heavenly realm to join with the angels as they continually worship God. This is really a meeting of heaven and earth here each Sunday around our parish altars."







Caring for Our Common Home Protecting God's Creation

Fourth article of a Series

"God looked at everything He had made, and He found it very good. Evening came, and morning followed – the sixth day." Genesis 1:31

In 2015 Pope Francis released his Encyclical "Laudato Si" – On Care for Our Common Home" which described our responsibilities to the Earth and to our sisters and brothers living today as well as our responsibility to those generations yet unborn. As our world continues to warm to levels unseen in the past 125,000 years, It is essential, (in view of the chaotic events such as erratic rainfall, severe droughts, dying coral reefs, more frequent flooding and wildfires, and melting glaciers that are occurring), that we address what we must do Now while there is still time to make a difference.

(Attached here is a small segment of Laudato Si' to give a feel of the document.)

"The climate is a common good, belonging to all and meant for all. At the global level, it is a complex system linked to many of the essential conditions for human life. A very solid scientific consensus indicates that we are presently witnessing a disturbing warming of the climatic system. In recent decades this warming has been accompanied by a constant rise in sea level and, it would appear by an increase in extreme weather events... Humanity is called to recognize the need for changes in lifestyle, production, and consumption, in order to combat this warming or at least the human causes which produce or aggravate it."

The Beauty of Life

Leave Abortion out of the Pregnant Workers Fairness Act Please comment before October 10!

A federal regulation aims to include abortion accommodations within a law intended to support pregnant workers' fair working conditions. The U.S. Conference of Catholic Bishops endorsed the Pregnant Workers Fairness Act, focusing on helping working mothers while safeguarding their health and that of their unborn children. However, the Equal Employment Opportunity Commission introduced proposed rules that encompass "having or choosing not to have an abortion" as a "related medical condition" covered by the law.

This proposed addition distorts the law's purpose. This occurrence echoes previous wrong attempts to equate abortion with childbirth in terms of benefits for pregnant women. The proposed federal regulation will be open for public comments for 60 days, ending October 10, 2023

Action Needed: please comment on the added wording, asking that "having an abortion" not be included in the Fairness Act. Include your reasons, including the inappropriate addition of abortion, the taking the life of the growing baby, the attempt to highjack legislation designed to aid pregnant women to further an agenda of abortion, the lack of protections for religious liberty, essentially forcing employers to provide for abortion which most people find abhorrent, for lack of protections for you to practice freely your Faith (Core Catholic teaching protects Life, including the developing unborn child).

The regulation language is lengthy, and the unfortunate addition is under 1636.3(b) Pregnancy, Childbirth, or Related Medical Conditions: "The list in the proposed regulation for the definition of "pregnancy, childbirth, or related medical conditions" includes current pregnancy, past pregnancy, potential pregnancy, lactation (including breastfeeding and pumping), use of birth control, menstruation, infertility and fertility treatments, endometriosis, miscarriage, stillbirth, or having or choosing not to have an abortion, among other conditions. The Commission emphasizes that the list in the regulation is non-exhaustive, and to receive an accommodation an employee or applicant does not have to specify a condition on this list or use medical terms to describe a condition."

Please comment and ask that the addition under 1636.3 (b) be removed. Your comments make a difference and can be done online: https://www.regulations.gov/document/EEOC-2023-0004-0001
