Two Saints, Two Relics, Two Days of Prayer!

It's very rare that the relics of one of Twelve Apostles come to the USA but this coming Wednesday, (Oct 11th) the relics of St. Jude, the Apostle of the Impossible, will be here with us at St. Francis for veneration and prayer. Lots of planning has gone into this great day but we need your assistance and help. *To make things easier here are a few key points to remember:*

- •Veneration will begin at 1pm. We will start with our school children: they will be dismissed from class around 12:30pm and will line up first to enter the Church with their family members. Veneration for all others will begin around 1:30pm.
- •Parking may be limited you may wish to park in the neighborhood and walk to Church.
- •To ensure the safety of all we ask you to line up and to follow the crowd corrals (as at an airport) and the instructions of the ushers/attendants and parish leadership.
- •To expedite the movement of the crowd in an orderly fashion, entrance and exit will be through the front doors of the Church only! Special provisions will be made for the disabled and for seniors with mobility issues.
- •As you enter the Church and move towards the Relic please maintain a reverent and prayerful silence, using this time to pray. We estimate that each person will have about 10-15 seconds before the Relic.
- •No photographs are permitted during your time before the Relic. Please respect this!
- •You are encouraged and permitted to touch the reliquary case with rosary beads, medals, and other sacred objects. This will make them third class relics!
- •Confessions will be available in the School building on the day- please follow the signs. Remember you have 20 days from your visit to fulfill the conditions to obtain the Special Plenary Indulgence attached to this visit. These conditions can be found on page 3 of this bulletin.
- •A Souvenir and Resources Table will be available in the Parish Activity Center.
- •A Special Collection to cover the costs of the visit will be taken up at Mass. Donations may also be made payable to the parish.
- •Veneration will continue until 6:30pm that evening, then it will break as we prepare for Mass at 7pm. We will also livestream the Mass to the Parish Activity Center.
- •Veneration will resume following Mass and will end promptly at 10pm.

This is a great privilege for our parish to be able to host this event. I know that many will receive great blessings and favors through the intercession of one who was called by Jesus and walked with him during his time here on earth. On Oct 12th we will follow this by a much smaller event with a relic of Blessed Carlo Acutis and a special Holy Hour on that day.

May the Apostle Jude and Blessed Carlo intercede for all of us and our community of faith.

Veneration of the Relics OCT II: ST. JUDE, THE APOSTLE - OCT 12: BL. CARLO ACUTIS - OCT. 17: PILGRIMAGE TO RELIQUARY

We are delighted to invite you to a special opportunity that will take place at our parish this October 2023. We will venerate some of the most precious relics of our faith, which have been generously loaned to us by various institutions and individuals.



On Oct. 11, we will have the opportunity to venerate the relic of the Apostle, St. Jude, which has been generously loaned to us by the Vatican. This is a rare and sacred opportunity that will bless our community. All day veneration of St. Jude's relic will begin at 1:00 pm and continue until 10:00 pm. We will celebrate a bilingual Mass at 7pm. Confessions will be available during veneration. (See below for details on receiving a plenary indulgence.)




On Oct. 12, we will have the opportunity to venerate the relic of Bl. Carlo Acutis, which was given to Fr. James directly from Carlo's own mother while on pilgrimage to Italy. We will begin with the 9:15 am Mass followed by a holy hour and all-day eucharistic adoration and veneration of Bl. Carlo's relic. We will end with Evening Prayer and benediction at 6:30pm.

Plenary Indulgence during the Veneration of the Relics of St. Jude

The Holy See has granted a plenary indulgence to all who venerate the relics of St. Jude the Apostle and who fulfill the following conditions:

- 1. Venerate the Relics of St. Jude in silent prayer.
- 2. Recite one Our Father and one Hail Mary praying for the Holy Father's Intentions and for the needs of the Church.
- 3. Receive the Sacrament of Reconciliation* (Confession) within 20 days of visiting the Relics.
- 4. Receive Holy Communion worthily and free from all grave sin (as defined by the Church and the Scriptures) within those 20 days.
- 5. Resolve to end all relationships with sin and sinful habits and to work to achieve holiness in this life and the life to come.

*Please note that on October 11 we will endeavor to offer Confessions to as many people as possible. If you wish to receive the Sacrament, please come prepared. Find a good Examination of Conscience and be ready to confess your sins. As we expect great numbers, please do not attempt to use this time for Spiritual Direction or to discuss major life issues or the sins of others.



Statement of Activities

The Statement of Activities (SOA) shows the income, expense and surplus (or deficit) for the Parish. When the complete SOA is reviewed, it reflects:

Income: \$13,992,584 Expense: \$12,497,500 Surplus: \$ 1,495,083

In the past year, the Parish was required to make some accounting changes causing us to recognize the income and expense of "non-operating" groups in its SOA totals. The previous method that was in place for many years was to list a separate schedule of dedicated accounts which was then summarized on the Statement of Financial Position (SFP). This change required making "non-cash" adjustments to income and expense to record non-operating activity on the SOA. rather than the SFP. So, in addition to the impact of these changes, also included in the total income and expense shown above are the activities of the Parent Teacher Group (PTG), the Educational Trust Fund (ETF), Saint Vincent de Paul, and the ongoing Assisi Center construction project.

Additionally, included in the Parish total above are "non-recurring" activities such as fundraising activity for the fine arts department and Hopes & Dreams scholarship donations. The Parish also qualified for a \$1.507 million Employee Retention Credit (ERC). And, as part of pandemic relief, our school was eligible for Emergency Assistance to Non-public Schools (EANS) from the federal government and our child care program was eligible for Child Care Stabilization Grants (CCSG) from the state government.

We decided to set aside the ERC in a separate, long-term savings account with the Diocese until a suitable project could be identified that would make the best use of these funds. The **EANS** funding was used for various school supplies, information technology equipment, textbooks, and licenses. In the new fiscal year, the Michigan Department of Education approved using \$240 thousand to replace playground equipment on the east side of the school. The CCSG was used to fund quite a few improvements such as the fencing around the preschool playground (which had its own major additions), continued renovation of the facilities in the lower church, improved security features such as surveillance cameras and intercom system, as well as upgrades to classroom information technology.

When these "non-operating" and "non-recurring" transactions are adjusted out of the Parish totals, we have a small operating deficit for all the operating entities of the Parish:

Key take-aways from the statement of activities include:

- Offertory income was \$254,184 below budget
- A \$148,970 gift from an estate
- Pre-K through grade 8 enrollment and tuition was at budget with afterschool care above budget
- Several operational expenses were higher than budgeted: our costs for supplies, utilities, and repair services were exposed to some of the same market increases we all are experiencing in our personal lives.

Kasco's construction of the Assisi Center is nearly complete with the total cost of the project standing at \$7.58 million. After several permitting delays at the beginning of the project, the Parish successfully cleared several hurdles along the two-year construction process. Unfortunately, the back end of the project is showing no immunity to its own challenges: the late delivery of the elevator and partition door system have added six months of delay. As of this report, we are working to gain city approval to make another expansion to our storm water detention system, pave the front parking lot, and obtain at least a temporary Certificate of Occupancy to accommodate our busy Fall schedule. Everyone's prayers, patience and support have been greatly appreciated. We are almost there!

The Statement of Financial Position (SFP) above summarizes how the assets owned by the Parish and the liabilities owed changed during the fiscal year. A little over \$252 thousand of long-term savings was used to offset the combined impact of the reduction in income and increase in expense this year. The decrease in ETF assets was less severe than in the previous year as the investment market continues to improve. The SFP also shows assets and liabilities dedicated to the Assisi Center construction project broken out separately from the rest of the Parish: there is a local checking account dedicated to the payment of construction costs which is replenished from two Parish savings accounts held at the Diocese. By the end of the fiscal year, a little over \$1.48 million is available to cover approximately \$1.00 million in additional expenses at the beginning of the new fiscal year to finish the project.

Witness to Hope pledges continued to be paid off last year, however, the Catholic Foundation reported that approximately \$350 thousand in pledges would not be paid by the respective donors. Thank you to those that completed their pledges and thank you to those that were inspired to make an additional—or first time—donation to the Assisi Center project. Any additional donations will be used to outfit the kitchen and other furnishings that were not part of the original project budget. It is not too late to be involved!

Respecting LIFE The beatification of the Ulma family



On September 10th Josef and his wife, Wiktoria, and their seven children, including their unborn child, were declared Blessed by Papal Envoy, Cardinal Marcello Semeraro, in St. Dorothy

Church in Markowa, Poland (the town where the family lived). "Blessed" is the third of the four steps to sainthood. In the instance of the Ulma family, the beatification of an entire family marks an unprecedented event in the modern canonization process.

On March 24, 1944 during the height of World War II, the Ulmas were denounced and betrayed for secretly hiding eight Jewish neighbors and friends from the horrors of the Holocaust. Nazi forces stormed their home and Josef and the pregnant Wiktoria were executed with their children and the Jewish neighbors whom they had sheltered since 1942. (Vatican News)

Father Pawel Rytel-Andrianik of St. Dorothy Church noted that the tragedy represented a Jewish - Christian martyrdom, a senseless taking of innocent lives. The family was recognized by the State of Israel as "Righteous among the Nations".

"The Righteous Among the Nations, honored by Vad Vashem, are non-Jews who took great risks to save Jews during the Holocaust. Rescue took many forms and the Righteous came from different nations, religions, and walks of life. What they had in common was that they protected their neighbors at a time when hostility and indifference prevailed."

(Vad Vashem – the World Holocaust Remembrance Center)

As told in Luke (10:29-37), the Parable of the Good Samaritan was an example of reaching out beyond one's immediate family; beyond one's comfort zone. Likewise, Josef and Wiktoria and their family reached beyond their immediate family and saw those neighbors who were in need to be also a part of their family. As in Matthew 25:40 "Amen, I say to you, whatever you did for one of the least brothers of mine, you did for me."

In today's world when our neighbors (be they Jewish or Muslim or racial minorities or the homeless or migrants) are being threatened or dismissed,




