Today Jesus speaks of a king who is giving a wedding feast for his beloved - that's you and me - and this king sent out his servants to invite guests - that's you and me. See Matthew chapter 22. **Will you come to the feast?** Right now everything is ready and the banquet hall is soon to be filled with all the guests. **Will you serve Him, by going now to invite whomever you find along your way today, all the bad and good alike to this great feast?** Now? Today? ASAP? Yes! Now! ASAP! This is an urgent matter! We are called to encourage, right now, those other people in our lives to have faith, hope and mercy! Yes, the good and the bad alike!!

Long-Awaited Assisi Center Update! by Robert Kehn

Two years after the construction fences went up, the fences came down leaving a beautiful, well-built facility. Unfortunately, there are significant permitting hurdles at the end of the project just like there were at the beginning and these are holding up occupancy of the Assisi Center. More detail on that in a bit—first, here's a recap of summer activity:

- The **elevator** was installed and inspected finally in late August.
- The movable partition walls were installed after Labor Day to divide and subdivide the main hall. They are easy to handle and quite soundproof.
- In mid-September, a subcontractor trained us to use the **state-of-the-art audio**/



visual system, which will display on a large screen for the entire room to view or on smaller screens in the subdivided rooms.

- We received 250 **chairs** for the banquet hall and we have 28 five-foot round **tables** arriving this week.
- Internet service has been connected to the building and a new Toshiba copier was installed.
- We just ordered our <u>next phase</u> of **audio/visual equipment** and **performance lighting**.

In the works now are repairing the asphalt behind the building near Frieze Avenue, adding to the equipment/ accessories in the kitchen, and specifying office furniture.

We have applied to the City of Ann Arbor for temporary occupancy and there is a major obstacle from the Fire Marshall. It was determined that the condition of the front parking lot hinders access to the fire hydrant and the fire department's connection to the building. Therefore, the front parking lot is required to be paved before any occupancy can be granted. To complicate this, the City updated its requirements for storm water management and, before we pave, the City is requiring more storm water detention than what we put in place already with the large, fenced-in pond in front of the church. We have been working with the City engineers to approve our plan to expand the ponds on the east and west sides of the property to provide the necessary detention WITHOUT the installation of additional fencing. Once we have that approval, and as we resolve several smaller hurdles on our paving plan, the contractors we identified for all this work will be able to get started. We are hoping all this work can be completed while the weather allows so we can avoid canceling any additional events that could otherwise be held inside the Assisi Center.

To say this has been a frustrating process navigating these final hurdles is an understatement! It would have been great to provide the community with a more upbeat and forwardmoving update on the project but, unfortunately, we are somewhat stalled. Over the past three months, we had glimpses of hope from the City that we might be able to move the office staff and make limited use of the main hall while completing the remaining outside work. **Please accept my sincere gratitude for your continued patience and support as we work through this last, tedious phase.**
