All Saints and All Souls: Two Holy Days of Great Importance for the Church!

This week the Church celebrates two very different yet closely connected holy days. Both days speak to us of the hope of eternal life but in very different ways. We use the word "*Church*" in many ways: to describe the building we worship in, the official leadership within the community, our own particular parish or as a collective noun to describe the almost two billion Christians worldwide who profess Jesus Christ as Lord. But the Church is more than all these! As the Body of Christ, she is also made up of the heavenly host of angels and saints, the Holy Souls in purgatory and all the baptized.

This Wednesday we celebrate the <u>Solemnity of All Saints</u>- all those unknown faithful holy men and women who have gone before us "marked with the sign of faith" and who constitute for us a "great company of witnesses" spurring us on to victory and glory. Then on Thursday our attention turns to the <u>Holy Souls</u>- those men and women who, while guaranteed the reward of heaven, have yet to be purified in the merciful love of God and so become worthy of entering into God's holy presence.

Taken together these feasts deny the false idea that everyone will automatically be saved irrespective of how they have lived life. Instead, they reaffirm the core belief that while eternal life is a gift from God, our task in life is to become worthy of it. The <u>"final</u> judgment" that we profess in our Creed is a real one by which all will be asked to render an account of their lives before Christ, the Judge.

All Saints: The history of this feast is intimately bound up with the early Church, when many men and women freely lay down their lives for Christ and suffered great torment and death. Having lived lives of faith, they refused to allow the threat of death to separate them from Christ and his promise of the resurrection. Most remain unnamed, but their example and courage is still worthy of our imitation. Through the centuries, many unknown women and men have lived lives with the same fervor and courage. We all have known family and friends who have demonstrated this saintly character. While they may never be officially canonized, the Church sees them as worthy of celebration and imitation. These are the unknown saints that we celebrate on this day.

All Souls: Yet as we celebrate our unknown saints, the Church reminds us to guard against false presumptions of saintliness: simply because one has died, and we miss them or because one has died in old age or tragic circumstances do not automatically make one a saint. *Holiness alone is the requirement for saintliness*. As noted above, each one will be judged on the basis of their whole life. In our current world, sin is the great unspoken word. We know it when we see it but are often afraid to name it and claim it. Sadly, the reality is that many will die in their sins and never have the opportunity for true repentance. This is why the Church recommends regular Confession as part of the spiritual life. For those who seek to live real lives of faith and who unfortunately die in sin, all is not lost. *Our Catholic belief in purgatory stands as another expression of God's divine mercy*. While God will always respect our choices in life, he is also aware of our brokenness and our desire for union with him. The life spent struggling with a desire for God but sadly tarnished with sin is still worthy of his mercy. Such a one will find that mercy in the purgatorial and mercy-filled love of God. Yet as they undergo this love-filled purification they are in need of our prayers and acts of sacrifice. *Let us not forget them!*

As we celebrate the saints in glory and ask for their intercession, let us do our part during this month dedicated to the Holy Souls and remember in prayer and acts of self-sacrifice our beloved dead. Together may we all see God face to face and enjoy eternal life with Him.




