



Imagine you come to the Sunshine State for vacation. And you finally arrive at Siesta Key beach. You're out on the beach with your family and a storm approaches. The storm looks menacing so you begin to gather your belongings and head back to your car.

The next thing you know you are thrown to the ground. And you look over and your son is foaming at the mouth. Lightning just struck out of nowhere and hit your 14-year-old boy in the chest.

He has no pulse.

People rush over in the pouring rain to try and help. After many minutes of what seems like a futile attempt, an EMT manages to have revived your son. Soon, you are in Tampa at the Children's Hospital, and your son is tethered to a ventilator with every imaginable tube that there is, coming out of his body. There is no guarantee he will live. The doctor tells you that you are going to lose your son. Then, at some point your son whispers "I love you too" with a tube down his throat. It's a miracle! The journey begins.

This is what the family of young Jacob Brewer experienced that day on July 16<sup>th</sup>, 2020 at Siesta Key Beach Access #10. Visiting from Texas, they never could have imagined the outcome of that summer day in July.

Almost a year later the Brewer family have seen over 27 doctors from all over the world, have spent tens of thousands of dollars in their journey to save and rehab their boy.

As we know and believe, when tragedy first strikes, miracles large and small can manifest in many ways even when we don't realize it at first.

The miracle of Jacobs life, of his determination and drive to walk again, of his perseverance, of his family's unbounding love and care, the miracles of financial support from people all over the country, of the many prayers offered up from thousands of

strangers, all are miraculous manifestations that represent our love and care for one another.


These miracles have kept the Brewer family going. My commitment, to myself and the Brewer family, is to donate my time to raise awareness on beach safety—to remind people to enjoy beautiful beaches *but to be aware that lightning can strike from as far as 20 miles away from an approaching storm.*

I will be at Siesta Key Beach delivering handouts and reminders to beachgoers, on Friday July 16, in the morning (Saturday July 17<sup>th</sup> rain date) and to pay tribute to Jacob Brewer and his family.

Jacob and his family have a long road ahead, with possible new therapies to help them. Please keep Jacob and his mom Barbara, dad Jeremiah and sister Ashley in your thoughts and prayers.

## Prayer is Not a Last Resort



For centuries prayer has moved mountains, cleared obstacles, opened hearts, stilled anger, relieved sadness,

squelched hard feelings, brought things to light, changed outlooks, heralded forgiveness, made life



manageable, and refreshed souls. It is an act of trust and hope. *He who can do all things, hears every one.*



Dear Parishioners, over the past few weeks the US Bishops have been meeting to discuss a decades-old issue of how to address the reality of politicians professing to be “devout” Catholics, while actively supporting and promoting issues directly contrary to the teachings of the Gospel. It is a responsibility that every shepherd has, to care for their flock, both for the good of those who have publicly gone astray and for the scandal and confusion their actions cause. While some issues certainly allow for further discussion, the issue of the right to life for unborn children does not. A Christian cannot condone, much less promote, the ending of an innocent human life for any reason. These are of course not easy topics to address in the Church today, but so important to our understanding of sin, the Eucharist, and our hope for salvation. We want everyone to get to heaven! I found the following brief reflection, shared via social media by a Methodist pastor on the current issue, to be compelling and true to the spirit of the Gospel. It is a helpful perspective to be reminded of, especially coming from one of our Protestant brothers in Christ.

“There are few things more misunderstood by many Western Christians than the biblical teaching on church discipline. Many people seem to regard excommunication as a vindictive act, a kind of retribution executed in a spirit of anger. Couple that perspective with the West's full embrace of relativism, that there is no absolute truth and that whatever value system each individual creates is equally valid [then] church discipline seems cruel and unloving to many. While it's true that all Christians who come to the Lord's Table are


sinner saved by grace, it's also true the acts of confession and repentance which precede Holy Communion imply a willingness for transformation of actions, attitudes and values, enabled by the indwelling Holy Spirit.

Contrast that with the circumstances the Apostle Paul found in the Corinthian church. A man was living in flagrant immorality (1 Cor. 5 and 6) and yet the Corinthian church continued to embrace him as a "member in good standing" to their table fellowship/holy communion. Paul reacted by insisting the openly misbehaving member be instantly excommunicated, not as an act of vengeance, but 1) as an effort to redeem the misbehaving member and rescue him from eternal punishment and 2) to prevent the character and integrity of the church from being impugned by the pagan culture in which the church existed. Authentic expressions of Christ's church, represented by many Christian traditions, have sought to follow this practice through the centuries.

John Wesley was very seriously concerned that the people called "Methodists" would one day abandon church discipline and opined that Methodism would become nothing more than a "dead sect" should that happen. The bottom line is, church discipline is one of those many areas in which the cultural preferences and perspectives of the West are in open conflict with biblical teaching and Christian tradition. The current conversation vis-a-vis Roman Catholicism and the privileges and obligations of sacramental access are but the latest example of this conflict.”

## At the start of the American Revolution

in spring of 1775, most colonists were not looking for complete freedom for Britain, but mainly for representation, especially due to “taxation without representation”. Those who did desire complete independence for the colonies were considered to be radicals. It wasn’t long before the idea of complete independence was embraced by many more patriots [BREXIT in reverse] Thomas



Paine’s *Common Sense*, which was published in January of 1776, was a pamphlet that persuaded more and more patriots that America should be given complete independence from Britain.

The Continental

Congress met on June 7, 1776 in Philadelphia at the Pennsylvania State House, which is now commonly known as Independence Hall for this very reason. Richard Henry Lee, a Virginian congressman, was the first to call for the colonies’ independence by means of a declaration. Congress debated constantly on whether or not they should do so. In the meantime, five men—John Adams, Benjamin Franklin, Thomas Jefferson, Robert R. Livingston, and Roger Sherman were appointed to a committee to draft a resolution that declared the colonies’ independence. Thomas Jefferson penned the majority of the document with Benjamin Franklin, John Adams, and Thomas Jefferson drafting the declaration. A few weeks later on July 2, 1776, the Continental Congress voted on the

Declaration of Independence and the vote was nearly unanimous in favor because the delegates from New York who had originally abstained from voting, now voted in favor of independence. John Adams wrote to his wife, Abigail that July 2nd was a day to be celebrated “by succeeding Generations.” Believing that July 2nd should be *the* day for great celebrations, he later declined any invitation to a July 4th celebration. Both Adams and Thomas Jefferson died on the anniversary of our independence, July 4, 1836.

Two days later, the 4th of July, was when the declaration was formally adopted by Congress. Instead of July 2nd as John Adams had wished, the 4th was celebrated as the day America officially became an independent country. And despite the colonies becoming free in 1776, the war continued on until 1781, but officially ended in 1783.

Today in the United States, Independence Day is celebrated on July 4th, and the day is commonly called the Fourth of July. In 1941, it was made a federal holiday, but people had been celebrating it decades before. The reason Independence Day is celebrated on July 4th is because on that day in 1776, the Continental Congress adopted the Declaration of Independence, two days after voting in favor of the resolution.

## Inquiring Minds Want To Know

What is holy water and how do I explain the reason that it is placed at the entrances of churches to my non-Catholic friends?

Holy water is a *sacramental*; "Sacramentals do not confer the grace of the Holy Spirit in the way Sacrament do, but by the Church's prayer, they prepare us to receive grace and dispose us to cooperate with it." CCC 1670



Most Catholics do it without a conscious thought: step inside the church, dip the fingers lightly in the available holy water font and make the Sign of the Cross. It's a habit as automatic as shaking hands.

Holy water reminds us of our Baptism, which speaks volumes about our life of faith. We sign ourselves in the name of the Father, Son, and Holy Spirit in a simple gesture. Pair it with the holy water and it becomes one of the most powerful declarations of belief in all of Christianity.

Holy water is used in many ways while celebrating the sacraments. For example, at funerals, the body is sprinkled with holy water at the beginning of the funeral rite, and the marriage rings are blessed with holy water during the wedding ceremony.

Each time holy water is used, it is meant to be a reminder of the Baptismal sacrament, opening our hearts to grace and propelling us toward God.
