

Who Says Teenagers Are Not Interested in Religion Anymore?

Certainly not very many people at the all-male Jesuit High School of Tampa, Fla., where 22 students, including boys from every grade level, received the sacraments of initiation into the Catholic Church. The group included 14 students who were baptized after growing up with no religion, as well as eight students who were already baptized in other Christian communities who received first Reconciliation, Confirmation and First Eucharist.

Taking A Closer Look at This Weeks Readings

The **first reading** is taken from the Book of the Prophet Amos 7:12-15. When he foretold the murder of Jeroboam and the exile of Israel, Amos was denounced by Amaziah the priest in charge of the sanctuary of Bethel, and was expelled from Israel.

The **second reading** is from the Letter of St. Paul to the Ephesians 1:3-14. This letter was written from Rome to remind St. Paul's converts to continue to be faithful to the teaching he had given them while in Ephesus.

The **Gospel** is from St. Mark 6:7-13. That Christ the Son of God could have spread His Gospel of peace and love, His message of eternal salvation, to the whole world without human help need not be proved. He could, for instance, have written the Gospel in the sky over each country in its own language. He could have gone to every part of the earth, after his resurrection, and taught his doctrine to all peoples, confirming His words with extraordinary miracles. Yet He chose the more human way of evangelizing men—he sent His fellowmen to bring others the message.

Thinking About This Gospel Reading

"He summoned the Twelve and began to send them out two-by-two." This Sunday we read the first sending of the Apostles to preach, teach, and heal. For many of us, it can be easy to think we "just don't have enough" to be disciples and evangelists ourselves. We don't have enough education and training. We don't have enough experience talking to people about Jesus. We don't pray enough. We don't have enough faith.

If you look at the Apostles in today's Gospel reading, they didn't have much either. "No food, no sack, no money in their belts." They didn't plan out their itinerary or book their lodging in advance. From what we know of the Apostles, they were not the religiously trained and educated ones. They were

fisherman, tax collectors, and political activists.

Jesus has chosen each one of us to send as well. As you take stock of your own talents, consider how they might be offered as a gift to others. Sharing the Good News of the Gospel may seem like a daunting task, if you look at it as a task. But if your heart is full of love of the Lord as the apostles were, you already have more than enough.

Come, Holy Spirit, fill the hearts of your faithful and enkindle in them the fire of your love. Send forth your Spirit and they shall be created and you shall renew the face of the earth. Amen

Come and See

Jesus invited the Apostles on a journey that inspired them and changed their understanding of everything. Before I invite you on a similar journey, let me tell you about something that has been part of the Church since the beginning. Over the millennia, it has taken many forms. At first it was a closely held secret and took place underground. In those early days, a great deal of caution surrounded the gatherings of the new followers of Christ as they came together to share His teachings and His love for them, because they were in fear of being discovered and put to death.

In the intervening years, it was the purview of the clergy to teach the faith, many times one-on-one. ***Since Vatican II in the mid-sixties, the process has become a focus of learning and evangelization for the whole Church.*** It is a transformative process that most people think about as the way in which people enter the Catholic Church, and it is, *but it is much, much more.* In the last several years those attending RCIA (the Rite of Christian Initiation of Adults) included, not only those inquiring about our faith, but also *people in our parish who want to learn about the faith and discover or rediscover God's powerful love for them.* Every life-long Catholic who has attended will tell you they have not only learned many things, but also deepened their relationship with Christ.

If you have been looking for meaning in your faith journey or a new or renewed understanding of our Catholic faith, **Come and See.**



Lightning Safety

There is no safe place outside when thunderstorms are in the area. *If you hear thunder, you are likely within striking distance of the storm.*



Remember, “*When Thunder Roars, Go Indoors!*” Too many people wait

far too long to get to a safe place when thunderstorms approach. Unfortunately, these delayed actions lead to many of the lightning deaths and injuries in the U.S.

The first and most important thing to remember is that if you can hear thunder, you are within striking distance of lightning. Take shelter immediately, preferably in a house or all-metal automobile (not convertible top).

Outdoor Precautions

If caught outside far from a safe shelter, stay away from tall objects, such as trees, poles, wires and fences. Take shelter in a low lying area.

If you are in your car during lightning, do not park under tall objects that could topple, and do not get out if there are downed power lines nearby. If you are caught outside, don’t stand near tall objects or anything made of metal, and avoid open water.

Remember, there is no safe place outdoors during a thunderstorm. Once in a safe location, remain there for 30 minutes after the last rumble of thunder is heard before resuming your outdoor activities.

People who have been struck by lightning do not carry an electrical charge and can be safely handled, but victims may be suffering from burns or shock and should receive medical attention

immediately. If you come across someone who has been struck, call for medical assistance and, if breathing has stopped, administer cardio-pulmonary resuscitation (CPR).

Indoor Precautions

Indoors, stay away from electrical appliances and equipment, doors, windows, fireplaces, and anything else that will conduct electricity, such as sinks, tubs and showers. Avoid using a telephone that is connected to a landline or touching devices that are plugged in for charging.

Inquiring Minds Want To Know

I have seen the title of Vicar General and Chancellor used in our Catholic newspaper. Who are they and what do they do?

A bishop, in charge of a diocese, appoints people to positions to help with its administration. Two of those positions are the vicar general and the chancellor. Both play a role in the life of a diocese. A chancellor is the archivist of a diocese charged with task of keeping the records of the diocese. Often a bishop may add other responsibilities, and the chancellor may end up being like the executive director of the diocesan office. The chancellor does not need to be a priest.

The vicar general is a priest, appointed by the bishop and acts in the name of the bishop in administering the diocese. He has an advanced degree in canon law or theology. He also has executive authority within the diocese. This means that he is involved in the day-to-day pastoral and temporal administration of the diocese. Canon law does not allow a bishop to appoint a relative to the position, nor the priest in charge of the Sacrament of Penance. In both cases, the purpose of the law is to avoid conflicts of interest.

What is Canon Law? Canon Law is comprised of the rules and regulations concerning ecclesiastical (church) matters. The Canon was developed between 1100 and 1500 A.D. and is used by the Catholic Church in reference to personal morality, status and powers of the clergy, administration of the sacraments, and church, and personal discipline.
