Celebrating the Month of The Blessed Mother

DID YOU KNOW

Along with the cross and the sacred holy water fonts, the small beads that makeup Rosary beads are one of the most familiar and recognized symbols of Catholicism.

According to Catholic tradition, the rosary was instituted by the Blessed Virgin Mary herself.

In the 13th century, she is said to have appeared to St. Dominic (founder of the Dominicans), given him a rosary, and asked that Christians pray the Hail Mary, Our Father and Glory Be prayers

The first half of the Hail Mary is from Scripture: The Angel Gabriel's greeting to the Virgin Mary when God let her know of her unique place in the history of human salvation. The second half is the church's response, our petition to Mary as Mother of God. We acknowledge our need for her help for our salvation now, and we ask in particular for this help at the moment of our death. So many private apparitions of the Blessed Virgin over the centuries have given us messages about this help, and it is a great comfort to believe that Mary will be there when the soul, the source of life for our body, struggles toward a different form of living. Mothers give birth; Mary will be there, no matter when or how death comes to each of us.

As a prayer for peace, the Rosary is also, and always has been, a prayer of and for the family. At one time this prayer was particularly dear to Christian families, and it certainly brought them closer together. It is important not to lose this precious inheritance. We need to return to the practice of family prayer and prayer for families, continuing to use the Rosary.

The family that prays together stays together. The Holy Rosary, by age-old tradition, has shown itself particularly effective as a prayer which brings the family together. Individual family members, in turning their eyes towards Jesus, also regain the ability to look one another in the eye, to communicate, to show solidarity, to forgive one another and to see their covenant of love renewed in the Spirit of God.

The letter to the Hebrews in our Liturgy of the Word and the two different types of priesthood

On these Sundays, the second reading is being taken from the Letter to the Hebrews. Please allow me to share some information about this epistle. In the New Testament we find four different styles of sacred literature, 'Legal' books, like the four gospels, 'Wisdom' books like the epistles, 'Historical' book, like the Acts of the Apostles, and a book of Prophecy, Revelation.

The wisdom books are further divided by author (Paul, James, Peter, John, and Jude), and within each author by length with the longest appearing first. The author of Hebrews is unknown. A little bit more than 100 years ago, in 1914, the Pontifical Biblical Commission stated that it is not certain that St. Paul was the author for the Letter to the Hebrews, based mostly by the writing style and how the book opens and closes, very different from all the epistles of this apostle.

The basic teaching of the Letter to the Hebrews centers on showing the superiority of the Christian religion over Judaism. This argument develops in three stages:

- 1) Jesus Christ, the incarnate Son of God, is superior to the angels, although He became less than the angels to lead us by example.
- 2) Christ is superior to Moses.
- 3) Jesus, the Son of God, is the great high priest. His priesthood is of the order of Melchizedek, superior to the priesthood of Aaron, from whom the Levitical priesthood is derived.

What does this mean? Let's first explain who is this Melchizedek... We know very little of him through what is recorded in Holy Scripture. We may read in Genesis 14:17-18 that when Abraham returned from the war, Melchizedek, the king of righteousness, priest of God Most High, and king of Jerusalem, came forth to meet him with bread and wine".

The Aramaic translations and paraphrases of the Old Testament which came into use after the exile, almost six centuries before Christ, are called "targums" and are highly respected by Jewish faithful and scholars. These targums and other writings make it very clear that Jewish tradition identifies him as Noah's firstborn son, Shem. Melchizedek is his throne name (just as Francis is the throne name of Jorge Bergoglio).

How can this be? Noah lived many years before Abraham. After all, it was Noah and his descendants who repopulated the world after the flood and there are lots of people around when Abraham is living. Genesis 11:10-26 traces the genealogy of Abraham (or Abram as he was known before God changed his name) from Shem, Noah's firstborn son. From this passage, if we do the math, we find that Shem lived for six hundred years; and in fact, outlived Abraham, who himself lived to be 175, by 35 years. Did people really live that long back then? We don't know, but the sacred author certainly wants us to be able to see the connection between Shem Melchizedek and Abraham.

In Genesis 9:1, 9 Noah is blessed by God and in Genesis 9:26 Shem is blessed by Noah. The next mention of the blessing is in Genesis 14:19 where Abram is blessed by Melchizedek. Later, Isaac is blessed and then Isaac passes the blessing on to Jacob instead of Esau, as he had intended. When he finds that he has been deceived, Isaac tells Esau that the blessing cannot be taken back and describes the effect of this priestly ordination "I have already appointed him your master, and I have assigned to him all his kinsmen as his slaves". This is the priesthood of the order of Melchizedek, the priesthood of the family.

The first reading passage says,
«Every high priest is taken from among men and made their representative before God, to offer gifts and sacrifices for sins...»

According to Leviticus, this is the duty of the high priest. Jesus, as high priest, makes these offerings in heaven on our behalf. The Day of Atonement (Yom Kippur) rite is the Old Testament rite for the sins of the people, not individual sin.

Toward the end of this first reading we find,
«...In the same way, it was not Christ who glorified himself in becoming high priest, but rather the one who said to him: "You are my son; this day I have begotten you"; just as he says in another place: "You are a priest forever according to the order of Melchizedek."»

Unlike Levitical priests, who began their apprenticeship at age 25, were ordained at age 30, and were required to retire at age 50, Shem-Melchizedek kept the blessing for over 400 years before passing it on to Abraham. Jesus is not a Levitical (Aaronite) high priest but a pre-golden calf high priest (first-born son) through His Father's blessing; just like Melchizedek. He does not have to prove His genealogy and is not subject to a time limit on the exercise of His priesthood.

This is important information to understand that the priests in the Catholic Church are not priests from a Levitical standpoint as some Protestants say, but from the Melchizedek tradition... they are ordained priests until they die, not for a limited time, as it happens with the pastors in those other denominations.



There are also some small mosaic tiles, likes the ones that wrap the steps to the altar. **All tiles will be sold for \$1 per tile.**



Tax Free Contribution Information

If you are over 70 ½ and have an IRA or similar retirement account you may be required to take annual distributions prescribed by the IRS. These distributions are usually taxed at your ordinary income tax rate.

A new law was passed on 12/15/2015 which may allow you to contribute any part of your IRA including these required distributions to St. Mark TAX FREE!

Example: If you contribute \$5000 from your IRA to St. Mark and are in a 20% tax bracket, the church receives the \$5000 and you may save \$1000 in taxes.

A WIN-WIN for both the church and the parishioner!

If your tax advisor agrees and you want to contribute from your 2021 required annual distribution or even from your current IRA,

instruct your IRA custodian to make the check out to: St. Mark the Evangelist Catholic Church.

They can either send it to you or directly to the church.


