


## COME CELEBRATE OUR SEMINARIAN

## POPE FRANCIS PROCLAIMS "YEAR OF ST. JOSEPH" (DECEMBER 8, 2020 – DECEMBER 8, 2021)

### The Year of ST. JOSEPH



*Mirror of Patience*

On December 8, 2021, Pope Francis announced that the upcoming year would be dedicated to Saint Joseph, celebrating the 150th anniversary of the proclamation of Saint Joseph as Patron of the Universal Church. The Holy Father said the aim of our reflection on Saint Joseph this year is "to increase our love for this great saint, to encourage us to implore his intercession and to imitate his virtues and his zeal". **The virtue for the month of August is "Joseph, Mirror of Patience"**. Patience is willingness to suffer. A patient is one who suffers a malady not by choice whereas a patient man is one who suffers volitionally rather than relinquish the vocation given him. Joseph was patient because of his love. He was willing to suffer anything, even the loss of Our Lady and the Divine Child by being the first to die.



Moses and the people were in the desert, but what was he going to do with them? They had to be fed, and feeding two or three million people requires a lot of food. According to the Quartermaster General in the Army, it is reported that Moses would have to have had 1,500 tons of food each day. Do you know that to bring that much food each day, two freight trains, each at least a mile long, would be required.

Besides, you must remember they were out in the desert, so they would have to have firewood to use in cooking the food. This would take 4,000 tons of wood and a few more freight trains, each a mile long, just for one day.

And just think, they were forty years in transit. And, Oh Yes! They would have to have water. If they only had enough to drink and wash a few dishes, it would take 11,000,000 gallons each day and a freight train with tank cars, 1,800 miles long, just to bring water.

And then another thing! They had to get across the Red Sea at night. Now, if they went on a narrow path, double file, the line would be 800 miles long and would require 35 days and nights to get through. So there had to be a space in the Red Sea, three miles wide so that they could walk 5,000 abreast to get over in one night.

And then, there is another problem . . . each time they camped at the end of the day, a campground two-thirds the size of the state of Rhode Island was required, or a total of 750 square miles long . . . think of it! This much space for camping.

Do you think Moses figured all this out before he left Egypt? I think not! You see, Moses believed in God. God took care of these things for him. Now do you think God has any problem taking care of all your needs? I asked the Lord to bless you as I prayed for you today. To guide you and protect you as you go along your way . . . His love is always with you, His promises are true, and when we give Him all our cares, you know He will see us through.

So, when the road you are traveling on seems difficult at best, just remember I am praying and God will do the rest.







**WE'RE PART STONE, PART ANGEL**

*A human being, says St. Gregory the Great, is in a way a representation of the whole universe. We have something in common with everything God created, from rocks to angels.*

Everything that exists falls into one of these classes:

1. It exists, but does not live.
2. It exists and lives, but does not feel.
3. It exists and lives and feels, but does not understand or choose.
4. It exists and lives and feels and understands and chooses.

Stones exist, but they do not live.

Trees both exist and live, but do not feel: we call the greenery the: "life" of plants and trees, as Paul declares: "You foolish man! What you sow does not come to life until it dies" (1 Cor. 15:36).

Animals exist and live and feel, but they do not understand.

Angels exist and live and feel, and they have knowledge by understanding.

But we have in common with stones to exist, with trees to live, with animals to feel, with angels to understand. So a human being is rightly called a "universe," because in a way the whole universe is contained within us.

Saint Joseph found out that the woman betrothed to him had conceived a child. Joseph, "since he was a righteous man, yet unwilling to expose her to shame, decided to divorce her quietly" (Matthew 1:19). Over the centuries, biblical scholars have given many explanations for Joseph's decision to end his relationship with Mary. Some suggest he was suspicious of infidelity. Others think he was so confused and overwhelmed that exiting the scene seemed the best course of action. Others conclude that Joseph believed from the beginning that the child was conceived by the power of the Holy Spirit and felt unworthy to be so close to God's presence and participate so intimately in God's plan of salvation. Thankfully, Joseph was willing to reconsider his panicked judgement and was open to changing his decision. He shows us how to let go of our stubbornness and be open to God's unexpected work in our lives.

## THEMES FROM CATHOLIC SOCIAL TEACHING

The Church's social teaching is a rich treasure of wisdom about building a just society and living lives of holiness amidst the challenges of modern society. Modern Catholic social teaching has been articulated through a tradition of papal, conciliar, and episcopal documents. The depth and richness of this tradition can be understood best through a direct reading of these documents. In these brief reflections, we highlight several of the key themes that are at the heart of our Catholic social tradition.

## LIFE AND DIGNITY OF THE HUMAN PERSON

The Catholic Church proclaims that human life is sacred and that the dignity of the human person is the foundation of a moral vision for society. This belief is the foundation of all the principles of our social teaching. In our society, human life is under direct attack from abortion and euthanasia. Human life is threatened by cloning, embryonic stem cell research, and the use of the death penalty. The intentional targeting of civilians in war or terrorist attacks is always wrong. Catholic teaching calls on us to work to avoid war. Nations must protect the right to life by finding effective ways to prevent conflicts and resolve them by peaceful means. We believe that every person is precious, that people are more important than things, and that the measure of every institution is whether it threatens or enhances the life and dignity of the human person.

## CALL TO FAMILY, COMMUNITY AND PARTICIPATION

The person is not only sacred but also social. How we organize our society—in economics and politics, in law and policy—directly affects human dignity and the capacity of individuals to grow in community. Marriage and family are the central social institutions that must be supported and strengthened, not undermined. We believe people have a right and a duty to participate in society, seeking together the common good and well-being of all, especially the poor and vulnerable.

## RIGHTS AND RESPONSIBILITIES

The Catholic tradition teaches that human dignity can be protected and a healthy community can be achieved only if human rights are protected and responsibilities are met.

"People are often unreasonable and self-centered. Forgive them anyway. If you are kind, people may accuse you of ulterior motives. Be kind anyway. If you are honest, people may cheat you. Be honest anyway. If you find happiness, people maybe jealous. Be happy anyway. The good you do today maybe forgotten tomorrow. Do good anyway. Give the world the best you have and it may never be enough. Give your best anyway. For you see, in the end, it is between you and God. It was never between you and them anyway."

- Mother Teresa

Therefore, every person has a fundamental right to life and a right to those things required for human decency. Corresponding to these rights are duties and responsibilities—to one another, to our families, and to the larger society.

## OPTION FOR THE POOR AND VULNERABLE

A basic moral test is how our most vulnerable members are faring. In a society marred by deepening divisions between rich and poor, our tradition recalls the story of the Last Judgment (Mt 25:31-46) and instructs us to put the needs of the poor and vulnerable first.

## THE DIGNITY OF WORK AND THE RIGHTS OF WORKERS

The economy must serve people, not the other way around. Work is more than a way to make a living; it is a form of continuing participation in God's creation. If the dignity of work is to be protected, then the basic rights of workers must be respected—the right to productive work, to decent and fair wages, to the organization and joining of unions, to private property, and to economic initiative.

## SOLIDARITY

We are one human family whatever our national, racial, ethnic, economic, and ideological differences. We are our brothers' and sisters' keepers, wherever they may be. Loving our neighbor has global dimensions in a shrinking world. At the core of the virtue of solidarity is the pursuit of justice and peace. Blessed Pope Paul VI taught that "if you want peace, work for justice." The Gospel calls us to be peacemakers. Our love for all our sisters and brothers

## CARE FOR GOD'S CREATION

We show our respect for the Creator by our stewardship of creation. Care for the earth is not just an Earth Day slogan, it is a requirement of our faith. We are called to protect people and the planet, living our faith in relationship will all of God's creation. This environmental challenge has fundamental moral and ethical dimensions that cannot be ignored.




