# GO DEEPER

## Into Today's Gospel

You are at the eye doctor and it's time for the peripheral vision test. You know the one. It's where you put your head up to a contraption and have to click a switch every time you see a squiggly line. If you don't concentrate and maintain optimal focus, you will miss them and skew the outcome of the test. You can easily find yourself with a diagnosis that really isn't accurate! Concentration and focus are key to succeeding with this evaluation. They are also key to developing a healthy, vibrant spiritual life. If we do not bring our full consciousness to the task, concentrate with all our might, be watchful and vigilant, we are not going to see God's loving presence flashing before our eyes!

That's why we need Advent. Let's face it. We can easily get distracted, focus on nonessential and superficial things and lose touch with what really matters. Our attentions wander. We daydream and even become a bit overwhelmed and tired. All of the stresses and demands of life consume us and we find ourselves constantly trying to play catch up rather than relishing the moment of the now. "Now" moments are so fleeting. They flash before us like those squiggly lines on a screen. Present moments go as quickly as they come but it is important to discover them and rest in them as often as we can. Though gone in a flash, these now moments of encounter with God teach powerful lessons and offer a grounding in truth that can be found nowhere else. It's the grace of Advent to become watchful and attentive because we are never sure when God will surprise us.

God loves surprises and love thrives on them! God's now moments of surprises come as tender instants of intimate connection where I find profound peace, experience joy, and rest in love. These are Advent times reflective of the now moments when Christ first was born, when God surprises us during every time we care to watch and when the great surprise of Christ's second coming dawns upon us all. But, to discover the grandeur and experience the awe of these now times, we have to be ready. We have to want to be there. We have to believe. And, we have to have the desire to soak in as much as we can in the time we have before us.

Advent is a word with Latin roots. It means "approach" or "coming."

But what is Advent, really? Advent is the beginning of the new liturgical year for the Roman Catholic Church.

On the first Sunday of Advent, which begins on November 29th this year, the Church celebrates its own kind of New Year's Day.

Sometimes people mistakenly think that Advent is part of the Christmas celebration. But actually, Advent is a time of preparation all its own.

Christmas doesn't begin until the first Mass is celebrated on Christmas Eve — only then do we enter the season of Christmas.

Advent is a time to prepare our souls for the coming of the Lord. This season is very similar to Lent, so its nickname is the "Little Lent."

In our current culture, we are tempted to skip over the penitential aspects of Advent and focus on the joy of Christmas.

This is a great tragedy.

Focusing on the joy alone denies a crucially important truth:  
that the Christ Child is Our Lord and Savior,  
Who will suffer and die for our salvation.

Advent is a great way to be focused on the coming of the Christ Child rather than on materialistic desires.

# Saint Agnes of Assisi

1197 - November 16, 1253



Born Caterina Offreducia, Agnes was the younger sister of Saint Clare, and her first follower. When Caterina left home two weeks after Clare's departure, their family attempted to bring her back by force. They tried to drag her out of the monastery, but her body suddenly became so heavy that several knights could not budge it. Her uncle Monaldo tried to strike her but was temporarily paralyzed. The knights then left Caterina and Clare in peace. Saint Francis himself gave Clare's sister the name Agnes, because she was gentle like a young lamb.

Agnes matched her sister in devotion to prayer and in willingness to endure the strict penances that characterized the Poor Ladies' lives at San Damiano. In 1221, a group of Benedictine nuns in Monticelli near Florence asked to become Poor Ladies. Saint Clare sent Agnes to become abbess of that monastery. Agnes soon wrote a rather sad letter about how much she missed Clare and the other nuns at San Damiano. After establishing other monasteries of Poor Ladies in northern Italy, Agnes was recalled to San Damiano in 1253, as Clare lay dying.

Agnes died three months after Clare, and was canonized in 1753.

**Reflection:** God must love irony; the world is so full of it. In 1212, many in Assisi surely felt that Clare and Agnes were wasting their lives and were turning their backs on the world. In reality, their lives were tremendously life-giving, and the world has been enriched by the example of these poor contemplatives.

## ***In the Unexpected***

“What could happen next?” How many times have you asked yourself that question in the past year? Though we most often use that expression when things don’t seem to be going our way, this year it has been an expression of the constant changes to our world which the COVID-19 pandemic has wrought. But we might use the same expression to explain our feelings of being overwhelmed by blessings

and good things, when the stars seem to align just right.

No matter what, we can say with certainty that tomorrow will not go exactly as we envisioned. Our lives are influenced by so many factors and the world around us is increasingly complex. Rather than be surprised by the unexpected, maybe we should expect the unexpected.

Living in this manner causes us to cherish more deeply the gifts we have been given. It helps us to live in the present and become mindful of those around us. Our relationships deepen. Our sense of responsibility builds. Our stewardship way of life finds new meaning and purpose.

This Advent will not be the same experience as last Advent. It remains to be seen what the coming days and weeks have in store for each of us. However, no matter what happens, Jesus Christ is there to welcome us to the unexpected. He will celebrate with us in joy and he will even feel our pain. You can count on the unexpected, but you can also count on Him to be there with you. He is now and forever, Emmanuel, “God with us.” He is the expected in all things unexpected.

One of our parishioners, who wishes to remain anonymous, wrote this letter to a non-Catholic family after giving them several **sacramentals** to help them in their great suffering. We thought it was written so well that it might help our parishioners better understand what the Church teaches about the use of sacramentals.



Dear Family,

We are praying for you and your family for strength and courage as you go through this difficult time.

The items we gave you are called *sacramentals*. Before the advent of cell phones almost everyone carried a picture of their loved ones in their wallet. Those photos were a source of comfort in loneliness and an aide in recreating a connection of love between the loved ones in the photographs and the "owner" of the photo. *Sacramentals* work in a similar way.

The *Sacred Heart of Jesus medal*, a small bottle of *holy water* from Lourdes, France, and a second class *relic* of St. Gerard Majella, the patron saint of children's illness and expectant mothers, are dear to us, and I want you to know that they are given with the intent that they will be a help to you in your journey.

The *Sacred Heart medal* has a picture of Jesus' heart burning with love for us. It is meant to remind us when we look at it how much Jesus truly loves us and how much he is on fire with love for us. When things are difficult may this medal comfort you and remind you how much you mean to Jesus. The reverse side of the medal shows a picture of Mary holding the Christ Child.

*Holy water* is a reminder of the waters of baptism that we receive when we become Christians. The tiny bottle of holy water is from The Shrine of Our Lady of Lourdes, France. It is the site where The Virgin Mary appeared in 1858 to a young girl named Bernadette Soubirous. Throughout the years millions of people have come to this site seeking comfort and a greater closeness with Jesus and His mother. Many have received miraculous physical healing and millions have received emotional and spiritual healing. I would recommend that you take a small amount of this water and make the sign of the cross daily. All grace we receive from Jesus is a gift and it is right to ask for his blessing (Matt 7:7).

Saints are people who have shown extraordinary love for Jesus. They have gone before us and now stand before Our Lord and beg particular blessings for the faithful on earth. *Relics* are special reminders of those saints whose lives and characteristics we admire and hope to emulate.

The *relic of St. Gerard* (the small circular piece of cloth in the oblong medal) makes me think of a small pocket knife given to me by my father. The knife is of little monetary value, but it belonged to my Dad who always carried it in his pocket. I cherish it because it reminds me of the love and care that my father gave to me while he was here with us. My Dad has gone on to his reward in heaven but I still love him, think of him often, and even ask him to help me be a good Christian. The pocket knife is a small reminder of him. Saint Gerard and the other Saints in heaven can help us on our journey and can intercede for us with Jesus. The more people we have asking Jesus for help, the better. I ask my friends to pray for me when I'm in need. St. Gerard is one of my friends. I hope that he will intercede for you.

These sacramentals are not magic and they do not confer any grace in and of themselves. It is our faith in Jesus that matters. This makes me think of the story of the woman with a flow of blood for 12 years (Matt 9:20-22). The woman's faith in Jesus saved her and healed her. She touched the tassel of his cloak — an object like a sacramental — and she was healed. Did she have to touch Jesus' cloak? Wouldn't Jesus have known her needs? The touching of Jesus' cloak was a manifestation of the woman's faith which of course is the source of her healing.

All these *sacramentals* are tangible objects meant to bring us closer to Jesus. Jesus isn't with us now in the same way, as a man walking among us, and we can't touch his cloak, but we can do other things that manifest our faith.

We pray that you will continue to experience God's grace and receive all the miracles that you need.

My Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

As we approach the season of Thanksgiving, my prayer is that the strength of the Holy Spirit will renew and deepen our Faith in Jesus Christ. Particularly, as together we face the difficult challenges that the Coronavirus has brought, I call upon the intercession of Our Blessed Mother for the safety and health of you and your family.

It may be recalled that in October of 2018, I shared with you that the then-Attorney General of Florida, Pam Bondi, ordered an investigation of how the seven Dioceses in Florida have handled allegations of misconduct involving minors by clergy. With the full cooperation of the Diocese of Venice, the investigation was thoroughly conducted through the Office of the Statewide Prosecutor, who requested specific clergy files. As a result, a list of priests who had been accused of a substantiated allegation of a sexual offense against minors has been issued by the Statewide Prosecutor. This listing of priests accused of misconduct in Florida is the final action to be taken and the State investigation has been concluded.

Included on the State's list are nine priests who were incardinated in the Diocese of Venice against whom substantiated allegations have been identified in the investigation. None of the priests listed presently have faculties (allowed to minister) in the Diocese. Some have died, some have been laicized or dismissed from clerical state, and others have had their priestly faculties permanently removed. When the investigation was announced in 2018, it was not precipitated by any new allegation of abuse. The investigation involved historic cases.

As your Bishop, I wish to express compassion and my continual prayer for all victims of child sexual abuse and that each receive God's healing and peace. The harm done is grave. On behalf of the Church, I ask forgiveness of those who have been harmed by Clergy or others involved with the Church. The Diocese remains committed to the Policy for the Protection of Children and I am pleased that the Statewide Prosecutor's report recognizes that the Diocese has followed its policies.

The Statewide Prosecutor's Report is a sad reminder of the harm done in the past to minors by those who had been ordained to serve the Church and care for the Faithful. Be reassured that the investigation did not uncover previously unknown cases in the Diocese of Venice. The commitment the Diocese made in accord with the USCCB *Charter for the Protection of Children and Young People* has proven effective and helpful in protecting our children, young people and vulnerable adults.

This moment also allows for me to once again encourage all who have been abused to report it to Department of Children and Families and if it involves clergy of the Diocese of Venice, to contact also the Diocesan Victim's Assistance Coordinator. The Diocese takes every report of abuse seriously and responds promptly.

Humbly, I invite all to continue to pray for the victims of child sexual abuse. Pray also for the Church's efforts to protect our children and foster a safe environment for all.

May Almighty God bless you and your family, through Christ our Lord.
