# GO DEEPER

## Into Today's Gospel

People knew over a year in advance that the Pope was coming for a visit to America and the preparations began. Security, space limitations and requirements, protocols, crowd management, itineraries, invitations, regulations, and so much more was necessary to pull this event off effectively. It's not every day that we get a visit from such a prominent dignitary. Thought, effort, meticulous attention to detail and vision all are necessary to make this thing work. After all, he can't just show up in the ordinary and normal daily routines of life and catch people unprepared! Tickets have to be purchased, buses rented, hotel rooms reserved, and travel arrangements made early because it will be impossible to see him if we wait too long!

We do this kind of preparing not only for prominent religious figures but for political dignitaries, notable sports figures, people of fame, and even actors. If an individual intrigues us, we are going to want to do all we have to do to get a "good seat" in the house. Does Jesus Christ captivate this much of our attention? We are asked to prepare the way of the Lord and to do so not with frantic frenzy but patient enthusiasm. We do not have to stand on a street corner making profound announcements about God's coming or become overly zealous in our embrace of the Good News. Our task is quieter, more interior, captivating, and consuming. We are asked to change. We have to conduct our lives with holy devotion.

Is the cost of that ticket too much for you? Don't you want the "best seat" in the house? You don't want to miss Our Lord's arrival when he comes, do you? After all, if he comes while you are going about your daily routines without you even knowing, he may catch you off guard. Or, he may come in disguise looking like a beggar, a prisoner, migrant, refugee, or someone who is lost. Would you be ready to recognize him then? Preparing for the coming of Christ requires a change of mind, heart, and behavior. It is not adequate to simply do the things we always do. We want our lives to speak of the exciting news of Christ's coming and the joy that the Gospel brings. It has to do with our demeanor, values, priorities, choices, and how we structure daily routines. Of course, it involves sacrifice. All anticipations do! Are you excited, captivated, enthusiastic, and sitting on the edge of your seat eager to celebrate his coming among us at Christmas, and waiting for him to come again? If not, why not?

## Saint Juan Diego

1474 - May 30, 1548

Thousands of people gathered in the Basilica of Our Lady of Guadalupe July 31, 2002, for the canonization of Juan Diego, to whom the Blessed Mother appeared in the 16th century. Pope John Paul II celebrated the ceremony at which the poor Indian peasant became the Church's first saint indigenous to the Americas.

The Holy Father called the new saint "a simple, humble Indian" who accepted Christianity without giving up his identity as an Indian. "In praising the Indian Juan Diego,

I want to express to all of you the closeness of the Church and the pope, embracing you with love and encouraging you to overcome with hope the difficult times you are going through," John Paul said. Among the thousands present for the event were members of Mexico's 64 indigenous groups.

First called Cuauhtlatohuac ("The eagle who speaks"), Juan Diego's name is forever linked with Our Lady of Guadalupe because it was to him that she first appeared at Tepeyac hill on December 9, 1531. The most famous part of his story is told in connection with the Feast of Our Lady of Guadalupe on December 12. After the roses gathered in his tilma were transformed into the miraculous image of Our Lady, however, little more is said about Juan Diego.

In time he lived near the shrine constructed at Tepeyac, revered as a holy, unselfish, and compassionate catechist, who taught by word and especially by example.

During his 1990 pastoral visit to Mexico, Pope John Paul II confirmed the long-standing liturgical cult in honor of Juan Diego, beatifying him. Twelve years later the same pope proclaimed him a saint.

**Reflection:** God counted on Juan Diego to play a humble, yet huge role in bringing the Good News to the peoples of Mexico. Overcoming his own fear and the doubts of Bishop Juan de Zumarraga, Juan Diego cooperated with God's grace in showing his people that the Good News of Jesus is for everyone. Pope John Paul II used the occasion of Juan Diego's beatification to urge Mexican lay people to assume their responsibilities for passing on the Good News and witnessing to it.

My Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

As the Church celebrates the Solemnity of Christ the King and Advent approaches, please accept my pastoral greetings and concern for you, the good Faithful in the Diocese of Venice. My prayer is that the preparation for the Lord's coming in the Advent Season will enliven our hope in the promises of Christ.

Allow me to update you regarding Masses as the Covid-19 Pandemic continues to impact the Diocese and all of us. In my October 9, 2020 letter, it was said that the General Dispensation from the obligation to attend Sunday Mass would remain in effect until November 28, 2020, and perhaps longer. Considering the present circumstances of the virus spread, the General Dispensation is extended into the New Year and I will advise regarding its conclusion at a future date.

There are some optimistic signs and there are increasing numbers of the Faithful returning to Church for Sunday Mass. Also, there is greater weekday attendance. Please continue to make every reasonable effort to return to in-person worship if you are able. With gratitude, I acknowledge all who have returned and commend those who continue to join the live streaming of Mass due to vulnerabilities and those who care for them. Further, let us all keep in prayer our brothers and sisters who have had the virus and their families.

As Christmas and the New Year approach, it is crucial to maintain vigilance regarding safety precautions in Parishes. This will necessitate scaling back special Feast Day celebrations and holiday related events. Unfortunately, it cannot be as it was in the past. Particularly, I underscore the need for the wearing of masks, maintaining appropriate distances, as well as cleaning and sanitizing measures. Parishes have been encouraged to schedule more Masses for Christmas Eve and Christmas Day than is customary. Having additional Masses, perhaps at different times or in different locations (Parish hall or gymnasium), will safely accommodate the potential numbers of Faithful who may attend Mass for Christmas.

At this challenging time, let us be united in prayer as we journey through the Advent Season in preparation for the Birth of Our Lord and Savior. Be assured of my prayers for you and your family!

***Christian Chami, our resident seminarian this summer, sent us the following letter:***

### **Dear Parishioners of Saints Peter and Paul's:**

I hope that you are all doing well during this time of Co-vid, and that you are all staying safe. Also, I really hope y'all are enjoying the wonderful beach. I can only imagine that the weather is just starting to hit that ideal cushion between cool and hot, and that the days are just gorgeous! Here in Rome, we are about to enter the worst time of year, which is the rainy season which goes from November to January. So know that as the rain falls, all of you in beautiful, sunny Florida will be in my thoughts and prayers.



Overall, things are going well here in Rome. I just entered my third year of theology, meaning that I'm starting my second to last year of seminary. God-willing, next October I will be ordained a deacon at St. Peter's in Rome, and then start my last year of seminary before returning back to the Diocese to be ordained a priest for the Diocese of Venice. In Rome, we typically have to commute to school, while we are formed at the Seminary, which means I usually walk a minimum of 3 miles a day, unless I make a pastry run, then it's usually a minimum of 4 miles! I study at the Gregorian University, which was founded by St. Ignatius of Loyola, founder of the Jesuits. My university has also taught saints like Maximilian Kolbe and St. Paul VI just to name a few. I have the unique chance to have all my classes in Italian, but thankfully our exams can be done in English.

This year with Covid things are a little different. We currently moved to fully online for the time being. This has resulted in lots of free time. We realized that we save about 7 to 8 hours of walking a week. That's a whole business day! With that time, I've been able to read more, play more sports, and just get to know my brother seminarians better. Since Italy is in a partial lockdown, and some regions in full lockdown it has been a trying time for the people of Italy. Many are suffering due to very high unemployment and a lack of tourism. Please pray for the people in Italy and in the States who have no work.

My time here in Italy has taught me much about its people, culture, and also a lot about how the Church operates in most parts of the world. Further, I've been blessed to travel through Europe and walk in Mother Teresa's steps in Kolkata, India during my first summer overseas where we can't return to the States. I've learned that we are so lucky to be American. We live in a country that guarantees us rights that are not allowed to be overturned easily. We having amazing barbeque and sweets, but more importantly our people are caring and generous. We are freely educated, and live in a country which is safe. My time overseas has made me far more grateful for the diversity of our country, but especially for the gifts that we take for granted in America.

The Lord has gifted us a great country, whose roots are deeply religious, but individual. With that liberty that we've been given we are called to live freely and responsibly to also help those in need whether it's through tithing, feeding the hungry, or calling those who are lonely. I ask that you continue to live your faith strongly and in everything that you do! Know that you are all in my prayers, and that I do miss St. Peter and Paul. I also ask that you pray for me, and for my vocation as I approach ordination to the diaconate.

ease. We literally want the entire world to share in our jubilation.


