Go Deeper into Today's Gospel



A pregnant woman was walking in the store and met an old friend. Her friend exclaimed, “You are absolutely beaming!” The new life God placed in her womb radiated throughout her body. It was brightly visible on her face and in her eyes. Transformation and change usually

happen from the inside out. It is very rare that simply imposing structure from the outside does any good. Yes, it is true that routines and habits can change when things are done differently. But, for this change to last there has to be an interior renewal and metamorphosis as well. Simply regulating behavior and bringing someone into conformity with accepted protocols doesn't mean their heart and soul come with them.

Peter was a homeless man who lived in a very remote and rudimentary tent community. He was happy to make his daily trip to McDonald's and always welcomed a gift card or two so that he could buy some coffee and something to eat. A generous advocate worked to secure him an apartment in hopes of moving Peter out of his makeshift housing and into something safer. Peter finally got the grand tour of his new “digs,” received his own key, remarked how wonderful the place was, closed the door behind him when they left and never returned. He preferred his tent. No matter how much things changed on the outside, Peter was happy where he was. A poignant lesson was learned that day.

How is your Lent going? By now you ought to have a sense of whether you're really “into it” this year and something transformational is happening. For many, it's only the stuff on the outside that changes for a few weeks and then they return to business as usual. For others, there are some real inner changes happening that are deepening their relationships with God, others, self, and creation. If we are serious about moving to a new place and radiating with the presence of new life and joy, then we have to clear the way to listen for God's call. Then, there is God's request to change things up a bit and order our lives differently. After realizing we have been called and given a mission, we have to trust that this is where we need to be. And then, after all of this hard work we are asked to act. The fruit that is revealed will indicate whether our journey is authentic. The brilliance of conversion will begin to shine on our faces as we contemplate the One to whom we are asked to listen.





Servant of God Catherine de Hueck Doherty

Aug. 15, 1896 - Dec. 14, 1985



Catherine de Hueck Doherty had an enormously practical and loving spirituality that brought healing to many wounded and poor people. She was one of the great women of the twentieth century and yet when she died her bed was in an obscure log cabin and most people would never have heard of her.

Prophetic voice: Catherine Doherty was one of the prophetic voices of her age, one of those people God uses to keep His divine gospel perspective alive in the world. She herself would simply have said, 'I am a woman in love with God and the poor'.

Her life spanned most of the last century and she survived two world wars, the Russian revolution, the depression of the '30s, a broken marriage, the scandal of an all-too-human Church, the Second Vatican Council and founding a new community within that Church – to name but a few of the challenges.

Two strands of faith: Catherine was born in Ninji-Novgorod in Russia on 15 August 1896. It was an era when Christianity was strong in Russia – work, pilgrimages, culture – everything was saturated with the gospel. She was baptized, catechized and married all within the Orthodox Church.

But she also had an exposure to the Catholic Church in the form of her schooling in Egypt where her father, an aristocrat, had been posted by the government. In time it would lead to her being received as a Catholic in 1919 in England.

However, over a long lifetime she was able to integrate these two strands of the faith within her own spiritual journey – the 'two lungs' of faith – as Pope John Paul often spoke.

Love of the poor: Her parents had communicated to the young Catherine an extraordinary love for the poor. Her mother for instance had insisted that she get married in a poor village among poor people whom she served to express her great love for them. No family members attended. Often she accompanied her mother on her visits to the local poor and frequently she saw her father get up from the table and wait on beggars who came to the door for food. 'A love that is not incarnate is not real love,' she would say.

She was married at an early age to Boris de Hueck but by then, the Russian Christian culture was collapsing, a culture where the people had known the gospel in their own language for a thousand years and the very word for Sunday meant 'resurrection'. The couple got out with their lives and made their way to Canada. In reflection on the Russian experience she knew that injustice to the poor can destroy a whole Christian civilization: 'Wake up! Love the poor! Live the gospel or you will call down on yourselves the anger of God.'

Friendship House: Once in Canada she was joined in her vision by other young men and women and soon she opened Friendship House in the slums of Toronto and later one in Harlem. Her approach was simple: to live the life of the Holy

Family of Nazareth among the poor, serving meals and handing out clothes and support.

In the 1930s and '40s several more Friendship Houses followed and members of the black community too, were received with dignity. This was long before the civil rights movement of the 1960s. Dorothy Day, another great pioneer in this field, was among the few who supported and indeed understood what Catherine was trying to do.

Yet Catherine never saw her actions as 'social work'. Rather she was moved by the gospel truth, 'What you did to the least of my brethren you did for me.' For Catherine each person was Christ, to be treated with the greatest dignity. 'When I hear a knock on the door, I see a hand with a wound in it – literally.'

She had a lifelong passion to 'take Jesus off his cross – console him, bind up his wounds by caring for the poor, the suffering and the broken. She had an intense interior vision of Jesus continuing to hang on the cross with millions of people streaming by, completely unaware of his love for them.'

Journey into God: Why did she go to hide herself then in the backwoods of Canada for the last thirty years of her life? The answer brings us to another aspect of the intriguing life of this amazing woman. In 1943 she met Eddie Doherty -a journalist – and married him; her first marriage to Boris had received an ecclesiastical annulment.

With Eddie she went to Combermere in the rural area of Ontario. Here she was taken by the Lord on a journey into God, into herself, into the spiritual disease of the world. She tried to apply the charism of gospel truth not only to the sick and distorted situations of the day but to the entirety of human life. She taught how to reevangelize, 're-gospel' everything from its roots.

Gradually the community which grew around her applied her energies and wisdom to liturgical customs, family life, mission outreach and many more areas. The Madonna House community became in time a public association of the faithful under the local bishop.

This was the period when she was most fertile in terms of writing, and her produce amounted to over twenty-five books and 100,000 letters. She began to introduce Christians in the West to the richness of the Orthodox traditions. She was indeed a great *staretza* for the world – a Russian mother feeding her spiritual children with the bread of the gospel.

A beacon: She taught people how to live the gospel right where they were in their homes and offices and schools. Her classic work, *Poustinia* (Russian for 'desert') was a call to prayer and the 'desert' of the heart through prayer, solitude and fasting. Her vision and practical way of living the gospel in ordinary life became recognized as a remedy to the depersonalizing effects of modern society and technology.

Catherine died on Dec. 14, 1985 after a long illness, leaving behind a spiritual family of more than 200 members. She left to the Church which she loved passionately, a spiritual heritage which is indeed a beacon for the century which has just begun. Her cause for canonization has been introduced in the Catholic Church in 2000 and she has already been given the title 'servant of God'.

Dear parish family,

As your pastor, I am always encouraged by the warmth of the families of our parish community. I thank God for your many efforts that truly uphold the dignity of marriage and family life.

As you work hard to create safe havens for your children and spouse, the United States Conference of Catholic Bishops (USCCB) and I

wish to bring one particular issue to your attention. It's not easy to discuss, but it's important. That issue is pornography.

In November of 2016, the USCCB released a pastoral response to pornography, called *Create in Me a Clean Heart*. The intention of writing this document was to:

- offer healing and hope to those who have been wounded by pornography;
- articulate the Catholic Church's response to the pastoral crisis brought about by the production and use of pornography; and
- raise awareness of its pervasiveness and harms.

Why? Because pornography is hurting many people, including marriages and families, singles, priests and religious, and even children. It hurts the healthy process of vocational discernment for our young people.

Pornography use impacts the relationships of children with their parents, husbands with their wives (and vice versa), the pastor with his community, and most importantly, our relationship with our Lord.

In the formal statement, the USCCB speak directly to parents about being proactive about the issue of pornography in the life of the home with their children and together as a married couple ensure the home keeps its status as a safe haven for all. The Bishops state, "The use of pornography by anyone in the home deprives the home of its role as a safe haven and has negative effects throughout a family's life and across generations."


Next Sunday, March 7th, we will be celebrating the first annual **Safe Haven Sunday** with the theme “Equipping the Family, Safeguarding Children.” This awareness effort is meant to draw our attention as a community to the seriousness of the issues of pornography and to recommit ourselves to take steps to ensure our homes are safe havens for all.

In the back of the church, I will have free resources for you to assist with striving for healthy and holy marriages and families, including how to talk to your children about internet dangers. But you don’t have to wait. **You can begin learning now by joining The Safe Digital Family Challenge: A Digital Crash Course by texting SECURE to 66866 to receive seven days of emailed digital tips!**

When Sacrifice Becomes Mundane

It seems to happen every year, like clockwork: we drag a bit, as we enter into the second week of Lent. On Ash Wednesday, we feel a bit like soldiers banging our shields, rushing into battle. “We’re ready, God!” our hearts cry out. “Transform us through sacrifice! Your will be done!”

But by now, these Lenten resolutions are no longer novelties – they’ve joined the ranks of everyday inconveniences, which somehow are the hardest to bear. Because transformation, in real life, happens in inches, just as a battle is won slowly in the crash of one sword against another. It’s not always a dramatic thing, to the naked eye. It’s the perseverance in prayer despite weariness, or the continual denial of some pleasure even though there’s that nagging voice in our minds saying: go ahead, God doesn’t really mind.

It’s a week when we all need a shock to the system – and wouldn’t you know it, this Sunday God gives us a double-whammy of dramatic sacrificial scenes. We picture Abraham, who also cried “Ready!” when God called, never imagining what He would ask: the surrender of his long-awaited son. We see Christ himself transfigured, as God shows us what He is ready to give up for love of us.

We must remain committed, persevering daily in acknowledging that everything belongs to God. What we sacrifice, we simply give back to Him.

If God is for us, who can be against us? Can we still reply, “Ready!” when we hear the call of God?
