GO DEEPER into Today's Gospel



“Remain in my love,” and, “I call you friends,” are powerful words that are found in John’s Gospel. Most of us probably have them committed to memory or have at least heard them proclaimed dozens of times. They are words that can easily become trite and

quickly glossed over without fully pondering and digesting their profound beauty. When we take the time to immerse ourselves in them, they can radically change our lives and our relationships. They can open up new doors of adventure and hold countless possibilities for meaning. The essence of love and friendship are things that can easily be taken for granted. They have always been there and are a significant part of our lives. Many would say that they could not live without love and friendship, and they put a great deal of care into preserving, deepening and sustaining them. Love and friendship share a mutual relationship with each other that deserves more reflection.

Where does love come from? We can consider relationships that have not succeeded and conclude that they were somehow due to our “failures in love.” In doing so, we assume that human beings are the ones responsible for love, its success and also its failure. While our weakness, emotional

composition and sinfulness can easily impact our ability to love, its origin is not human. God is love. God is love's author and origin. When we love, it is God who loves in and through us. It is because of this divine closeness that Jesus is able to call us friends! It is not because of anything we have done but simply because of who we are. Realizing and contemplating this awesome reality becomes a game changer across the board. It gives us reason to clear the table of anything that can adversely affect the way we love so that we can open the door for its author to shine forth.

Coming upon this truth is what leads folks like St. Francis of Assisi to leave that which is comfortable and worldly and live a radical life. They relate with the love of God that radiates in and through all living things and appreciate their sacredness. It was having an intimate experience of God's love and friendship that propelled St. Francis and others to embrace simplicity, act nonviolently, pursue humility, love enemies, care for the earth and open up avenues for true justice. Understanding this profound truth will also help us find peaceful solutions to world's problems, restore relationships with our sisters and brothers, bring the grace of loving stewardship to creation and heal many wounds. Once we begin to see how wonderfully holy all of life really is, we discover joy. We lose our need for fear, develop a fierce fortitude, act prudently and seek justice. There is great power in love because it comes from God. It will never fail. It also enjoys the company of two other friends who are eager to become our friends as well: faith and hope. These are just as important to have and to share.

Saint Gianna Beretta Molla

1922 - 1962

Gianna Beretta Molla was born in Italy on October 4, 1922, the 10th of 13 children. From her earliest youth, Gianna accepted the gift of faith and received an excellent Christian education from her parents. After earning degrees in medicine and surgery from the University of Pavia in 1949, she opened a medical clinic in 1950. She specialized in pediatrics at the University of Milan in 1952 and gave special attention to mothers, babies, the elderly and the poor. On September 24, 1955, Gianna Beretta married Pietro Molla, an engineer, in St. Martin's Basilica in Magenta. Together they would have four children: Pierluigi, Mariolina, Laura and Gianna Emaunela.



Gianna met the demands of mother, wife, and medical doctor with simplicity and great balance. She loved culture, fashion and beauty. She played piano, was a painter, enjoyed tennis, mountain climbing, skiing and traveling.

In September 1961, towards the end of the second month of pregnancy with her fourth child, physicians diagnosed a serious fibroma in the uterus that required surgery. One of the options given to Gianna by her doctors was an abortion in order to save her own life. Gianna had to make a heroic decision. Gianna entrusted herself to prayer and Providence said to her doctor: "If you must decide between me and the child, do not hesitate: choose the child – I insist on it. Save the baby."

On Holy Saturday morning, April 21, 1962, her daughter Gianna Emanuela was born. Despite all efforts and treatments to save both of them, one week later on Easter Saturday, April 28, amid unspeakable pain and after repeated exclamations of "Jesus, I love you. Jesus, I love you," Gianna died. The young mother was only 39 years old. Beatified by Pope John Paul II in 1994 during the International Year of the Family, she was canonized ten years later by the same Pope on May 16, 2004 at the Vatican. In an age when permanent commitment is widely discouraged, when human life is cheap and disposable and family life is under siege, when abortion is all too available, when sacrifice and virtue are absent in so many lives; when many in the medical profession have little concern for the dignity and sacredness of every human life; when suffering is seen as a nuisance without any redemptive meaning; when goodness, joy, simplicity and beauty are suspect; St. Gianna Beretta Molla shows this world, gripped by a culture of death, an alternative gospel way of compelling beauty. Her action at the end of her life, in saving young Gianna Emanuela, her daughter, was heroic in that she prepared for her final action every day of her life. Her final decision for life was the natural flowering and culmination of an extraordinary life of virtue and holiness, selflessness and quiet joy. St. Gianna Molla continues to remind the church and the world of the necessity of a consistent ethic of life, from the earliest to the final moments of human life.

Prayer Shawl Ministry Update



Also, any yarn donations will be accepted in the Monsignor Moretti Center on the cart in the front entrance.





If you would like to bring up the bread and wine please see the sacristan before Mass.





Choosing to Love One Another


Love one another. The greatest commandment, the simplest commandment – and if you've ever loved anyone, you know it's also the hardest.

I'm man enough to admit it. I've seen one or two of those cheesy Hallmark movies that are especially popular around the holidays. Boy meets Girl. Boy and Girl encounter a catastrophic roadblock to their relationship – they're coaches of rival high school volleyball teams, or he runs a dog kennel and she works at a feline rescue, so it could never, ever work out, right? But sprinkle a little movie magic over the whole situation and Boy and Girl find what Hallmark tells us is true love.

I could make a list of all the things that are inaccurate about these movies, and something I would put right near the top – maybe even above the sometimes-unbelievable storylines – is the idea that love is a feeling. See, I'm not sure if it's accurate to call these movies love stories. Attraction stories, sure. We are deeply grateful that Council #15231 continues to remember the Food Pantry with your support and generosity.





Is the Venerating of Relics Scriptural?

Have you ever heard this comment? "Catholics practice idolatry because they venerate relics." Here's why this view is incorrect.

Exodus 20:4-5 declares, "You shall not make for yourself an idol or a likeness of anything in the heavens above or on the earth below or in the waters beneath the earth; you shall not bow down to them or serve them." This verse is part of the First Commandment, which states that we can't worship false idols.

Non-Catholics, however, often accuse Catholics of violating this commandment because the Catholic Church venerates relics.

In his book *The Catholic Verses: 95 Bible Passages That Confound Protestants*, Dave Armstrong lists Biblical passages supporting every Catholic teaching in order to clear up misconceptions about the Church. When it comes to relics, Armstrong points out that 2 Kings 13:20-21 states:

And so Elisha died and was buried. At that time of year, bands of Moabites used to raid the land. Once some people were burying a man, when suddenly they saw such a raiding band. So they cast the man into the grave of Elisha, and everyone went off. But when the man came in contact with the bones of Elisha, he came back to life and got to his feet.

We see something similar in the New Testament, as well, in Acts 19:11-12:

"And God did extraordinary miracles by the hands of Paul, so that handkerchiefs or aprons were carried away from his body to the sick, and diseases left them and the evil spirits came out of them".

Armstrong explains that Catholics believe physical matter can convey spiritual grace through the power of God. The verse from 2 Kings supports this teaching, since physical contact with Elisha's bones was the channel for a miracle—this man's resurrection. Paul's handkerchiefs were a channel of healings, as well. Such miracles demonstrate that relics from saints can confer spiritual graces, just as the bones of the holy man Elisha did. God chooses to make use of humble things to grant grace.


Finally, there's a difference between venerating relics and worshipping them. Exodus 20:4-5 makes it clear that mere objects are not to be worshipped, which is why Catholics don't worship relics. Instead, these relics—land sacramentals such as crucifixes and holy images—raise our minds to God in prayer.

When someone says that Catholics worship false idols because they venerate relics, just explain the difference between worship and veneration and point them to Elisha's story in 2 Kings and Paul's story in Acts.


