



WEEKLY REFLECTIONS BY DEACON MAC HILL

The Holy Family

Jesus, Mary, and Joseph lived an idyllic life surrounded by flowers and sunshine. This is often how the Holy Family is portrayed. But it's wrong! The Holy Family may be the ideal family, but they did not have anything close to an idyllic life. From the beginning, Joseph and Mary's marriage was threatened (side note: we often assume that Joseph thought Mary was unfaithful, but it's actually more likely that he considered breaking off the betrothal because he thought himself unworthy to be the foster father of the Son of God). Then, at Jesus' birth, they had to live outside in animal filth with a newborn baby for days or even weeks. After that, almost as soon as they experienced the joy of their newborn child, they had to flee for his life to Egypt. They didn't know how long they would be there and they most likely didn't speak the language. They knew only that God had promised to be with them and that He is always faithful.

Eventually they made it back to Nazareth and scraped out a living. Of course, we also have the incident of Joseph and Mary losing the Son of God in Jerusalem at the Passover when there would have been at least half a million people in the city! Imagine the stress of parents in a world without technology or local police to help find a lost child. Jesus easily could have been kidnapped and sold into slavery. Then, they had to endure the death of Joseph, leaving Mary as a widow and Jesus without His earthly father. The Holy Family had nothing close to an idyllic life! They knew poverty, threat, and death intimately.

But what sets them apart as the ideal family is their *perfect trust and obedience to God's will*. I'm sure Joseph and Mary did not automatically agree on every decision that needed to be made. There wouldn't be holiness in that, they would be more like robots. Instead, they lived to the full the passage from Eph 5:20-32, their lives guided by "being subordinate to one another out of reverence for Christ" (v.20).

We can only marvel at the humility of God that He would choose to become one of us in the way that He did – as a poor and simple man in a poor and simple family. Jesus probably had that one uncle or aunt that was always causing problems in the family, just the same as we do. We can take comfort in the fact that the Holy Family is not far removed from us, rather they know the struggles and dysfunction of our families closely!

I hope and pray that some of the graces we receive through the pandemic are that we become more tight-knit families and learn the gift of simplicity. We can draw from the Holy Family's life as exiles in Egypt and in Nazareth. We can learn from them the value of humility and of "being subordinate to one another out of reverence for Christ" (Eph 5:20). We can grow in the appreciation of silence and an atmosphere of prayer in our homes. We can learn the value of work and its proper place. It is good in that we can provide for our families, but it is not all-important. Activities and trips are great as long as they lead us to God, but perhaps the slower pace during Covid can make our lives a little simpler.

Through the intercession of Mary and Joseph, may each of our families be a beacon of trust and obedience to God's will and truly be the dwelling place of the Holy Spirit. May God's grace heal the wounds caused by any abuse, infidelity, and betrayal. Come Holy Spirit, renew the face of the earth, beginning with our families.

2. Home school families are defined as those families who provide education, including religious faith formation, in their homes following a standardized curriculum. Families who seek to use the parish program for religious education only when it is convenient with the scheduling of secular activities are not covered in this definition of home school family.
3. Families are obligated to use the same religious education text as the parish religious education program during the sacramental years.
4. The Pastor or his delegate for religious education should require a periodic progress report to be made by home school parents.
5. Home School families must submit enrollment document from the Home School Program for previous and current year.


