WEEKLY REFLECTIONS BY DEACON MAC HILL

Prayer, fasting, and almsgiving. These are the three central components of the spiritual life and they're the three pillars of Lent. We're invited to ask the Lord to show us ways in which we can grow in each of them during these 40 days. In this reflection, with God's help, I'd like to offer some insight on why prayer, fasting, and almsgiving are so crucial and how to have a fruitful Lent.

First and foremost, we must remember that, before all else, the "big three" are only fruitful if they are done out of love for God. If they are done simply out of obligation or out of an attitude of trying to earn God's love, they are empty and pointless.

Prayer: typically in Lent people say, "I'm going to pray more" by doing a certain devotional or praying all or part of the rosary each day. While these are good, necessary, and very much encouraged, I would suggest that we also make a resolution to *pray deeper*. Sometimes we use devotionals as a shield from having an actual conversation with God. There is a whole new life available for those who embark on the road of contemplative prayer, by which I mean a daily, heart-to-heart conversation with God.

Fasting: a powerful weapon against temptation and sin, and one of the most effective ways to strengthen our life with God. While most of us pick certain things to "give up" for Lent, we shouldn't forget about doing the traditional day of fasting. This entails eating only one full meal and two snacks which don't add up to the full meal. At minimum, we're asked to fast on Ash Wednesday and Good Friday. That's the minimum, but who wants to settle for the minimum when it comes to loving God? I would humbly encourage to make a day of fasting a weekly practice each Friday (the day Jesus offered His life on the cross). A day of fasting, or the more general "giving something up," is not simply a diet. Fasting means that we forgo something good for the sake of a greater good. It has three main objectives.

First, fasting is a way of conquering temptation. It's what Jesus used to conquer the temptations of Satan in the Gospel reading today. Fasting is extremely effective in overcoming vice and growing in virtue because it trains us in self-control. In this sense, fasting is to the soul what working out is to the body. If you struggle in any of the seven deadly sins (pride, lust, gluttony, wrath, envy, sloth, greed), which is basically anyone that has a pulse, then fasting combined with prayer is the most effective means of overcoming.

Second, fasting is a way of doing penance for sin. If someone has offended you, isn't their apology much more effective if it is more than just mere words? The same is true in our apology to God for our sins. It's not that God wants our sacrifice for the sake of sacrifice, as if He wants us to be miserable. Rather, when we add a sacrifice to our repentance, it leads to a deeper change of heart in us. As the Lord says, "return to me with your whole heart, with fasting, weeping, and mourning. Rend your hearts, not your garments" (Joel 2:12-13).

Connected to this, the third objective of fasting is that it aids our intercessory prayer for others. In both our repentance and our intercessory prayer, fasting helps us to literally "have skin in the game." In fasting we pray with both our soul and body. In almost all of Mary's apparitions over the centuries she exhorts all Christians to pray *and fast* for the conversion of sinners.

Almsgiving: we could pray and fast more than anyone, but if we don't have love, it's all pointless because "faith without works is dead" (Jm 2:26). "If someone who has worldly means sees a brother in need and refuses him compassion, how can the love of God remain in him?" (1 Jn 3:17) What are ways that we can do acts of charity in an intentional way this lent? Some suggestions would be to do one of the corporal or spiritual works of mercy daily, to make time to visit (probably more like a phone call during the pandemic) a sick or home-bound person, or to sacrifice a daily expense like coffee and give that money to the poor instead. Parents can incorporate their kids into these works of charity.

St. Peter Chrysologus puts it beautifully, "prayer knocks at the door, fasting obtains, mercy receives... fasting is the soul of prayer, almsgiving is the lifeblood of fasting... so if you pray, fast; if you fast, show mercy; if you want your petition to be heard, hear the petition of others." Above all, we remember the words of St. Paul, "If I give away everything I own, and if I hand my body over so that I may boast but do not have love, I gain nothing" (1 Cor 13:3). These three pillars must come from love of God and lead us to love, otherwise they are worthless.

Lent gets a bad rap as the most dreaded liturgical season, but it's also the most fruitful. It's a time to die with Christ and so to be raised with Him at Easter. Prayer, fasting, and almsgiving- these are the three pillars of the spiritual life. May the Lord bless and make abundantly fruitful our Lenten practices, so that we may come to know Him all the more. May it be no longer we who live, but Christ who lives in us.



Ash Wednesday and Good Friday are days of fasting. Catholics between the ages of 18 and 59 are permitted one full meal and two lesser meals per day (which together should not equal one full meal), with no eating between meals.

Ash Wednesday and all Fridays of Lent are days of abstinence. Catholics who are 14 years or older should abstain from meat entirely. Soups and gravies made from meat are permitted.

The Diocese of St. Augustine for Parents who Home School Their Children

1. Families must register with the parish and be in communication with the religious education office.
2. Home school families are defined as those families who provide education, including religious faith formation, in their homes following a standardized curriculum. Families who seek to use the parish program for religious education only when it is convenient with the scheduling of secular activities are not covered in this definition of home school family.
3. Families are obligated to use the same religious education text as the parish religious education program during the sacramental years.
4. The Pastor or his delegate for religious education should require a periodic progress report to be made by home school parents.
5. Home School families must submit enrollment document from the Home School Program for previous and current year.






