Gospel

Mk 9:2-10

WEEKLY REFLECTIONS BY DEACON MAC HILL

Carrying the Cross to Glory

The way to glory is through the cross. Through it we are tried and purified. We are crucified with Christ and die with Him, so that we may be raised to live with Him in glory. In one sense this happened to us once and for all in baptism. We have already died and been raised with Christ and now we live a new, glorified life in Jesus even here on earth. Yet at the same time, our entire life on earth is a dying with Jesus so to be raised with Him in eternity in fulfillment.

We see a snapshot of this reality in the gospel reading today, the Transfiguration. This is a passage in which surrounding context is key to understanding what God is telling us. We're in chapter 9 of the Gospel of Mark. In chapter 8 Jesus asks the disciples who people say He is. Peter makes the confession of faith, "you are the Messiah." Immediately afterwards Jesus tells the disciples He will be killed and raised on the third day. Peter rebukes Him, but He tells Peter, "get behind me, satan. You are thinking not as God does but as human beings do." After that Jesus addresses the disciples, "whoever wishes to come after me must deny himself, take up his cross, and follow me."

It's in this mindset of the cross that Jesus takes Peter, James, and John up the mountain with Him and is transfigured in glory before their eyes. The glory of the Trinity is manifested to them as they hear the Father's voice and see the presence of the Holy Spirit in the form of a cloud that envelops them. He gives them a glimpse of His glory to prepare them for His upcoming crucifixion. After they come down from the mountain, Jesus again tells them He will suffer, die, and be raised on the third day. Just as for Jesus, so too for us, the way to glory and eternal life goes through the cross.

Even after Jesus twice telling the disciples that He would suffer, die, and be raised from the dead, they did not understand it. We may be baffled at this, "how were they caught off guard when He died? He told them it would happen!" Yet we do the same thing over and over again in our lives with Christ. How often do we either complain or run away from our own crosses?

We've been doing our practices of prayer, fasting, and almsgiving for about 10 days now as we're in the second Sunday of Lent. By now, most of us have probably had some ups and downs in these practices. Maybe we've been slack on some of them, been tempted to give up, or forgotten about some of them. Maybe we're beginning to question what the point of this self-denial is in the first place. But God has made us a promise and He always keeps His word: the way to glory is through the cross.

Let us persevere in running the race this Lent. Though we're not going to be perfect in our Lenten practices, or any facet of our lives with Christ for that matter, if we're faithful, the Lord will bring us to glory with Him.



Ash Wednesday and Good Friday are days of fasting. Catholics between the ages of 18 and 59 are permitted one full meal and two lesser meals per day (which together should not equal one full meal), with no eating between meals.

Ash Wednesday and all Fridays of Lent are days of abstinence. Catholics who are 14 years or older should abstain from meat entirely. Soups and gravies made from meat are permitted.





Baptism Please call the office 287-0519 to arrange for Baptism and to plan to attend a Baptism Prep class, preferably before the baby's birth. Baptism Prep class is regularly scheduled on the third Monday of each month. You need to be registered, active and participating in the church 6 months prior to the Baptism.

Marriage Couples please contact the parish priest at least 8 months before the wedding. All couples must participate in the Engaged Encounter program and the Natural Family Planning program sponsored by the Diocese. Pre-registration for each of these programs is mandatory. The Diocese of St. Augustine for Parents who Home School Their Children

1. Families must register with the parish and be in communication with the religious education office.
2. Home school families are defined as those families who provide education, including religious faith formation, in their homes following a standardized curriculum. Families who seek to use the parish program for religious education only when it is convenient with the scheduling of secular activities are not covered in this definition of home school family.
3. Families are obligated to use the same religious education text as the parish religious education program during the sacramental years.
4. The Pastor or his delegate for religious education should require a periodic progress report to be made by home school parents.
5. Home School families must submit enrollment document from the Home School Program for previous and current year.


