

Meditation The Daily Path to Holiness (from "My Daily Bread")

Christ:

My Child, live your daily life in My presence by trying to be constantly aware of My nearness to you. The more you strive to develop this virtue, the more I will help you to acquire it. With this grace you will grow in love and kindness toward others. Your faults will become smaller and less frequent and your goodness will shine before the world.

This daily labor for virtue requires a continual effort. You must go on trying, like a person swimming against the current. To stop trying even for a little while, is to lose ground. Without a determined and constant effort there will be no progress.

Do not be afraid of work, inconvenience or suffering. My way to Heaven was the way of prayer, work and suffering. My love is symbolized by the cross and My pierced heart. Let your love for Me use the same symbols. Live a life of prayer, work and suffering. As I chose to make personal sacrifices for you in My daily life, so too should you seek daily opportunities to make personal sacrifices for me.

Pray:

My Jesus, help me to become aware of Your nearness to me throughout the day. I do not wish to fail You. You want me to aim at the highest You said: "Be perfect as your perfection. heavenly Father is perfect!" That means I must never feel that I am good enough, no matter how virtuous I may become. I intend to start trying today to be more like You in everything I do. You are my Model because You also said: "He that sees Me, sees the Father also." You are the perfect image of Your heavenly Father. Bv imitating You, I shall become more God-like. My efforts will be much easier if I can become constantly aware of Your nearness to me throughout the day. Grant me this wonderful grace so that I may become what You desire, a true person of God. In this way, every moment of my earthly life will be a step toward Heaven's perfect life. Amen.

What is a Synod?

A "Synod" can refer to the body of bishops who aid the Pope in listening to and guiding the Church or to a gathering to discuss challenges that the Church faces and to discern together how to move forward. The three main characteristics of a synod are: mutual listening, dialogue, and collective discernment. The main objective of a synod is journey together as the Pilgrim People of God towards holiness by responding to the promptings of the Holy Spirit. Synod is an opportunity to reclaim our identity as a pilgrim Church that journeys together. It is a Church that listens to the Holy Spirit. The Synod process is rooted in an encounter with Jesus in the Scriptures and the liturgical life of the Church. It is inspired by an openness to the movement of the Holy Spirit.

Pope Francis recognizes the need for the People of God to live as a synodal Church, which consists of the following three essential components:

1) **Communion:** The conversations lead to conversion to Christ and commitment to active participation in the mission given by Christ.

2) **Participation:** The people of God talk with and listen to one another about questions that matter.

3) Mission: Our communion and unity exist for a common purpose inspired by the Holy Spirit.

For the Synod to bear fruit, the following requirements need to be met:

1) Address basic questions together.


2) Listen to the Holy Spirit.

3) Remain open to the perspectives of other people.

4) Nurture the fruits of the Holy Spirit over time.


