

SCRIPTURE REFLECTION

Do you believe that God wants to act with power in your life today? Power to set you free from sin and hurtful desires, fear and oppression. Throughout the Scriptures we see God performing mighty acts to save his people from death and destruction - from Noah's ark that spared his family from the flood of wickedness that had spread across the land to Moses and the Israelites who crossed through the parting waters of the Red Sea as they fled the armies of Pharoah their slave Master and oppressor.

Throughout the Gospel accounts Jesus praised individuals who put their faith in God as they remembered the great and wonderful deeds he had performed time and again. Jesus even praised outsiders - non-Jews and pagans from other lands who had heard about the mighty deeds of the God of Israel. One example Jesus mentioned was Naaman the pagan army commander from Syria who was afflicted with leprosy - a debilitating skin disease that slowly ate away the flesh (2 Kings 5:1-15). Naaman's slavegirl was a young Jewish woman who had faith in God and compassion for Naaman her master. She urged him to seek healing from Elisha, the great prophet of Israel. When Naaman went to the land of Israel to seek a cure for his leprosy, the prophet Elisha instructed him to bathe seven times in the Jordan river. Namaan was indignant at first, but then repented and followed the prophet's instructions. In doing so he was immediately restored in body and

Meditation Man's Daily Cross

(from "My Daily Bread")

Christ:

My Child, I had to bear many trials throughout My earthly life. Knowing this, how can you seek rest and pleasure for yourself on earth? Believe Me, it is a great mistake to expect anything else but suffering and hardship in this life! Man's earthly life is full of miseries and crosses.

If you carry it willingly, you will find greater strength in the cross, and it will lead you towards Heaven. If you bear it unwillingly, you only make it a greater burden than it already is: and you still have to bear it. One who runs away from the cross is only running toward another cross, perhaps a heavier one.

There is no other road to Heaven except the way of the cross. No man can escape his cross. Even My saints went through their earthly life, burdened by the cross. Not a single hour of My earthly life was free of the cross. I entered into My glory by suffering and dying upon the cross. Do not fear the cross. I shall help you to bear it.

Think:

As I embrace my daily cross, I shall find Jesus standing on the other side of it, waiting to help me carry it. I shall not have to carry it alone. My daily life is a partnership with Jesus. He walks every step of it with me. As He proved His love for me by embracing His cross, so do I prove my love for Him by embracing my daily trials. True, I may always try to solve my daily problems and remedy my troubles. When, however, my efforts have failed, I should not lose my selfcontrol by impatience, anger or rebellion against God's Will. Nor need I seek to avoid all of the trials which come my way. At times I can deliberately allow myself to endure things or people who annoy me, at least a bit longer than I would naturally like. The more I grow in genuine love for Jesus, the less will I fear or resent the cross.

WE'RE ANXIOUS TO HEAR FROM YOU!

For a Synodal Church: Communion, Participation, and Mission An Opportunity for You to Participate at St. Thomas Aquinas

What:

- Usually a gathering of bishops to discuss challenges faced by the Church, this Synod calls for <u>all of us</u> to participate and gives us each an opportunity to have a voice in the process.
- Synodality is also a mindset, a quality of the Church as having "a habit of mutual listening, dialogue, and collective discernment." Together as members of the Church, we discern the movement of the Holy Spirit and where the Holy Spirit is leading us.

Why:

♠ In his letter to us, Bishop Parkes explains two reasons for this global Synod. "This Synod is an opportunity to reclaim our identity as a pilgrim Church that 'journeys together.' . . . This Synod process is rooted in an encounter with Jesus in the Sacred Scriptures and the liturgical life of the Church and is inspired by an openness to the movement of the Holy Spirit. We seek the Holy Spirit's guidance on how to move forward as we emerge from a global pandemic, a world in turmoil and a Church in crisis." We are all the Body of Christ, and as such we can only move forward together, guided by the Holy Spirit.

How:

- We are in the period of the Synod where thoughts and ideas are shared about where the Church is going, what is positive in the Church, and what is challenging. In order that we hear from as many of the St. Thomas Aquinas family as possible, we are making the <u>5 Synod questions</u> available via a Padlet shared on our FlockNote system.
 - To Become Part of St. Thomas Aquinas' FlockNote: Text the word Super to 84576. Our administrator will accept you to receive texts and/or emails from us via FlockNote.
 - To Get to the Padlet: Once you are part of FlockNote (or if you are already part of FlockNote), we will post a text/email with a link to our Synod Padlet. The Padlet will have the questions in a Word document and as separate questions that can be answered there at the site.
 - To Answer on Paper: At the Padlet, you can print the Word document and answer the
 questions. Then, either drop it off in the church Narthex or at the parish office. Office
 hours are Monday to Friday, 9am to 4pm.
 - To Answer at Padlet: Each question will be posted separately on the Padlet, each with a
 comment box. Simply click the comment box for the question you want to answer and
 type in your answer.

We want to hear from everyone, but there is a deadline. In order for us to prepare and submit our report of your responses to the diocese, we need to have your answers by
