Witness the joy of the Gospel

Meditation Benefits of the Cross (from "My Daily Bread")

Christ:

My Child, when you have come to know the full value of the cross, it will no longer be such a puzzle to you, nor will you ever again seek to avoid it. You will then see it as a valuable help for many spiritual gifts right here on earth. You will embrace your daily trials with joy.

In the cross you will find a deep interior peace and joy. You will understand why those who hate or fear the cross are to be pitied. The cross will bring you a clear mind which will see the heavenly value of what you are enduring. The cross will help vou to think straight. You will look on the cross as a ladder raising you up toward Me. Your mental and spiritual health will be excellent because you will be free from fear, confusion and discontent. In the daily cross you will find a fuller life, a deep sense of My nearness to you and of your daily progress toward Heaven. Temptations cannot shake one who truly loves the cross.

If there were anything on earth better than the cross, would I not have chosen it? The cross, more than anything else, will enrich your soul with many virtues on earth and countless merits in Heaven. The cross will best prepare you for your last and most important examination. No person can be sure of his or her own true worth until they have learned to recognize and embrace the cross in their daily life. That is why I commanded: "If anyone wishes to come after Me, let them deny themselves, take up their cross and follow me.

Never forget for a moment this truth: Through many trials will you enter into the eternal kingdom of Heaven. Therefore, take up your cross daily and follow Me.





St Thomas Aquinas is in a good cash position as a result of the recent estate and bequest donations. These funds have been used to upgrade the kitchen and to purchase new AC units in the church. The remaining unrestricted savings will be prudently used to replace other capital improvements or replacements, i.e. AC units and roofs for school, the church hall and maintenance buildings. Our revenue/expense statement is a positive \$95,000 due to the forgiveness of our PPP loan during this covid era. Without that forgiveness revenue, we would have been \$31,000 behind revenue collections (or a loss). As the covid era continues, attendance is less. We are controlling our expenses as much as possible, yet inflation makes that harder. Thank you for your continued prayers, weekly contributions and electronic donations, all of which are so very much needed and appreciated. In His love, Fr. Eric
