This Week's Reflection

A Shrine of Love

Leonella Sgorbati.

Leonella served as the leader of the Consolata Missionary Sisters in Kenya, Africa. She then founded a nursing school in Somalia with the dream of providing health services and career options to young people there who could otherwise be lured into joining al-Shabab or other terrorist groups. Her nursing school's first students graduated in 2006.

Sister Leonella deeply believed that giving young people a chance, offering them something different, would move them to lay down their weapons. In fact, she said, "I know I could be risking my own life, but I will do it for love."

Love means you're willing to inconvenience yourself for someone else. And Leonella knew that where there is fear, love withers.

When one Somali leader told worshippers at his mosque, "Whoever offends our prophet Muhammad should be killed on the spot by the nearest Muslim," trouble began to stir.

And so, on Sunday, September 17, 2006, around midnight, Sister Leonella was crossing the road from the children's hospital to enter the village where five of her Consolata sisters lived. The crossing is just thirty feet long.

Two assailants waited, hiding behind the taxis at the entrance of the hospital. Ambush.

Sister Leonella was shot in the thigh. When her security leader fired back, the Islamists shot and killed him. That leader, Mohamed Osman Mahamud, a Muslim father of four, died.

Leonella was then hit with two additional bullets, one of which severed her femoral artery, causing a massive hemorrhage.

Taken quickly for medical help, she was surrounded by her religious sisters. They loved her till the end.

As she lay bleeding to death, Sister Leonella Sgorbati spoke her final words in her native Italian: "Pardono, pardono." In English, "I forgive, I forgive."

After her death, the sisters buried her in Nairobi, and her body is now kept in the Flora Hostel Chapel there.

"This sister, who for many years served the poor and the children in Somalia, died pronouncing the word 'forgive,' " Pope Benedict XVI said. "This... shows the victory of love over hatred and evil."

Indeed. Those who opposed Sister Leonella never had a chance. Love triumphs. Forgiveness wins.

Her love for God and the Somali people conquered any fear.

And in the end, her heart was transformed into something beautiful. A shrine of Love.

Sacramental Preparation & Information

INFANT BAPTISM Parents must be members of St. James for at least 3 months or have the pastor's permission, and must attend our pre-Baptism class which is generally held the 3rd Thursday of every month at 7pm. Please call the Parish Office to learn the requirements and policies of Baptism. After attending the class, please call to schedule your Baptism celebration. Baptisms are normally celebrated on the **first Saturday** of the month at 10:30 am, however there may be exceptions during certain times of the year.

FIRST HOLY COMMUNION Children in the second grade, and active in the Faith Formation program for two consecutive years, are eligible to enroll in the sacramental preparation program. Special preparation sessions for these two sacraments are held throughout the year before the reception of these sacraments. Contact the Faith Formation office 770-957-5441 ext.108.

CONFIRMATION Preparation for this sacrament is coordinated through our Youth Ministry Office. Youth in the 10th grade or older, and active in the teen program of the parish for at least two consecutive years, will be eligible to register for Confirmation. Contact the Youth Ministry office at 770-957-5441 ext. 110 for more information.

MARRIAGE Couples considering marriage must contact a priest or deacon **at least six months before** the projected date and must attend a pre-marriage program.

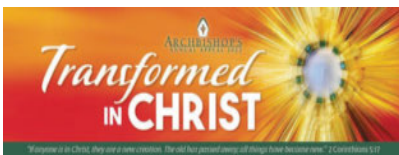

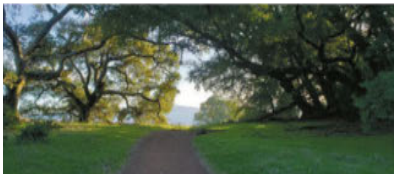

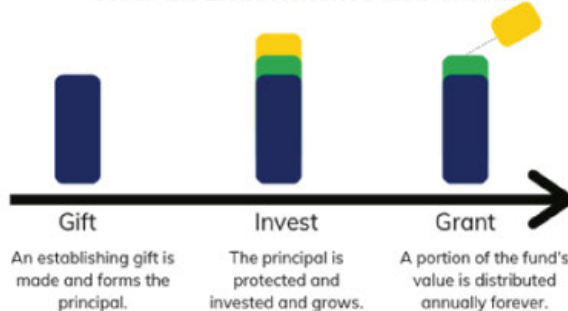
