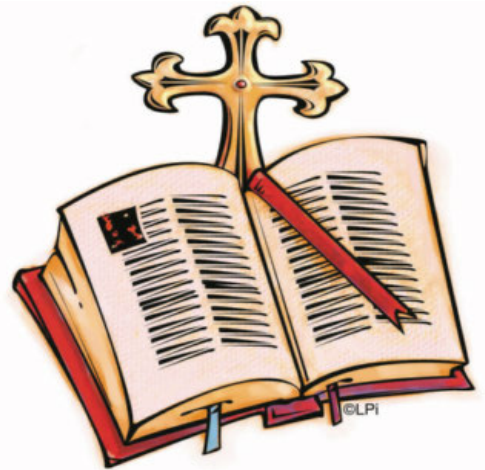

LIVE THE LITURGY

Inspiration for the week

God calls us in the midst of ordinary things. Often only looking for God in the dramatic, spectacular, the ritual or the sacred places, we miss that He is walking beside us. Every moment of every day, in every circumstance and experience, God is calling to us, "Follow me." Sometimes, we are too distracted to hear this call. Other times, we would rather ignore it or pretend it wasn't heard. God, however, is very persistent. Whether we fine tune our hearing to receive this invitation now or when we close our eyes in death, we need to make a choice. The choice involves leaving some things behind and moving forward, taking risks. Choosing to keep focused and single-minded, the lens we then use to see our world and one another is God's, not our own. Life is no longer about what is important or matters to me but what matters to God. We acquire a new filter and are asked to use that filter to make choices, establish priorities, and determine what direction we will take, and how to love. Once we accept God's invitation, we cannot keep looking back to what was left behind, only forward to the surprises yet to come.

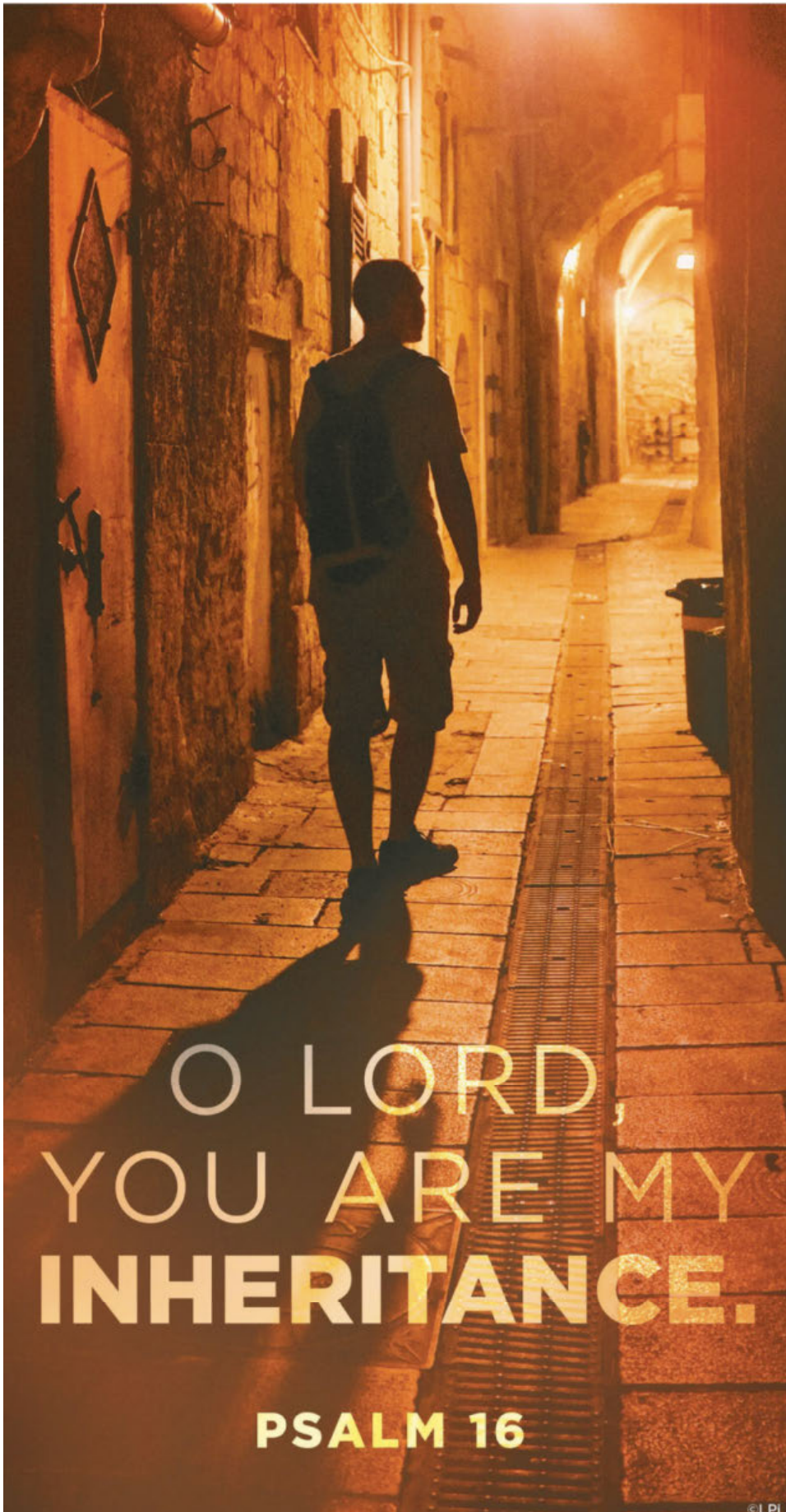

¿Que es la Hora Santa?

En tiempos de tanto ruido y cambio, en los que a veces -sino la mayoría-, se nos hace difícil rezar y escuchar a Dios, Monseñor Jorge de los Santos nos recomienda la Hora Santa, como un ámbito privilegiado para estar con el Señor y escucharlo.

Aprovechemos todas las ocasiones en que podamos visitar al Señor Jesús y pasar una Hora Santa con Él, pues será momento de enriquecer con el Amor de los Amores. Recordemos a Jesús en el Huerto de los Olivos que pidió a sus discípulos que estuvieran despiertos con Él en oración y al volver los encontró dormidos y les dijo “¿no pudieron velar conmigo una hora? Velen y oren para que no caigan en tentación”. Esta es una práctica importante y seria en la vida espiritual de todo cristiano. Es recomendado para todos aquellos que quieren conocer mejor al Señor.

La Hora Santa es una oportunidad magnífica para hacer ese silencio interior en el que el Señor nos habla especialmente. Esto se logra de varias maneras. La Hora Santa rezada en la Iglesia, tiene la ventaja de la presencia del Señor en el Santísimo Sacramento, y la Iglesia es el lugar natural para la oración.

¿Qué hacer durante la Hora Santa? Eso puede variar. Sólo hay que dejar que se exprese el corazón. La expresión del amor no tiene una estructura formal, aunque en la oración también podría ayudar el valerse de leer pasajes de las Sagradas Escrituras, oraciones devocionales ya escritas, letanias, rosarios, viacrucis u otras oraciones formales. Todas ellas pueden usarse para ir introduciéndose en el silencio interior.

Una vez iniciada la comunicación con el Señor es bueno estar atento a escucharlo, sentirlo y expresarle nuestro amor, nuestra admiración, nuestro respeto. Es necesario abrir el corazón al Señor para dejar que fluyan los sentimientos. Pero sobre todo la Hora Santa es diálogo donde se privilegia el **escuchar al Señor Jesús que tiene tantas cosas maravillosas que transmitirnos**; es nuestra alma la que necesita llenarse de Él. Estos momentos de intimidad son necesarios para el espíritu. El Arzobispo Fulton J. Sheen decía acerca de la Hora Santa: “**La forma de conocer mejor a un amigo es pasar tiempo con él.** Si nosotros queremos conocer mejor al Señor necesitamos también pasar tiempo con Él. Deberíamos estar con Él en oración silenciosa por lo menos una hora al día”.

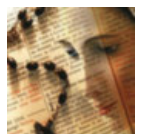

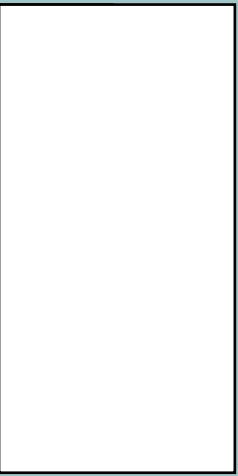
