Summer has flown by, and another school year is beginning! I pray all our teachers and students are well rested from their Summer Vacation and that the transition back into school goes smoothly. Today's readings all seem to have a common theme of frustration and uncertainty. Elijah has reached the end of his rope in his mission as a prophet so much so, that he prays that God will simply put him out of his misery. The people Jesus is ministering to in the Gospel begin murmuring about Him and underestimating who He is and what He can do because they think they know Him. God does not relent, however, with Elijah in the first reading or the crowds that doubt Him (remember, Jesus *is* God) in the Gospel. Instead, He proposes to feed them. He gives Elijah food for a *long* journey (40 day and 40 nights on foot) so that he may continue his mission as a prophet. In the Gospel, God Incarnate goes even further in proposing to give His very Flesh, the Living Bread Come Down from Heaven, as food for the people so that they may live forever.

Jesus makes that same offering to us every day in the Eucharist. It is food for our journey through life and food that will make us live forever, so long as we are faithful. What are ways we can be faithful? Saint Paul enumerates some examples in the reading from Ephesians, telling us to be imitators of God and put aside "...all bitterness, fury, anger, shouting, and reviling...along with all malice. And be kind to one another, compassionate, forgiving one another as God has forgiven you in Christ." Jesus says in the Gospel: "Stop murmuring among yourselves." One way to interpret all of this is to simply avoid complaining and look for reasons to be grateful.

How difficult this can be, though, when we are worn down with school, work, family life, illness/death, or difficult people in our lives. We can perhaps feel like Elijah and simply want to be put out of our misery. What is beautiful, though, about how Elijah conducted himself is, having gone off to the solitude of the desert, he prayed to God---sure, he may have prayed for death, but he *still* prayed--- and then he was obedient in eating the food that God set before him. This is the example we are invited to follow, not just in hard times, but also *all* times: going to be alone with the Lord (which can be done anywhere, but especially in the church/Adoration Chapel) and continuing to allow Him to feed us with His Flesh and Blood in the Eucharist.

May we ask the Lord today to grant us the grace to be grateful, to trust in Him in the midst of all adversity, endure all trials with patience, forgive and reconcile with one another, and always allow our hearts to be healed and strengthened by His Holy Eucharist.

St. Joseph's Catholic School

Did You Know? St. Joseph's Catholic School was the first public school in Macon!



St. Joseph's Catholic School was founded in 1872 when Reverend L. X. Basin, then pastor of St. Joseph Catholic Church, offered the church basement in downtown Macon to the newly formed public school system. Listed as the "Fourth Street School" on public school records, St. Joseph's began as the first unit of the public school system of Macon. Two Sisters of Mercy taught children of all faiths. The Catholic students remained after school for religion class and the preparation for the sacraments. All Catholic children, regardless of school ward, were permitted to attend the Sisters' school.

Today, St. Joseph's Catholic School educates 190 students in grades 2K through 6. Our faculty strongly believe in educating the whole child and providing ample learning opportunities. In addition to benefitting from our strong academic curriculum, our students are able to develop their talents in fine arts, sports, technology, and community service. The faculty and staff partner with the parents in the faith formation of the child. Moreover, we provide a seamless transition to Mount de Sales Academy where the Sisters of Mercy legacy continues with the right balance of academic rigor, faith-enriching programs, and extracurricular activities.
