



The Baptism of the Lord

"We are called to live our baptism every day, as new creatures, clothed in Christ." -Pope Francis



What reference point do you use when making decisions? Many times, impulse takes control and decisions are made based solely on emotion and desire. We all know that these types of decisions can often get us into trouble. When a person has a confident sense of who they are and a real understanding of what is important and of value, the likelihood of kneejerk impulsive choices diminishes. Baptism gives us what we need to make well informed and purposeful decisions. By this simple gesture, God claims us as His own and provides us with the identity and purpose we need to properly live life.

It is tremendously reassuring, when we truly embrace this revelation and realize that we no longer have to wonder about the purpose of our lives or struggle to find our way. The answer of who we are in God has been given to us. We no longer have to fumble around, trip over ourselves or walk aimlessly about. Issues surrounding the sacredness of life, the meaning of death, the protection of those most vulnerable, care for the weak and the poor, offering hospitality to those in search of a home, the purpose and proper place of work, how to create a just social order, caring for creation, and understanding our roles as heralds and stewards are just a few of the wonderful gifts baptism brings. When we make decisions based on things such as these core Gospel truths we really act as Christ himself, revealing to others the new creations that we are. This is how we live our baptism.

It is difficult to walk against the tide. Yet, that is precisely what baptism calls us to do. Although we are sinners, in need of mercy and far from perfection we are called to order our life and make decisions based upon the wisdom and guidance of Almighty God. He alone is the one who can claim us as His sons and daughters. Standing up for our principles will not make us popular. But who ever said Christianity is a popularity contest? Baptism calls us to stand up for that which goes against the grain of secularism. Standing in line with other sinners, we have our anchor to steady us in the tempests of life and God is very pleased. - **Bicentennial Celebration.** We celebrated the beginning of our bicentennial year with Bishop Luis Zarama, Bishop Robert Guglielmone, and Bishop Ned Shlesinger III.
- **Together We Can** pantry items to Catholic Charities we delivered 28,410 items, this is more than we have ever donated in the past 5 years of this project. The closest year to this amount was in 2018 with 20,063 items.
- **Mortgage.** We paid off the 15-year mortgage in just 7 1/2 years.
- **Christmas in July tree.** \$2,345 to Room at the Inn, Meals on Wheels \$2,470, 145 items for Connections of Cumberland County, 248 items for Urban Ministry, 170 items for Operation Inasmuch, and 336 items for Catholic Charities.
- **Advent Angel Tree.** With our Advent Angel Tree, we sent over 800 gifts to Holy Savior Church in Lockport, LA and \$8, 675.00. There were 73 gifts for our parishioners in need, and 506 gifts for Catholic Charities.
- **Outreach Ministry.** This past summer the youth of the parish that participated in HomeWorks repaired 3 homes. We continue to serve the homeless breakfast through Operation Inasmuch, provide weekly meals for the Care Clinic health care providers and clean up the streets in downtown Fayetteville with Adopt-a-Street.
- **Sacraments.** We helped 31 couples entered into a sacramental marriage, 32 people were confirmed, 37 people made their First Communion and we celebrated 52 baptisms. We also celebrated Virgin of the Americas.
- **Hispanic Ministry.** We have celebrated this year our regular annual events like the Three Wise Men at the Epiphany of the Lord, Virgin of the Americas in October, and Our Lady of Guadalupe in December. Also, our Adult Faith Formation programs have been available on Zoom and in presence this past year, ending the las in-person class with a pilgrimage to the Basilica of Mari in Wilmington. The Charismatic Prayer Group was able to come back in-person every Monday evening, and participated in a healing convention in Raleigh back in November.
