## A Note From the Pastor

After the catastrophe of Calvary and the mind-boggling joy of Easter Sunday, the disciples needed some rehab. The Easter Season's Gospels tell us of the work Jesus did to help the disciples have a clear notion of himself, of themselves as those who would pick up his preaching where he left off, and of the nature and style of the mission he would give them on what we celebrate as the Ascension. Come Pentecost, they would "graduate." The Gospel writers capture all this to remind us of who our "Teacher and Lord" is and what that means for us.

The first disciples brought their own notions of messiahship and salvation to their calling. While respecting their differences, Jesus helped them learn to adjust those differences to the core of that calling. Something like a family.

When I was a kid, we were eight around the dining room table. One of us was usually a toddler and would pretty much eat anything. The rest of us brought our acquired tastes and preferences. My mom did a good job of navigating these likes and dislikes, but it was impossible to satisfy all of us all the time. So, whenever, a complaint arose, my dad's standard reply was a firm reminder that our dining room was not a restaurant. If you were hungry, you were welcome to eat. If not, well, another meal would be coming around in a few hours.

As the Easter Season focuses on who we are as disciples of One who was God's "suffering servant" and not some titan of wealth and power, so too it's a season to focus on our need to continually refine our tastes and preferences to serve as citizens and professionals. The Sunday readings will help us focus. But so will our experience of family life, a life that is a great model for readying and steadying to thrive.

A student coming to Clemson wanting to be an engineer should realize that she or he is going to be living that career within a specific culture. So, if it's a school worthy of its tuition, Clemson has to continue the student's schooling in things like literature, history, and the arts. A little bit of economics wouldn't hurt either. No student will ever be a good engineer – or whatever – unless he or she has also developed the capacity to be a good citizen. Again, something like a family.

Family is where we learn that, as loved and important as we are, the world doesn't revolve around us. That "life as a restaurant" has its limits. Family is never about equality where equality means everyone gets the same thing. Older kids get privileges and responsibilities denied the toddlers. The family member with special needs gets what those needs require; others don't. In healthy families – and every family has its dysfunctions - bad behavior has consequences because family is where we're loved. Discipline (aka, "teaching") is never meant to beat us down; it's always meant to bring about rehabilitation.

Our Catholic social teaching insists on the priority of family as the foundational network of relationships and the culture. Family teaches us how to be a Church and how to be a society.

Getting something out of the Easter Season might be easier for us if we can make it a time of reappreciating our families and applying what we learn to our Church, our work, and our life as a city, state, and nation.

### RESURRECTION NARRATIVES –

During the Octave of Easter, the Scripture readings for Mass focus on the Resurrection narratives. Try reading the daily Scripture readings every day this week so that your children can hear a wide variety of Resurrection narratives. Ask your children, "What are some common features of the different stories?" Point out to your children that Jesus always appears to his friends, not to the general public; the people to whom he appears often don't recognize him at first; and although he can appear and disappear at will, he has a real body, which he demonstrates by showing the apostles his wounds and eating with them.
