
Then, after singing a hymn, they went out to the Mount of Olives.

ANNUAL APPEAL SURPASSES \$2.5 MILLION IN COMMITMENTS



GREP REGISTRATION 2021-2022

The goal of our Religious Education Program is to support and assist parents in the guardianship of their children’s faith. We offer the opportunity for our faith to come alive for our children through knowledge, prayer, discipleship and the sacraments. This journey is an ongoing one and is set up so that each year builds upon the next to help in the understanding of our faith. The call is made to the families of Saint Benedict to be active stewards of our faith and our parish community.

Registration forms for the coming year are available at our website www.stbenedictparish.org. Students who will be in Grades 1-8 in 2021-2022 will meet on either Monday or Tuesday, times are listed on the registration form.

Students in Grade 9 in 2021-2022 will register for Confirmation. These are separate forms and they are also available on the website. Those registering for Confirmation must have a minimum of 2 years of formal faith formation in order to register for Confirmation.

We ask that when you register please pick your preferred choice day and time and an optional choice day and time. All completed registration forms and fees should be sent to Louise Henesy at the parish office.

COK/SM students, who are parishioners of Saint Benedict, preparing for First Reconciliation and First Communion should also register for the fall session using the Catholic School registration form at the parish website.

We will be watching CDC and Diocesan guidelines. Our goal is to return to a weekly program. This will depend on numbers and guidelines.



PARISH MEMBERSHIP

Active members of our parish are identified by their generosity of time, talent, and treasure. Their stewardship is determined by:

- 1) Being properly registered and active for at least three months**
- 2) Faithful participation at weekly liturgies**
- 3) Regular and identifiable support of the parish**

These criteria are used to verify parishioner status for sponsor certificates; enrollment in parochial schools; participation in sacramental, educational, pastoral, and social ministries, activities and enrichment programs; and use of facilities and services. No activity shown for three months will move a person to inactive status.

The USCCB specifies that all adult members who have contact with youth or vulnerable adults in any parish-related activity are required to be screened by Child Protective Services. Please call the office for details.

SACRAMENTAL POLICY

First Reconciliation/First Communion: Celebrated in the 2nd grade, with 2 year preparation period required.

Confirmation: celebrated in the Fall of 9th grade according to the Bishop’s schedule. The candidate must consistently attend 6th, 7th, and 8th grades.

Marriage: Engaged couples must be active parishioners for at least 6 months prior to the wedding and successfully complete the marriage preparation program.

Baptism: Parents should be registered and active for at least 6 months. A Baptism Preparation class must be taken by one or both parents if this is your first child, or if it has been over three years since you’ve taken a Baptism class. The class can be taken either here or at another parish. Forms indicating the eligibility of Godparents (16+yrs of age, baptized/confirmed Catholic in good standing) must be received prior to setting the date for the baptism. Assistance in finding a suitable Godparent can be arranged upon request.

HOSPITALIZED/HOMEBOUND

Call the Parish Office to arrange for prayer, visitation, and Holy Communion. Please request the Sacrament of Anointing of the Sick prior to entering the hospital. Do not wait until a loved one is critical to inform the staff! A priest is not always available to respond to emergency situations.

HEARING IMPAIRED

Listening devices are available. Please ask an usher for assistance.
