

WE WELCOME ALL NEWCOMERS AND VISITORS TO BLESSED SACRAMENT CHURCH. If you would like to register at Blessed Sacrament, registration forms are available at the back of the church, in the parish office, or register online at blsac.org.

It is our custom that statements testifying to the active, participating, contributing status of an individual be provided for those wishing to be sacramental sponsors or for those wishing to receive a sacrament. We cannot issue such statements if you are not a registered and active member of Blessed Sacrament Church. You must use the offertory envelopes provided to registered parishioners to support your active status.

BAPTISM: Parents who wish to have their child/children baptized should contact the Parish Office. A preparatory session (class) is mandatory for the proper formation of parents and godparents. You must be an active member at Blessed Sacrament Church (3 months minimum) in order to schedule a baptism.

MARRIAGE: Those wishing to enter into a sacramental marriage should contact the Parish Office at least six months prior to the intended date.

FIRST HOLY COMMUNION & CONFIRMATION: Preparations for the reception of these Sacraments are taken care of by the Office of Faith Formation. Please call Sarah Runko at 843-974-3609. **Members of Blessed Sacrament Church, who are asked to be Sponsors of Confirmation Candidates, will need to be <u>Active Parishioners</u> of the Parish.**

VISITING THE SICK: Please inform the Parish Office should a relative/friend who is homebound/hospitalized need a pastoral visit or the Sacrament of Anointing. A priest will attend to the Sacrament and, as needed, will arrange for Holy Communion to be brought to your loved one.

With the lifting of the general dispensation,

A "Registered and Active" family/individual is one who:

- 1. Has been formally registered and participating in the life of the Parish for at least 3 months.
- 2. Participates in Worship through weekly attendance at Weekend Masses.
- 3. Places **envelopes weekly** in the offertory, even if empty.
- \sim If you give online, please turn in your empty envelopes weekly at Mass and check "I give online."
- ~ If you contribute periodically through the collection, please remember to put in envelopes weekly, even if empty, and mark "I attended Mass."
- \sim Contributions in cash can only be considered when presented in the parish envelope.
- \sim Multiple envelopes put in at a weekend Mass will be considered participation for that one Mass.
- \sim Envelopes Dropped off or Mailed will not be considered participation at Mass.
- \sim Blank Green envelopes are available in the church if needed.

Families need to be Active Members for a child to be eligible to receive a Sacrament. Families need to be Active Members to receive reduced tuition rates at Blessed Sacrament School and Bishop England High School.

(Active parishioner status must be maintained for families in the Schools and Sacramental Program)

Individual dispensation, for those who are still at risk of grave illness and for their caretakers, will remain in place. *If you are not attending Mass because of an individual dispensation, <u>please use Online Giving or mail envelopes to the Parish Office.</u> <i>If you are not attending Mass & do not mail envelopes to the parish office or use online giving, you will be considered a Non Active Parishioner.*



CHRISTMAS ... IT'S A WONDERFUL TIME OF THE YEAR!

We are still in the tempo of the Birthday Celebration of the King of Kings and Lord of Lords! Fittingly the celebration goes on for a couple of weeks – till the Feast of the Baptism of Jesus by John in the Jordan (January 9, 2022). In the intervening days, we have some significant observances:

December 26: The Feast of the Holy Family, Joseph, Mary & Jesus

An appropriate Feast to re-dedicate our families to the Family of Nazareth

St. Stephen, the First Martyr

It was at the stoning of Stephen that a young man at that time, Saul, was the caretaker of Stephen's cloak. Little details mean a lot ... it was the same Saul who later, after his conversion to Christ, has been known to us as PAUL.

December 27: St. John, Apostle & Evangelist

Writer of the Fourth Gospel

December 28: The Holy Innocents

Remember the edict of Herod, the slaughter of male babies two years old and under in the hope that he would get rid of the Infant of Bethlehem who was beginning to be known as the King of the Jews. This was a threat to Herod who was Rome's King of the Jews.

December 29: St. Thomas Becket, Bishop & Martyr

He was martyred in his cathedral by the soldiers of Henry II in 1170. He engaged in conflict with the King of England, Henry II, over the rights and privileges of the Church.

December 31: Pope St. Sylvester I

In the 4^{TH} century ... he was represented at the Council of Nicaea during which the heresy of Arianism was condemned and the expansion of the CREED was developed. This is the Profession of Faith that we use today – THE NICENE CREED.

January 1: The Solemnity of Mary, the Holy Mother of God (also New Year's Day) January 2: The Epiphany of the Lord

Three mysteries are encompassed in this solemnity: the adoration of the Christ Child by the Magi; the baptism of Christ; and the wedding feast at Cana.

Ss. Basil and Gregory Nazianzen

Basil, Bishop of Caesarea, wrote the Rule of a Monastic Order, The Basilians; Gregory Nazianzen, Patriarch of Constantinople, considered one of four great Doctors of the Eastern Church.

January 3: Most Holy Name of Jesus

January 4: St. Elizabeth Ann Seton

A wife and mother of five children, foundress of the Sisters of Charity, a religious Congregation of Women dedicated to the care and education of the poor and orphans, first native-born US citizen to be canonized.


