WHY DO WE DO THAT? - CATHOLIC LIFE EXPLAINED

Question: What is the “Miraculous Medal” and why is it called that?

Answer:

The medal of the Immaculate Conception that has come to be called simply the “Miraculous Medal” dates back to an apparition of Mary to Saint Catherine Laboure, who was then a novice sister with the Daughters of Charity. On November 27, 1830, Our Lady appeared to her standing on a globe, with shafts of light streaming from her hands and the words, “O Mary, conceived without sin, pray for us who have recourse to thee,” surrounding the image. In the same vision, Catherine saw a capital “M” with a cross above it and below two hearts. Catherine seemed to hear a voice telling her to have what she saw struck as a medal and a promise that those who wore the medal would have the protection and intercession of the Mother of God. The first 1,500 of medals were distributed in 1832. Many miraculous favors were attributed to the use of the medal.

Saint Catherine’s “Miraculous Medal” is among the recognizable and popular symbols of modern Catholicism. Reflecting on its widespread use, the 2001 Vatican document, “Directory on Popular Piety and Liturgy,” observes that the medal “recalls the mystery of Redemption, the love of the Sacred Heart of Jesus and of the Sorrowful Heart of Mary. It signifies the mediatory role of the Blessed Virgin Mary, the mystery of the Church, the relationship between Heaven and earth, this life and eternal life.”



GOSPEL MEDITATION

The author of The Cloud of Unknowing prays, “That which I am and the way that I am, with all my gifts of nature and grace, you have given to me, O Lord, and you are all this. I offer it all to you, principally to praise you and to help my fellow Christians and myself.” Knowing that God sustains us in being is the key to faith. All that we need to do is to love God as God is and the rest will begin to fall into place. God made us in His image and desires that we have life. God also desires that we be healed of all of our wounds, especially those caused by sin, and know his loving touch. Being weighed down by negativity, imperfections, the cares of the world, and weakness is not something that God desires.

Faith can profoundly change how we see God, ourselves, and one another. It gives a clearer lens through which to see life and connects us with the powerful virtues of love and hope. Three friends journeying with us through all that we encounter, faith, hope, and love, help us experience God’s embrace and heal us. All we have to do is let God be who God is and not foolishly try to make Him into what we need or want Him to be. Without God we cease to be. It’s that simple. The very blood that flows through my veins and the life that I have come directly from Divine origins. With this knowledge of who God is and who I am, I can open my ears and hear the powerful words Jesus speaks, “Do not be afraid, just have faith.” Trust begins.

When we are struggling, we naturally reach out for God because we know that a divine remedy is the only remedy. But, in doing so we wrestle with letting God take charge. We want something more miraculous and visible than the obvious and have difficulty in finding consolation simply resting in God’s presence. Our naked being, stripped of any pretense or self-serving agenda, is being called to rest in and love the uncreated Presence of God. Reach out in love to God. Ask God to heal you from all that separates you from Him. Put aside any ideas of God that create barriers between you and God’s tender and endearing presence. The Cloud of Unknowing leaves us with wisdom, “think of yourself and of him in the same way, that is, with the simple awareness that he is as he is and that you are as you are.” This is a meeting of two friends who desire nothing more than to share life together. ©LPi





EVERYDAY STEWARDSHIP - Touching the Cloak of Christ

Look to today's Gospel and you'll find one of the most arresting images in all of Scripture. Christ in a crowd, everyone clamoring for his attention, pressing against him. Several feet away, is a chronically ill woman, weak and desperate for help. She knows she doesn't have a chance of getting his attention. She has no connections. She has no strength. All she can do is lift up her hand.

So that's what she does. She reaches out.

There comes a time, or maybe several times, in each of our lives when we become this woman. We're tired and we're sick. Is it with sin? With fear? With anger? It doesn't matter. Whatever it is, it's made us weak, and we feel like we've run out of options. We've looked for help and come up empty. We've consulted friends and gotten nowhere. We're lost in the crowd of life, unable to stick our heads above the pressing throng to wave for help.

And there is Christ, always passing by us. The hem of his cloak is never far from our grasp. We have no hope of a big miracle like the synagogue leader. We don't even bother asking for that. But that cloak ... we can touch that cloak. That's something we can do.

Do we do it, though? Do we have the confidence of that sick, beaten-down woman who knew so totally that healing was there for the taking? Or do we retreat back into the crowd, stumbling back home with our pain and our sinfulness? Reach out, friends. However, whatever, whenever — reach out. Christ will not fail you.

MEDITACIÓN EVANGÉLICO - ALENTAR ENTENDIMIENTO MÁS PROFUNDO DE LA ESCRITURA



Marcos, ahora, nos lleva paso a paso, a ver los milagros de Jesús. En este caso son dos, el de la mujer que sufría de hemorragias, y la resurrección de la hija de Jairo, jefe de la sinagoga y responsable de la comunidad judía. Hoy, el Evangelio nos narra un doble acto de fe. Jesús se fue de camino a la casa de Jairo y de repente entre el gentío que lo apretujaba sucedió lo siguiente: “Se encontraba allí una mujer que padecía un derrame de sangre desde hacía doce años... la mujer pensaba: Si logro tocar, aunque solo sea su ropa, sanaré. Al momento cesó su hemorragia y sintió en su cuerpo que estaba sana” (Marcos 5:24-28). Enseguida viene el dialogo de preguntas y respuestas entre Jesús, sus discípulos y la mujer que responde asustada. A lo que Jesús le dice. “Hija, tu fe te ha salvado; vete en paz y queda sana de tu enfermedad” (Marcos 5:34).

Este episodio entretuvo a Jesús para llegar rápido a la casa de Jairo. Llegaron algunos de la casa del oficial y le dan la mala noticia de que su hija ya había muerto. Jesús, se hace el desentendido, como que no se da cuenta. Jesús, se dirige a Jairo y le dice no tengas miedo. Solamente ten fe. ¡Que poca cosa nos pide Jesús! Solamente tener fe, fe como un granito de mostaza. Y sucede, el milagro de la resurrección de la niña. *Talitá kumi* que quiere decir: ¡Nina, te digo, ¡levántate! “Vayamos hoy a casa con este ícono del Evangelio de hoy: el jefe de la sinagoga que se arroja ante Jesús, sin miedo de avergonzarse y hacer reír a otros. En juego estaba la vida de su hija” Papa Francisco. (Homilía, Santa Marta 04 de febrero 2014).

LA CORRESPONSABILIDAD DIARIA - RECONOCER A DIOS EN LOS MOMENTOS ORDINARIOS Tocando el Manto de Cristo

Mira el Evangelio de hoy y encontrarás una de las imágenes más fascinantes de toda la Escritura. Cristo en una multitud, todos clamando por su atención, presionándose contra él. A varios pies de distancia, hay una mujer con una enfermedad crónica, débil y desesperada por ayuda. Ella sabe que no tiene ninguna posibilidad de llamar su atención. Ella no tiene conexiones. Ella no tiene fuerzas. Todo lo que puede hacer es levantar su mano.

Entonces eso es lo que ella hace. Ella se estira para alcanzar.

Llega un momento, o tal vez varias veces, en cada una de nuestras vidas cuando nos convertimos en esta mujer. Estamos cansados y enfermos. ¿Es con el pecado? ¿Con miedo? ¿Con coraje? No importa. Sea lo que sea, nos ha debilitado y sentimos que nos hemos quedado sin opciones. Hemos buscado ayuda y nos quedamos vacíos. Hemos consultado a amigos y no llegamos a ninguna parte. Estamos perdidos en la multitud de la vida, incapaces de asomar la cabeza por encima de la multitud apremiante para pedir ayuda.


