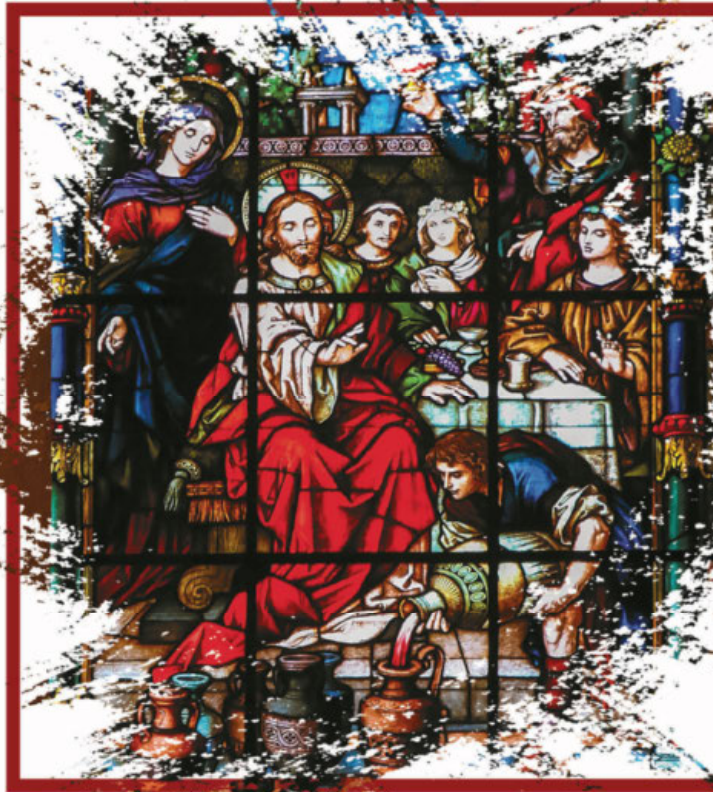

As they ran off toward the truck, one could hear the girl reply, "Yeah, I can't wait!" The experience of a child's delight in something so simple as ice cream, lifts our spirits from our burdens and transports us to the lighter, more innocent side of life.

Life is not meant to be a burden. Believe it or not, God actually wants us to be happy! In fact, the wedding feast at Cana shows us that God even puts His blessing on our happiness. 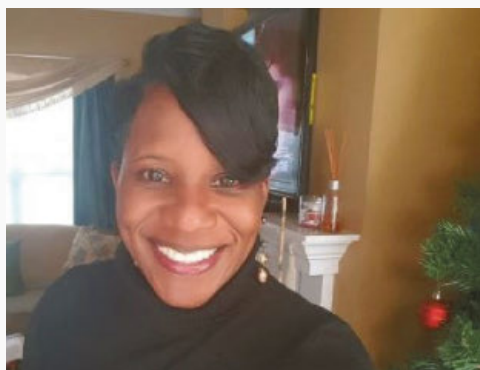
SCCCW MYRTLE BEACH DEANERY RETREAT

MEDITACIÓN DEL EVANGELIO San Juan 2, 1-11

Con la fiesta de la Epifanía y el Bautismo del Señor se cierra el Tiempo de Navidad, que siempre es precedido por el Adviento. Ahora, comenzamos el Tiempo Ordinario. Serán siete domingos de este corto periodo,



que termina el día anterior al Miércoles de Ceniza. La segunda etapa de este Tiempo es más larga, da comienzo después del domingo de Pentecostés y termina hasta el sábado antes del primer domingo de Adviento. ¿Para qué sirve a los cristianos este Tiempo Ordinario? ¿Qué nos pide la Liturgia de este tiempo? Pues, es muy sencillo, nos pide meditar en el misterio de Cristo. En su invitación de participar en su Reino con alegría y compromiso verdadero. La Iglesia tiene diversidad de carismas, donde podemos entregarnos al servicio de los demás. Por ejemplo, hoy el Evangelio nos invita a participar junto con María y Jesús en las bodas de Caná. Y es ahí en esa boda, donde Jesús hace su primer milagro a petición de su Madre María. El diálogo de ambos viene a ser a causa de la falta de vino. Por lo tanto, los novios estaban en apuros por esta razón. Este relato es muy profundo, el hecho de que Jesús participa en la boda, tiene como significado la boda de Dios con la humanidad, que más adelante será la Sangre de Jesús derramada para la salvación de la humanidad. “Alegrémonos, regocijémonos démosle honor y gloria, porque han llegado las bodas del Cordero” (Apocalipsis 19,7). También, el profeta en la primera lectura lo pone claro: “No te llamen más ‘Abandonada’, ni a tu tierra ‘Desolada’, sino que te llamen ‘Mi Preferida’ y a tu tierra ‘Desposada’. Porque Yavé se complacerá en ti y tu tierra tendrá un esposo” (Isaías 62,4). ©LPi

"Si cada flor quisiera ser una rosa", escribió Santa Teresa de Lisieux, "la primavera perdería su belleza". ¿Quién te pide Dios que seas hoy? Hay una respuesta obvia que me viene a la mente desde el principio. Dios quiere que yo sea una buena persona (un buen padre, un buen esposo) hoy; hoy Dios quiere que yo sea un santo.

Hoy, ¿estamos llamados a ser servidores? ¿Esperamos la instrucción de Dios y la ponemos en práctica, sin importar cuán tonto o imposible pueda parecer a nuestros oídos humanos? ¿Se nos pide que seamos discípulos, que demos testimonio de un milagro y que demos nuestro testimonio? ¿Estamos llamados a imitar a la misma Santísima Virgen y animarnos a seguir la palabra de Dios? Examinemos nuestros dones y escuchemos en el silencio de nuestro corazón la dirección del Espíritu. Entonces, y solo entonces, hagamos lo que Él nos diga.
