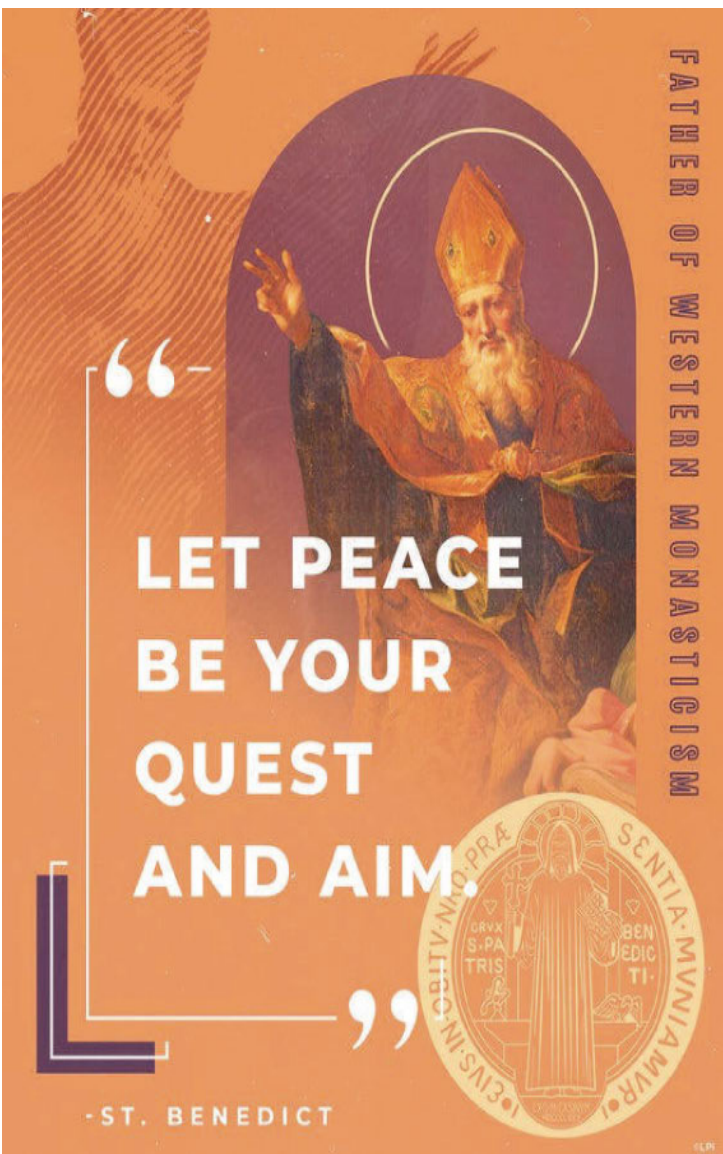

World Day of Prayer for the Care of Creation

"LAUDATO SI', mi' Signore" - "Praise be to you, my Lord". In the words of this beautiful canticle, Saint Francis of Assisi reminds us that our common home is like a sister with whom we share our life and a beautiful mother who opens her arms to embrace us.

So opens Pope Francis' letter to the whole world on the importance of protecting and healing our natural world. As we approach this day, let us each commit to doing one thing to celebrate creation.

Let us pray...

Good and gracious God
of all created things, seen and unseen.

You created all things in this world for our use,
and charge us with protecting that creation.
Help us to see in all things
the reflection of a parent's love for a child.

When we see your goodness in the face of the moon,
we see our sister.

When we feel the warmth of the sun on our face,
we feel the love of a brother.

We ask for your strength
to give us wisdom and courage
to protect our earthly environment
from destruction and overuse.

Help us to share
the goodness and generosity of the earth
with every living person.

We ask all this in the name of Jesus Christ,
our brother and savior.

Amen.



Dear Parishioners,

In the Eastertide, the phrase 'Peace be with you' echoes repeatedly, a comforting salutation from Jesus to His apostles, expressed in the Hebrew 'Shalom aleichem.' This word 'peace' holds profound significance throughout the Bible: 'Peace, I leave with you; my peace I give to you,' Jesus declares (Jn. 14:27). His intent is clear: this peace transcends worldly understanding. Again, He reassures His disciples, 'I have said this to you so that you may have peace' (Jn. 16:33). In today's Gospel, His greeting resounds once more, 'Peace be with you' (Lk 24:36).

The Christian vocabulary reverberates with this message of peace, especially during the Eucharistic celebration:

- In the Gloria: 'Glory to God in the highest, and peace to his people on earth.'
- In the prayers after Our Father: 'Deliver us, Lord, from every evil, and grant us peace in our day,' followed by the prayer for peace: 'Grant us the peace and unity of your kingdom ...; The peace of the Lord be with you always.'
- The 'Lamb of God' invocation concludes with a plea: 'Lamb of God, you take away the sins of the world, grant us peace.'
- Finally, as the congregation disperses, the priest/deacon offers the parting blessing, 'Go in peace.'

Our constant prayer for the dead is simply: May they rest in peace; and the tombstones of the earliest Christians were often inscribed with the words 'In peace'.

In this third week of Easter, we reflect on the multi-faceted significance of Jesus' greeting, 'Peace be with you':

- *Invitation to Calmness*: Amidst chaos and fear, Jesus assures us of God's sovereign control, inviting us to find peace amidst uncertainty.
- *Blessing of Wellbeing*: This peace signifies not mere tranquility but wholeness and wellbeing, rooted in Jesus' victory over death and the abundant life He promises.
- *Challenge to Live Peace*: Empowered by the peace of Christ, we are called to be witnesses, spreading His peace even to those we find difficult to love.

May this Easter season be a time of trusting in God's control, experiencing His promised life, and actively spreading peace in our world. Peace be with you.

Son tres pasos que también nosotros podemos dar en nuestras casas: primero, abrir el corazón a Jesús, confiándole las cargas, las dificultades, las desilusiones de la vida, confiándole los sí; y luego segundo paso, escuchar a Jesús, tomar el Evangelio en la mano, leyendo hoy mismo este pasaje, en el capítulo veinticuatro del Evangelio de Lucas; tercero rezar a Jesús, con las mismas palabras de aquellos discípulos: Señor, quédate con nosotros (Lucas 24:29). 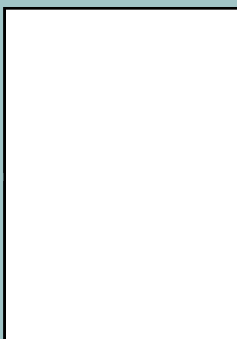
