Last week was very challenging for us, the staff of St. Anthony Church and School, as we witnessed the sudden passing of Jean Griebel, leaving us in shock. It has also been noticed that many have died during this time. Perhaps the heat of the sun plays a role in these events. Situations like this often leave us feeling at a loss, unsure of what to say or do, making visiting the sick and dying a challenge.

Today's gospel is a story of Jesus giving and restoring life by doing exactly what he was not supposed to do: touching and letting himself be touched by those whom the Law had declared unclean and untouchable, the woman in the gospel story suffering from hemorrhage. Two kinds of touching are happening in the story: the touch of the crowd, which produces nothing, and the woman's touch, which produces miracles. The difference lies in the degree of expectant faith with which the touching is made.

If Jesus were passing by today and you had a chance to touch his clothes, would you touch him with curiosity or with faith that you were going to be transformed and made whole? Well, Jesus is here today, and you have a chance to touch not just his clothes but his very body in the Eucharist. Let us put all our heart and soul into it as we say the prayer before receiving Jesus in the Eucharist, "Lord, I am not worthy to receive you, but only say the word and I shall be healed."

I recently read an article in the New York Times, published on December 30, 2003, that offers valuable suggestions for visiting those who are homebound, near death, or in the hospital. The end of life has become an alien experience for many, as most people spend their final days in institutional settings. This can make conversing with those nearing the end of life foreign and challenging. However, there is no better time to learn than now.

Here are some tips for visiting the sick and dying:

- Engage in Conversations: "Talking and listening to a dying person can help relieve the patient's and the visitor's distress, fears, and guilt." Engage in conversations, as not talking about fears can make them bigger. Patients with no one to talk to have a higher incidence of anxiety and depression.
- **Be Present and Attentive:** "Take off the coat, try to relax, sit down at eye level with the patient, if possible, and as close as you would to a healthy friend." Remove obstacles that create distance or block eye contact. Touching and kissing, if appropriate before the illness, are fine now too.
- Let the Patient Lead: "Let the patient take the lead in talking about difficult topics and deep concerns, and encourage continued conversation by saying something like, 'Yes, I understand,' or, 'Tell me more,' or reflecting back to the patient what you heard." Avoid contradicting the patient or changing the subject when they talk about their condition or fears.
- Express Emotions: It is okay to cry and also to laugh if there are things you both find amusing. Humor can lighten the patient's emotional and physical burden.
- Handle Anger with Understanding: "When somebody in your family or circle is facing a serious illness and death, the anger that she feels might really be directed at the illness; it comes out directed at you because you are the only person around." Respond to anger with understanding and by asking questions that allow the patient to express their feelings.
- **Provide Reassurance:** "Try to counter despair by reassuring the patients that everything possible will be done to assure their comfort, including relief of pain, and that no matter how bad things get, you will always be there." Avoid making promises that cannot be kept and focus on reassuring the patient that their comfort and well-being are a priority.

In conclusion, as Jesus cared for the woman, so can a touch or word bring new life and healing to others. Be an agent of transformation in your words and works.



Una manera es acompañarlas y escucharlas, estar con ellas mostrándoles interés y ayudarlas en sus necesidades. Otra forma es tomando el ejemplo de la mujer que buscó y se acercó a Jesús para ser curada. Busquemos a Jesús con la misma fe que ella lo hizo.
