

Dear Friends.

Thank you for your generous support in response to my appeal towards the desperate need of the community center in my hometown parish, Our Lady of Mount Carmel. This Sunday, we have CCD registration after every Mass. I appreciate and thank the members of the Legion of Mary for their initiative, time, and talent to promote the registration for the CCD program. Please make use of this time to register your children for CCD or reach out to the parish office to get this done at your earliest convenience.

Today's reading invites us to "be renewed in the spirit of your minds, and put on the new self, created in God's way in righteousness and holiness of truth" (Ephesians 4:23-24). These thoughts set the tone to enter into the feast of the Transfiguration of Our Lord on 6^{th} of August.

The Transfiguration teaches us about the transformative power of encountering Christ. Just as the apostles were changed by witnessing Jesus in His glory, we too are called to be transformed by His presence in our lives. This feast encourages us to seek a deeper relationship with Jesus, to listen to His voice, and to allow His light to illuminate our hearts and minds. Let us pray that we may be open to the transformative power of Christ in our lives, that we may be renewed in our faith, and that we may reflect His glory in our daily actions.

This Sunday gospel focuses on Jesus our bread of life who quenches our thirst and satisfies our hunger. Two kinds of people are hungry. The obvious ones are those who have gone without eating for some time or it may be a prolonged period of starvation. The second group is those who eat even when they have no physical need: compulsive eaters, food addicts, gluttons. It does not matter to them what they eat, or they prefer non-nourishing foods to healthful ones.

In our spiritual life, what are we hungry for?

Are we seeking junk spiritual food for our satisfaction or the food that nourishes us for eternal life. We need to accept God's gifts of spiritual life and strength by properly receiving the Holy Eucharist. The Sacrament gives us:

Courage to carry out God's work in the world.

Help to live the life God wants for us.

Inspiration to know the will of God in our lives.

A deeper understanding of the holy mystery of Christ's presence.

Encouragement to love others and strengthen the faith community.

Grace to overcome temptation and avoid sin.

Joy and peace of heart, knowing that Christ lives in us and will bring us to God's Heavenly Kingdom.

Let us remember that the "Bread of Life" is Jesus Christ himself, not merely human bread. It is food for our souls, giving us a share in God's life and assurance of eternal life with Him.

"YO SOY EL PAN DE VIDA"



"A tu pueblo, sin embargo, le distribuías el alimento de los ángeles; le enviabas desde el cielo incansablemente un pan ya listo, que tenía en sí todos los sabores y se adaptaba al gusto de cada cual" (Sabiduría 16:20). Algo mucho mejor que ahora, ir a la mejor panadería y escoger los diferentes panes que nos gusten y saborearlos. Tal parece que los israelitas entonces, y nosotros ahora, seguimos muchas veces sin distinguir lo que es el pan del cielo. Lo que debemos de saber es buscar el pan que dura eternamente. CONFESION

Pregunta:

Si Dios sabe todo lo que hacemos, ¿por qué necesitamos confesarnos?

Respuesta:

Otro término para el Sacramento de la Confesión es el Sacramento de la Reconciliación. Acudimos a este sacramento no solo para confesar nuestros pecados, sino para reconciliarnos con Dios. Por supuesto, esto plantea la pregunta: "Si puedo orar a Dios por mi cuenta, ¿por qué no puedo reconciliarme con Dios por mi cuenta?" En los siete sacramentos, reconocemos la importancia de la comunidad. Sacramentos como el bautismo o el matrimonio ocurren en el contexto de la iglesia en general para recordarnos el impacto comunitario de nuestras vidas. ¡No estamos solos en nuestro camino de fe!

No necesitamos confesar nuestros pecados frente a toda la comunidad, ¡gracias a Dios! Pero acudir al Sacramento de la Reconciliación es un recordatorio tangible de que nuestros pecados no solo nos afectan a nosotros y a nuestra relación con Dios, sino también a los demás. Jesús dio a sus apóstoles autoridad para perdonar pecados en su nombre. A través de este sacramento, somos verdaderamente perdonados por Dios mismo. Recibimos una efusión de gracia y fuerza para no pecar más y nuestra relación con Cristo y su Cuerpo, la Iglesia, se restaura.
