

Dear Parishioners,

It brings me great joy to share that the recent addition of the Holy Spirit's image in our Sanctuary has been warmly received. Many of you have expressed how fitting and meaningful it is to have this beautiful depiction in our sacred space. I am grateful for your positive feedback and the way this artwork has enhanced our worship environment.

As we journey through this week, we also look forward to celebrating the following important feast days:

- Feast of St. Monica August 27
- Feast of St. Augustine August 28
- The Passion of St. John the Baptist August 29

These saints serve as powerful examples of faith and perseverance, guiding us in our spiritual lives.

Over the past five weeks, we have deeply reflected on the Eucharist through the lens of the Gospel of St. John, Chapter 6. Today's gospel presents us with a pivotal moment:

"When many of his disciples heard it, they said, 'This teaching is difficult; who can accept it?' ... Because of this, many of his disciples turned back and no longer went about with him" (John 6:60, 66).

This passage challenges us to consider the difference between Peter and the Twelve who stayed with Jesus and those who turned away. It wasn't that Peter and the others understood the teaching any more clearly than those who left. They too struggled with the idea of eating flesh and drinking blood. However, Peter recognized that even when a teaching is difficult, it is not a reason to abandon Jesus. Unlike the others, Peter did not see Jesus as just one of many teachers; he saw Him as the way, the unique messenger of God.

In our world today, many Christians face similar challenges. When confronted with teachings that are difficult to understand or accept, there can be a temptation to walk away, much like the disciples who left. But as we learn from today's gospel, faith often seeks understanding, yet it does not always find the answers it desires. We are invited to put faith before and above understanding, as Peter and the Twelve did, rather than seeking understanding before faith, like those who turned away.

Let us take this message to heart as we continue to deepen our relationship with Christ, trusting in His teachings and remaining faithful, even when we do not fully understand. May God bless you and your families this week.

MEDITACION DEL EVANGELIO



Algunos de los seguidores de Jesús no pudieron creer lo que les dijo. Era demasiado para ellos: "Mi carne es verdadera comida y mi sangre es verdadera bebida" (Juan 6:55). A pesar de que Jesús lo explicaba de

muchas maneras, algunos decidieron abandonarlo. Él no hizo nada por detenerlos, los dejó libres respetando su decisión. Después de esos acontecimientos de abandono, Jesús pregunta directamente a los doce: "¿Quieren marcharse también ustedes? Pedro le contestó: Señor, ¿a quién iríamos? Tú tienes palabras de vida eterna. Nosotros creemos y sabemos que tú eres el Santo de Dios" (Juan 6:67 -69). Ahora, en la realidad que vivimos tan llena de ruido y modernidad, ¿sabemos a dónde vamos, a quién dirigirnos? Pedro, lo supo y el deseo de la Iglesia es que sepamos que solo Jesús tiene palabras de vida eterna. Y que su Pan de Vida se nos da gratuitamente en la Eucaristía. "La Eucaristía y la cruz son piedras de tropiezo. Es el mismo misterio, y no cesa de ser ocasión de división. ¿Quieren marcharse también ustedes? (Juan 6:67): esta pregunta del Señor resuena a través de las edades, como invitación de su amor a descubrir que sólo Él tiene palabras de vida eterna (Juan 6:68), y que acoger en la fe el don de su Eucaristía es acogerlo a Él mismo". (Catecismo de la Iglesia Católica, numeral 1335). Hagamos la prueba y veremos qué bueno es el Señor, como nos dice el Salmo de la liturgia de este domingo.


